We would not come right out and say letting the probable courts decide if everybody over 70 ought to be granted, or if he/she that cry too much should be left on Cry Tom Hill to die. We think this is a personal privilege matter, and that who should be killed, and when, is a responsibility that ought to be kept inviolate in the family, or with the family physician.

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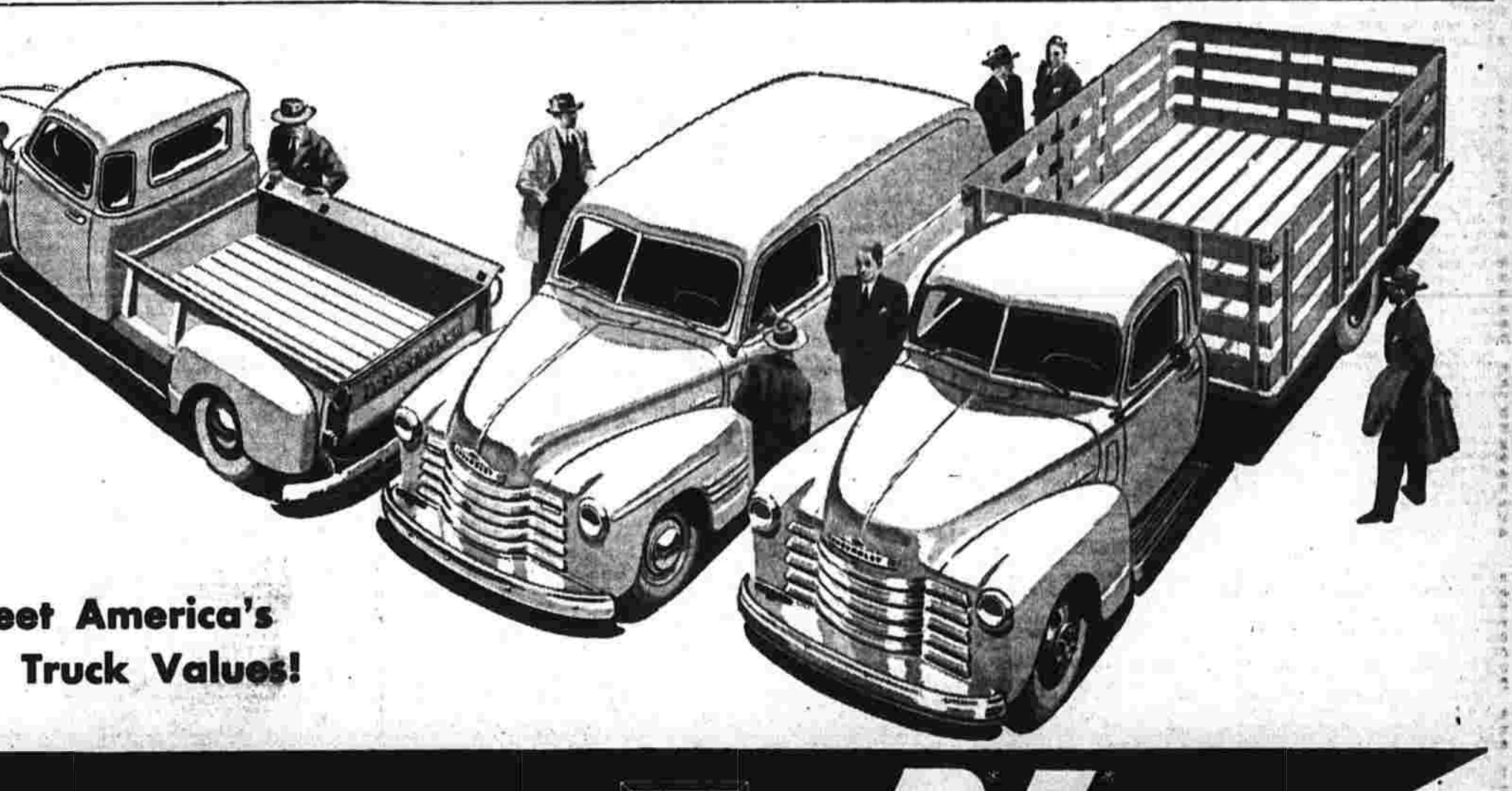
