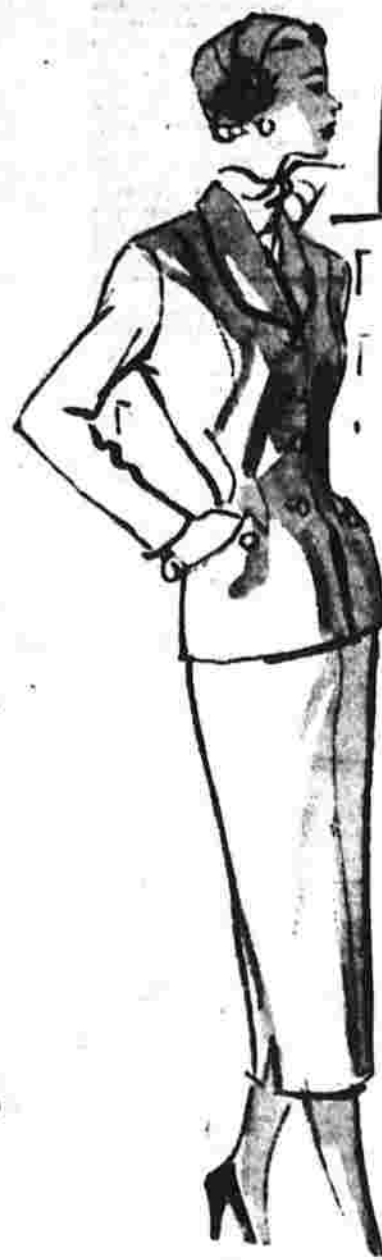

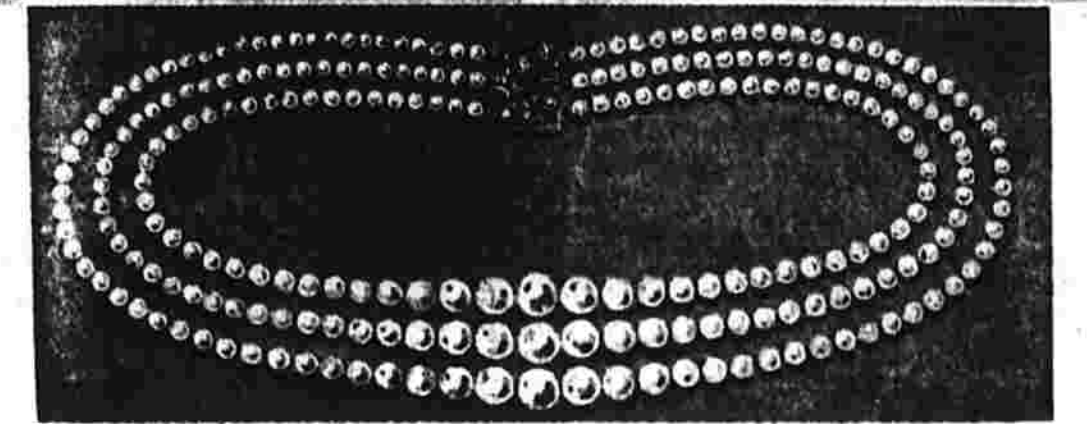

became alarmed at . . . the high tax rate involved in the school building program.

"We're not any super-duper citizens. We're just ordinary people like you sitting here. We just had an idea that something would be done about the school problem."

Two Main Problems
 The committee recognized two main problems at the outset. It said. One of these was the need for the school building program. The other was the need to provide for the necessary funds to build the schools. "We decided to ask ourselves what other people are doing," Mr. Little said.

"When we produced a survey of all the new schools built in the state in the past two years and a comparison of the features and costs of these new plants."

"Another member went to the State Board of Education and asked where there is a school that meets all your requirements. They gave us a list of schools."

Visited Granby Plant
 The committee then visited the Granby plant and found that the same architect designed both buildings. That was something the Little group was interested in. "We went to the school for Granby and saw it," said Keith Sellers, one of the Little group members.

"When the members of the committee inquired of Granby school officials as to how they got so much for their money, Little continued, they were told, 'We know what we want. It's a two-story school in a modern school. Then you got the architect that we had \$200,000 to spend and said, 'Now you go out and build us a school.'"

Additional Facts On Granby School
 To clarify and give additional facts on the Granby school, the Granby committee has recommended as follows:
 1. That the school be built on the building plan, Chairman Wilbur T. Little stated that "in Manchester we didn't build it that way. No money was placed on the architect, he said, and consequently the cost soared."

"There isn't a question you can ask me about schools that I can't answer with a concrete example," Little asserted. "Take the Granby school for example. It was built by the State Board. Yes, it is a fine school. Yes, it has an auditorium? Yes. One that seats 700 people. Does it have every thing? Yes."

In answering other questions that he thought might be in the minds of his listeners, Little said he has investigated and found that costs have had to be cut down. "The school was built by the State Board of Education and the cost was \$200,000. The architect is Keith Heine of Hartford and his fee is \$20,000. The school was built for occupancy late in 1949."

In discussing the Hollister street plant, Little said, "I'm looking over the Hollister street plant. I think it is one of the most ridiculous recommendations I've ever made." He has been at the \$1,000 seat auditorium without any parking space. He added that the State Board of Education approved the Hollister plant with the expectation that the school would be built by the town. "The town would be 'still inadequate,' Little said.

"What makes this all the more ridiculous is that within a short distance the town of Hollister is 'out of land.'"

 Little stated that the plan drawn by his group also "proposes to put necessary additions on the South school and keep that school

Last year was a big year for taxpayers. The government paid out \$449,000 to 84 informers, in rewards ranging from \$20.00 to \$47,000. For all that led to the recovery of \$6,187,914 in taxes that otherwise would have escaped detection.

That completely overbalanced the previous record tallied in 1958, when informers recovered a total of \$59,970 and led to recoveries totaling \$2,351,000.

The main reason for tax informers' patriotic desire to help the government was the fact that employees with their houses, families and junkies, and \$20,000 a year — equate in peace as well as in war.

The biggest reward to date, \$50,000 that was split among three people, came in a case where an informer reported a large sum of cash in the depressed mid-1930s.

Bureau records show, incidentally, that hard times bring in more extra cash than any other time. It is a fact that has been noted by the Bureau.

 Taipei, Formosa, March 15—(AP)—Nationalist Chinese warplanes today pounded Lungwa airfield at Shanghai as the new government cabinet was inaugurated.

Five waves of planes dropped bombs on the airfield, now controlled by Kuo-Communist forces. The first wave dumped 10 bombs on the control tower. Air Force headquarters said.

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Caesarian Birth Becomes Safer
 Pittsburgh, March 15—(AP)—A panel of top-flight baby doctors reports that Caesarian section—surgical delivery of a baby—has become safer for a mother than for her child.

At a meeting of some 700 physicians, members of the American College of Surgeons, Dr. Franklin L. Payne, professor of obstetrics and gynecology at the University of Pennsylvania, declared Caesarian deliveries are now ten times safer for mothers than they were 30 years ago.

Since 1920, Dr. Payne reported, the death rate for mothers followed from one in ten to one in 100. The decline in infant mortalities following such operations, he said, has not been as great. The infant death rate, he said, is now about six in 100.

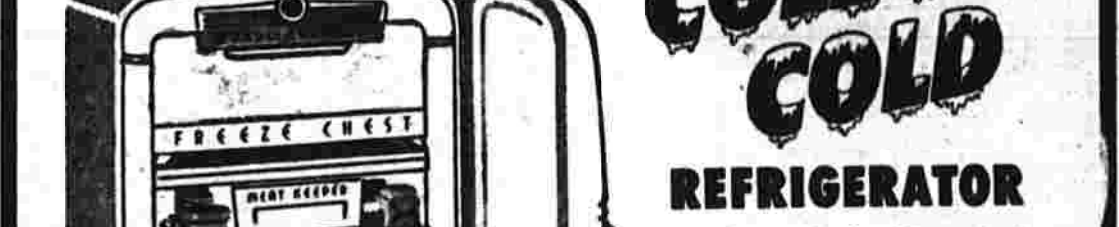

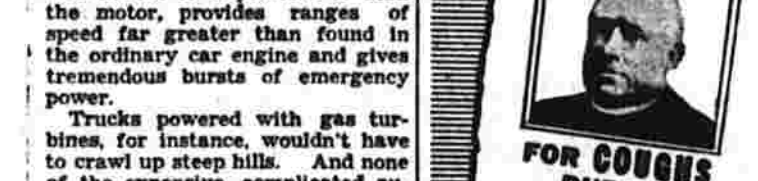

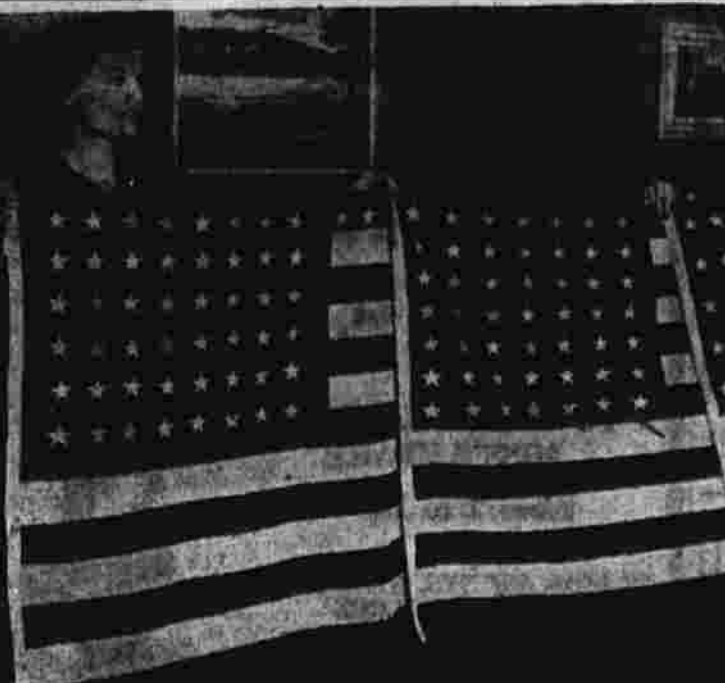

Uses Kitchen As Laboratory

New York Chef Looks Upon Recipe as Challenge to His Ability

New York—(N.E.A.)—To Louis von Chub, a kitchen is a laboratory, a recipe is a challenge and a good meal is the ultimate pleasure to which man can be exposed.

But as soon as he starts talking about his own ideas of what constitutes a proper gastronomic recipe, he's a changed man. To von Chub (pronounced von chee) a decent little meal would be something like this:

He'd start off with koscovszky, a Hungarian appetizer made of jelly, pork, the pig's ear, tail, feet, skin and cheeks are jellied for koscovszky. Next, a nice big bowl of vichyssoise, a French potato soup, served cold.

For a fish course, von Chub prefers pomfidor, from the Arabian Sea. "It melts in your mouth," he says, "and it has no fishy smell." Properly prepared pomfidor must be deep fried in coconut oil.

The main course would be von Chub's own recipe for chicken curry, based on Indian recipes but tempered with his own global cookery. Rice is the base. Then comes something called dalli, which is made of lentils, butter, flour, salt and paprika. Other ingredients are mushrooms, that is, fried bananas and shredded coconut. And curry, of course.

"The way I make it," he said, "there's not one single American man who wouldn't love it." Served with the chicken curry, in von Chub's ideal meal, would be Indian orange fritters, shaped like loaves like roses and filled with vanilla custard.

Desert, equally exotic, would be Indian-style halvah wrapped in gold leaf. Halvah is a confection made of crushed almonds, butter and coconut. The gold leaf should be

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German Labor Low in Morale

Average Worker Bitter As He Watches Slow Dismantling Program

By Douglas Larson NEA Staff Correspondent Washington (NEA)—If the dismantling of German war plants had been done quickly, right after the war, the morale of the German workers would be much better today.

That's the report of German labor leaders who have been brought to the U. S. for a look at the operation of unions in the American democracy.

As it is now, with unemployment one of Germany's most serious problems, the average worker can't help but feel bitter and hopeless as he watches the slow Allied dismantling program.

Otto Spiering, a labor press editor who spent most of his time during the Nazi regime in prison because of his activities, explains this explanation:

"If dismantling had been done immediately in 1945 the German worker would have accepted it as a fact and would have forgotten about it. Now we are told that the occupation authorities plan to help unemployment at the same time they are creating it.

Some of us can understand it. The average German worker lives only from day to day, not thinking about the future. He is thankful for what little work and improved living conditions he can find. The few who do face the future believe that the best they can ever get for their country is a semi-independent status as a state in a United States of Europe.

Even in normal times the Allied section couldn't have supported such an idea. One million inhabitants there have various kinds of jobs. But more than one quarter of a million can find no work. For some reason, since the end of the war, the unemployment problem has grown worse in Berlin.

Outside of the German capital there are 16,000,000 persons working with 1,200,000 jobs. There is a great deal of doubt among the Germans as to whether the present government that has been set up by the occupation will give them democracy as it is known in the U. S.

None of the dictators seemed very enthusiastic about the chance of it succeeding. In fact, they had little enthusiasm about much of anything for the future.

The proposed bridge over the historic Straits of Mackinac would be an engineer's delight, since it calls for the longest single suspension span in the world, 4600 feet. It would exceed the Golden Gate span, now the biggest, by 100 feet.

Michigan residents have long been nettled by the four-mile-wide straits that bisect their state. At early as 1820 attention for a bridge began, but in 1923 a ferry system was inaugurated.
