Silverstein Declares "Lies Are Circulated"

Tells Rotarians Being Misstatements Are Made in Controversy About Schools

In a two hour session before the Rotary club last night, Saul M. Silverstein, chairman of the School Building committee, presented his picture of the school building controversy and at the same time declared that "lies are being circulated" concerning the program.

Just a week ago last night, William J. Little, chairman of the Citizens committee, presented his picture of the program, spoke to Rotarians and marked what proved to be the start of a red-hot controversy which will be climaxed Saturday's referendum.

Gives Comparisons
In discussing the Notre Dame school in West Haven, which has been presented by Little as being more economical and yet superior to the proposed Broad street plan, Silverstein said:

Heaven school cost \$1,066 per pupil as compared to \$800 per pupil for Broad street and \$500 per pupil for the Verplanck school.

In spite of the fact that it is more expensive per pupil, the Notre Dame school is not the most economical, but the most economical, both of them are included in the Broad street plan.

Reading from a sheet of specifications of the Notre Dame building, Silverstein said that it would accommodate 480 students and cost \$502,000. It has 21 rooms in all, he said, with 14 classrooms, two laboratories, a large suite of separate offices and a library. There is a hand room, a shower and locker room, and a cafeteria seating 300, Silverstein said.

But one mill involved
Silverstein, a vigorous speaker, strongly denied that more than one mill is involved in the referendum. Starting with a total of eight mills quoted by General Manager George H. Wadsworth as the probable tax cost of the Notre Dame program and he said that the speaker stated that four mills will be required for operation and maintenance.

Whether more schools are built or not
Silverstein said that whether more schools are built or not is a question of double severity. That leaves four mills for construction, he said. One mill has already been voted in the Verplanck and Bowers schools, two mills are involved in the projected new High school, he said, leaving but one mill the margin for the construction of the Broad street plant, and the provision of Hollister street school into a junior high school, and preliminary planning for a high school and renovation of existing schools.

One mill means a \$5 tax for those individuals owning property assessed at \$5,000, the speaker pointed out.

Called An "Absolute Lie"
Silverstein also branded an "absolute lie" the statement of the Department of Education regarding the Hollister street school. It is the town's buying land west to Main street, he said, is not able to purchase that property. It is not a part of this proposal.

Must Have Safety Factors
At a meeting with state education authorities prior to their approval of the Hollister plans for conversion to a junior high school, he stated the state authorities were told that the school officials did not want approval with the stipulation that more land be obtained and that the town could not buy more land now probably would not in the future.

In denying opposition charges that plans are being made to abandon the South school, Silverstein asserted that the necessity of expansion, not abandonment, of the plan has already been decided by the School Building committee and the Board of Education.

Silverstein struck at the opposition's comparison of a \$910,000, 21-room Broad street school with a \$300,000, 10-room Granby school. The contract price for the Broad street school is estimated at \$700,000 and the \$910,000 figure includes furnishings, heating, and a contingency fund of 10 per cent, he continued, and a cost per pupil rating shows \$800 for Broad street against \$1,000 for Granby.

Must Have Safety Factors
The speaker also pointed out that all such figures for proposed schools are purposeful estimates high so that the appropriation will surely be sufficient. "When we ask you for \$910,000 we have to have a factor of safety and a very comfortable one," he said.

Admits a Tax Problem
Silverstein admitted there was a tax problem here. "As a manufacturer I subscribe to the basic tax, but manufacturers are not entitled to any share in the tax set-up. It didn't create this situation, the taxpayers didn't create it, the manufacturers didn't create it and it's not their fault," he said.

The speaker warned against the attitude of some parents that they get one school for one child in this section of town so the child with any more new schools will be crowded out. "We'll vote against them," he said.

He is talking such a selfish attitude, Silverstein said, forget that their children will be growing up and entering high school and that there will never be a new

New Haven, March 22.—The Connecticut Child Welfare Association today urged public support of the organization's proposal to turn over to the State Welfare Department all work for neglected and abandoned children who are committed as public charges.

This recommendation, if enacted, would go far to simplify Connecticut's cumbersome and confused method of public child care, according to Mrs. Edith Valet Cook, executive director of the association.

"Under the existing system," Mrs. Cook explained, "when a family of brothers and sisters is brought into the juvenile court on petition of a town official, for commitment as neglected or uncared-for, if a commitment is allowed, the children are divided according to age, with the State assuming the guardianship of those who are less than six years old and the county of those who are over that age. State charges are placed in foster homes by the Department of Public Welfare. County charges are committed to the County Temporary Homes for Children through the town official.

State, county and town all share in the cost of care of these children with the State paying 70 per cent of the expense.

For this reason, when a six-year-old group and children, usually petition the juvenile court for the child's transfer to county custody. This entails the reopening of his case, with duplication of the procedure under which he was committed in the first instance.

"The public child care situation is further complicated by a law which instructs the State Welfare Department to place out and supervise County Home children in foster families but does not give the State authority over the guardianship of the person of the county charge."

"The Child Welfare Association on many occasions has pointed to the disadvantages of this chaotic system under which three governmental units are involved in plan-

ning for each set of neglected or uncared-for children. Certainly this is one area where the citizens are not getting full value for their more than two million dollar annual expenditure."

New Maternity Care In Hospitals Copied From Grandma's Day

San Francisco (NEA)—Maternity care is taking a step back to grandmother's day, when babies were born at home and shared life with mother almost from birth.

The difference is that the hospital is replacing the home with a "rooming-in" unit, in which mother and child share the same quarters throughout the confinement period after the first 24 hours.

This return to old-fashioned theory actually represents one of the newest practices in obstetrical care and is beginning to gain acceptance across the nation.

It is typical at Fresno Hospital in San Francisco, where the first "rooming-in" unit in the U.S. just opened, meeting the interest of many West Coast babies.

Far more scientific than home methods, the new unit is a streamlined, decorated in pink and blue and partitions in white and cubicles. A nurse at her desk in the center of the ward is able to observe each mother and child at all times.

In keeping with the "natural approach," babies are fed on demand rather than according to an arbitrary schedule, many doctors now concede there is a strong relationship between the mother's feelings and an infant's emotional development.

Most of the time, junior is right next to his mother's bed in a transparent high table. The table banks slides on runners to facilitate diaper changing and bathing, operations which are performed by the mother rather than in a "nursery" type nursery.

There is also a sound-proof "banishment chamber" in which the baby can rest in complete quiet, but without disturbing anybody.

"Rooming in" is a break for fathers, too. No longer need he wait in the corridor for a momentary peek at the child through the glass pane of a nursery window.

In the new-style units, he washes his hands, dons a sterile gown, and takes his place at the head of the family during visiting hours in the temporary glass house.

New Method Does Not Require Suicide Mission to Drop Bomb

Washington—(NEA)—A method of dropping a hydrogen bomb which does not require a suicide mission has been worked out. And huge jet bombers which can carry the new weapon are being developed.

This information is part of a hitherto secret priority schedule for push-button warfare revealed by a leak in World War II. AF experts have been seeking various ways for an airplane to drop a bomb without going directly to the target.

Such bombing technique has several obvious advantages: The plane doesn't have to fly through the anti-aircraft fire usually concentrated around a city. And it is a bomber can drop its load from 50 to 100 miles away from the center of the city. It's impossible to concentrate sufficient anti-aircraft fire in an area that wide to be effective.

The same theory applies to fighter jets. It's extremely difficult and costly to intercept and shoot down an attacking plane that comes no closer than within 100 miles of a target. It will be large enough to carry an H-bomb. It will have a range of 500 miles or more. In shape it will resemble the B-47 "stratofort" with slim swept-back wings.

Although little is known about the exact specifications of the H-bomb, it is generally agreed among the experts that the B-26 is the only plane flying today that could carry it. At a speed of about 300 miles-per-hour there is good reason to worry about the chances of a B-26 getting out of range of the blast after dropping an H-bomb.

However, with the speed of the new jet "bombers" equipped with the same kind of guidance system, it is not only assumed that by the time a decision has to be made on whether or not to drop the H-bomb on an enemy, the aircraft is already in the air. Pilgrims Set Rome Record

Holy Year Celebration Expected to Attract 2,000,000 Visitors

By NEA Foreign Service Rome, Italy—(NEA)—Rome is already alive with pilgrims, here to observe Roman Catholicism's 25th Holy Year. The celebration is held once every 25 years, and is expected to attract 2,000,000 visitors from every part of the world.

What each of the pilgrims must do is visit the four great churches of Rome. First, he goes to St. Peter's, where he crosses the threshold of the Holy Door, walked by a slab of white marble between Holy Years. This act symbolizes that the pilgrim has stepped into a new cleaner life.

Americans are more numerous in Rome this Holy Year than they were in 1925, the last Holy Year. In December 1924, when the Holy Door was opened to symbolize the beginning of the Holy Year, there were 125,000 Americans present at the observance.

Similarly, Americans, particularly women, are flocking to the city. They range in age from children to women like Mrs. K. J. Sheridan, an 85-year-old grandmother from Pasadena, Calif.

The Catholic Travel League of the American Express Company, which is organizing pilgrimages, estimates that 15,000 Americans will visit Rome in '50.

That may sound small, says David Lee of the League, but he bears in mind that the world total is the all-time high as far as American pilgrims are concerned.

Besides ship travel, hundreds of pilgrims are coming to Europe by plane. One airline, Air France, has inaugurated special flights which permit pilgrims to stop over in France, where they can see France's religious shrines, on their way to Rome.

Hotel reservations in Rome, naturally, are at a premium. Authorities are erecting hostels—tent cities—in outlying sections, but the probability is that few Americans will want such rugged accommodations.

A central committee, controlling hotel space, has been careful to keep prices low. At a minimum, guarding against gouging of desperate pilgrims. At a medium-priced hotel, a visitor can obtain food and lodgings for \$200 a day (\$4.50 a day).

But, at some of Rome's exclusive hotels, prices range as high as \$15 to \$20 a day, with the service typically continental and luxurious.
