Foreign Aid Measure **Faces More Attacks** After House Passage

House Opponents Plan To Launch New On News Tidbits slaught When Debate Starts on Bill Providing Money for Various World Recovery Programs Involved; Total Less Than Asked

Washington, April 1 .- (AP) -A \$3,102,450,000 administration foreign aid bill, passed by the House after a week of rough handling, faced fresh attacks today from both sides of Capitol hill. As the measure headed for the Senate in what administration leaders called "good shape,"
House opponents laid plans to
launch a new onslaught when debate starts on a bill providing money for the various world recovery programs involved.

Administration leaders express-

ed the belief they could save the measure from serious damage in either chamber of Congress. It sailed through the House last n i g h t on a 287 to 86 vote, after a week of battering by Republicans and southern Demo

While its total was \$270,000,000 less than the State department wanted, the bill was stripped at the last moment of two administration-opposed amendments. One would have tied up \$1,000,000,000 of the total for the purchase of farm commodities in this country; the other would have halted aid to Britain while Ireland remained partitioned.

Program Cut Almost In Half In addition, the measure contained the controversial "Point Four" program intended to help backward friendly nations get on their feet through tachnical assist-ance from the United States. However, the program was cut almost in half.
