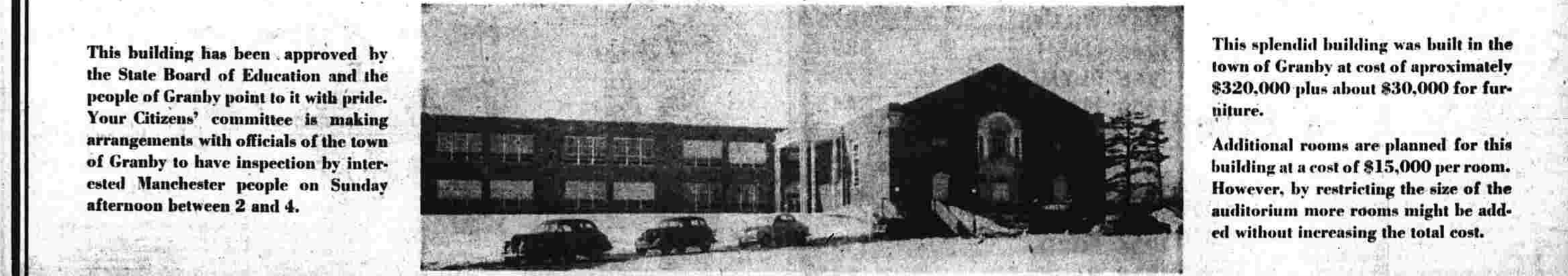

New Leaders Control GOP in Some Towns

Local Machines Left in Power by Majority of Caucuses and Primaries Throughout State

By The Associated Press

New leaders took over control of Republican party organizations in a few Connecticut towns today. But for the most part caucuses and primaries throughout the state last night left local machines in power.

In New Britain, George A. Quigley, former eight-term mayor, won the Republican majority nomination, defeating Robert H. Hanson by 220 votes, 4969 to 4768. His Democratic opponent will be named today in a four-way primary contest between former State Senator John L. Sullivan, Prosecutor Matthew A. Avitable, James N. Bordiere and Joseph Gorman. Mayor Henry J. Gorman, who defeated Quigley by 40 votes in the 1948 election, declined to seek re-nomination.

Zeller Opposes Constitution

Few of the caucuses brought developments of major political significance. An exception was that in Stonington where former State Comptroller Fred R. Zeller came out in opposition to the revised constitution proposed in the state reorganization program now before the Legislature.

Zeller charged that Democratic Gov. Chester Bowles "wants to stray" Connecticut's 132-year-old constitution to establish "one-man rule."

The former comptroller hinted that Republicans aren't likely to approve much at the Legislature's current session.

"We must deliberate long and well before we make any drastic changes in our government," he said. "There is no hurry, so we will not rush."

Zeller, long an influential figure in G. O. P. state circles, resigned as Stonington town politician. Friends said he planned to devote more time to the state political scene. Howard Pack was named to succeed Zeller as chairman. A post the former comptroller had held for the past 10 years.

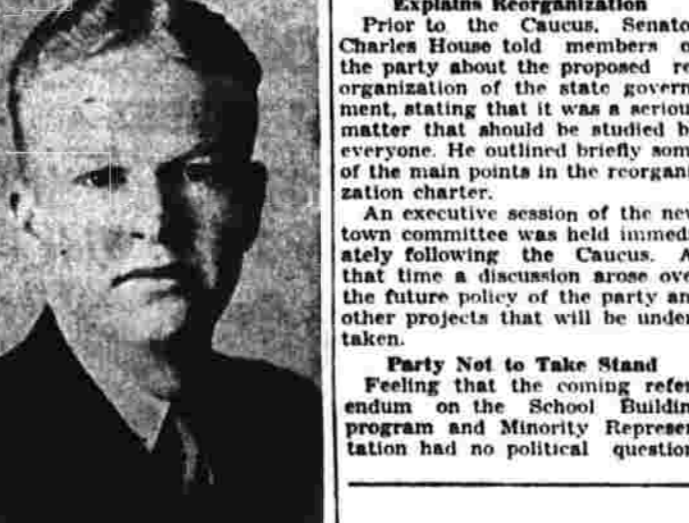
