That's a question many of our friends in this community have been asking us lately. The answer is simple. It's principally because we are testing more highpowered engines than ever before in our history.

hat's all the noise about?

But first, let us explain that all the noise you hear in this area does not always come from Pratt & Whitney Aircraft. If you were to measure it scientifically, you would be surprised at the amount of noise in any "quiet" residential area. And in an industrial area or on a busy street the noise level is often well above that of our plant. Nevertheless, at certain times, and especially under certain weather conditions, you may be keenly conscious of the noise coming from our engines being tested.

Because this problem concerns both you and us, it might be helpful to look behind the scenes at what we have done and are doing to minimize the torrent of sound developed by both piston and turbine engines in the test cells. It is not a new problem - we've been working at it continuously for nearly a quarter of a century.

Perhaps the magnitude of the problem can be shown by citing a few figures. Twenty-five years ago our first piston engine developed about 400 horsepower and there was never more than one on a test stand at any given time. Today our piston engines develop 3,500 horsepower or more, and the big, new turbojet types are far more powerful. And, we no longer have just one engine on test. There are 79 test cells, and one-third of them may be in operation at any given time. Here is another way of saying it: Twenty-five years ago, 400 horsepower created the noise; in 1950 as much as 75,000 horsepower may be pouring

out sound at any given time. Paradoxically, we always have been in the curious position of creating an ever-increasing volume of sound and, simultaneously, of trying to suppress it.

What has been done about it? During the past nineteen years, we have spent more than a million dollars on noise abatement alone - much of it in the last two years. Soundproofing installations have been made in every one of our production and experimental test cells. In addition, noise-elimination material has been installed in the wind tunnel air exchangers, vacuum-pump dischargers in the gas dynamics laboratory, installation engineering and compressor laboratories, and the jet burner

Rock wool, glass wool, copper wool, perforated metal, water sprays, resonating chambers, expansion rooms, baffles, ribbon walls and baked clay are among the things we are using to combat the noise we create. To date, we have installed nearly one million square feet of soundproofing material weighing nearly 2,000

What is being done about it?

As new test facilities are put into operation, as new and more powerful engines go on the test stands, more and more man-hours are devoted to the study of sound control. Early this summer the new Willgoos Turbine Laboratory, located on the east bank of the Connecticut River, will begin operations. 


