Philadelphia, March 24.—A United Airlines twin engine car plane was landed safely at Philadelphia's International airport last night after the crew fought a dramatic battle against fire.

Gloves Off in Battle Over Reorganization

Lawless Charges Little Claque of Cynical Men Determined Effort Shall Be Beaten

Manchester, March 24.—The news were off today in the battle over the state reorganization plan. Gov. Chester Bowles got the fight into the bare-knuckled stage with a speech charging that a little clique of cynical men was determined that the effort to reorganize the state government shall be doomed to failure.

Public Support Urged
The Democratic chief executive called for public support to block the efforts of what he called this reorganization working crew. He spoke over a state radio net last night soon after the close of a public hearing in the Legislature at which the words "the" and "falsehood" were applied by a state commissioner to criticism of his department.

The governor praised the State Organization Commission's proposals for overhauling the state government. Its major provisions call for a new state constitution, a drastic consolidation of state departments and increased gubernatorial powers over finances and legislation.

Nothing Unsettled or Improved
He said there was "nothing unsettled or improved" in the state reorganization proposals, adding: "They have been proposed and discussed and read and re-read and re-read for the last 20 years."

"Anyone who urges more time for study" said Bowles, "is either ignorant of what has been happening in our state government during the past 20 years or totally insincere."

Bowles named no names in scolding the "politicians" and "certain well-established lobbies" whom he charged with seeking to tone the State Organization Commission's report into "the ash can."

But he linked them to leaders of the Republican party in control of the state House of Representatives, by asserting that his own was, "we aren't against reorganization; we want to study it more."

That has been the position consistently taken by many G. O. P. leaders in and out of the Legislature.

Republican State Chairman Clarence F. Baldwin said he requested that the governor "saw to it to go into name-calling" and House Majority Leader George C. Conway (R-Guilford) said he requested the speech as "unfortunate."

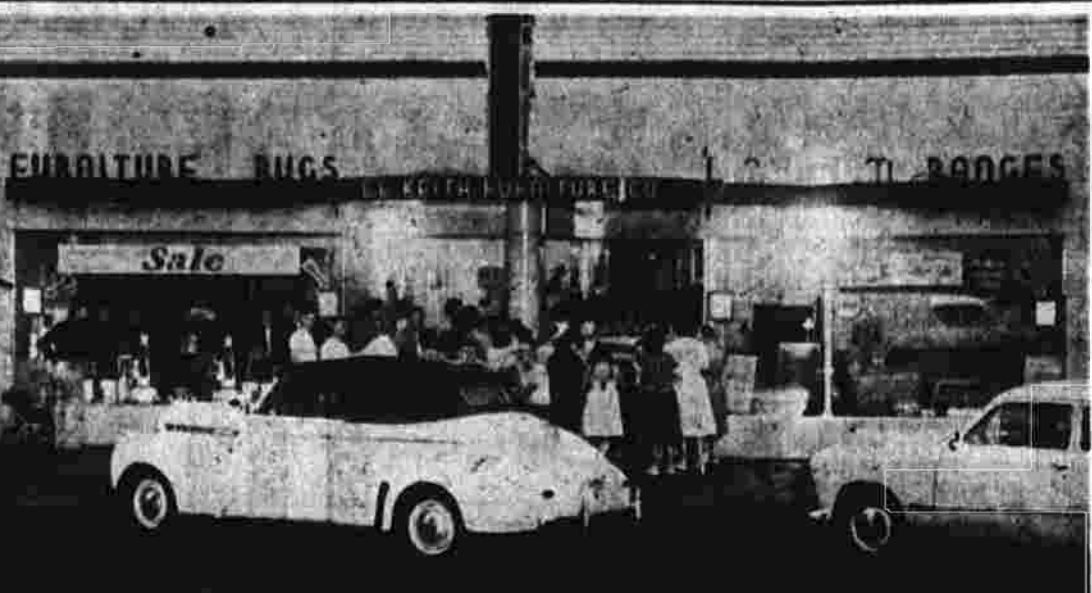
Baldwin said he knew of "no responsible spokesman for the Republican party who has indicated anything but an endeavor to find this reorganization plan an opportunity to bring about reorganization that will make for economy and efficiency."

That is still our aim," he added and we will continue to work constructively. I think that it is unfair to start castigating people who don't believe in the philosophy of the report of too much power in the chief executive and a shotgun method of amending the constitution.

Essential to Have More Time
Conway said that so far as he has been able to gauge public opinion there were many people "with no nose to grind" who feel that it is essential to have more time to study the reorganization plan that applied particularly to the proposed new state constitution.

The G. O. P. leader said, "It is our effort to reorganize our state government."

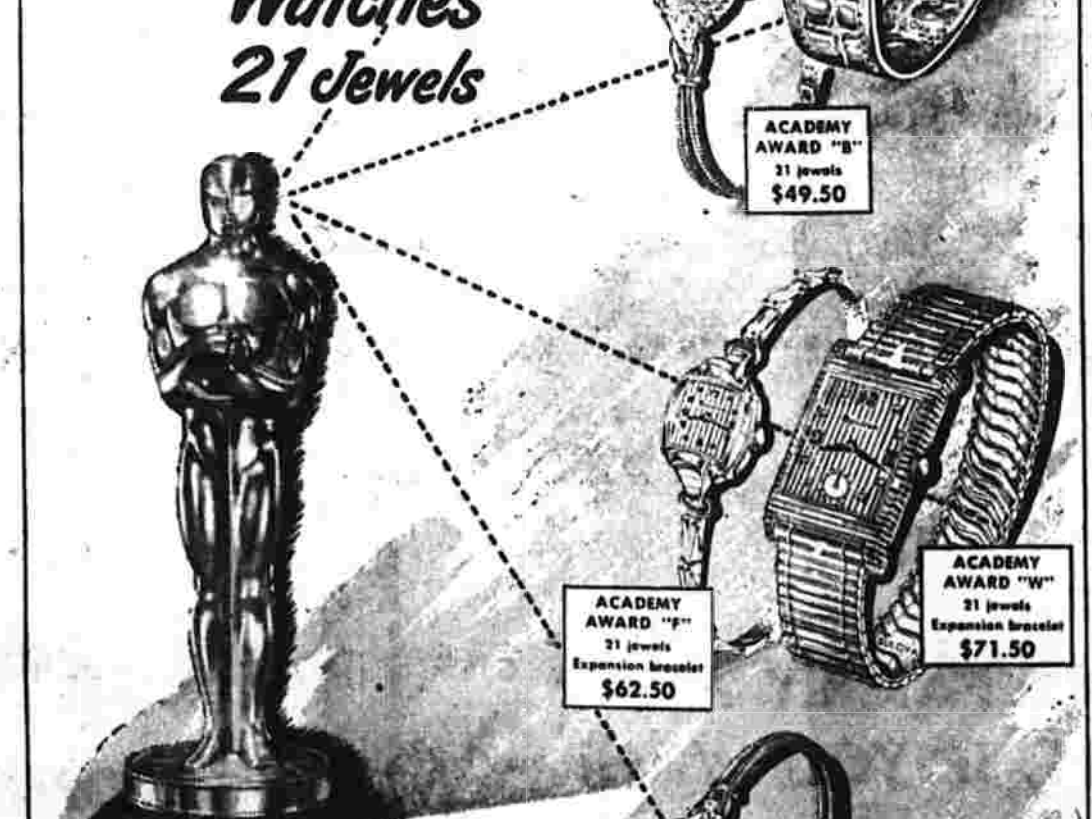

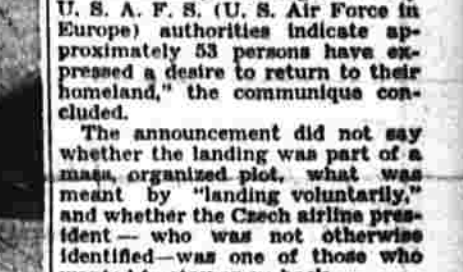
