A fresh batch of cold air spread over a wide area of the country from the Rockies into central Texas today. There was snow and rain in many parts of the frosty belt.

Temperatures fell far below freezing over most of the Rocky mountain region and in parts of the northern plains. The cool air also extended over the central and southern states, the upper great lakes region and the upper Mississippi valley. Lows in the north were reported at Cheyenne and Rock Springs, Wyo.

Wild weather continued in the eastern and most of the southern states but the cool air was moving eastward and southward from the Ohio valley.



### Black Market Business Big

#### Smuggling Gangs Trying To Wreck Economy Of Western Germany

Frankfurt, Germany, April 4.—Heavily-armed smuggling gangs from Communist eastern Europe states are doing a huge black market business in Western Germany in a Soviet-sponsored effort to wreck its economy, according to Western officials.

The officials estimated that these Communist-run gangs, along with other international gangs from Western Europe, are flooding the area with tax-evading goods worth \$500,000,000 a year.

The eastern gangs, said the officials, are slipping out of Western Germany about \$10,000,000 worth of vital industrial equipment—mostly ball bearings, optics, tele-mechanical devices and steel tubing needed for industrial expansion programs in Russia and her satellite countries.

Soviet Berlin Smuggling

"The Soviets are behind all the smuggling operations between eastern Europe and Western Germany," an official reported.

Ruthless gangs, some reportedly using armored cars, are said to be smuggling the West German republic of a billion marks (\$200,000,000) a year in customs duties and taxes.

The officials said the gangs are directed by Russian agents as part of the Soviet political-economic squeeze play to bring on a crisis which might topple the Bonn government to the Communist side.

The report said a number of German customs officials have been killed in border gun fights with Communist smugglers.

The smuggling strikes a critical blow at legitimate business in Western Germany as well as making it increasingly difficult for the West German government to finance its rehabilitation programs.

The resulting chronic deficits are paid for by the United States.

Biggest black market item is the estimated 800,000,000 cigarettes smuggled into West Germany each month, costing the government 30,000,000 deutsche marks (\$7,000,000) a month in duties and taxes.

The government also loses an estimated 300,000,000 deutsche marks (\$70,000,000) a year on smuggled coffee. About 60,000,000 pounds a year comes in illegally.

That has forced many legitimate coffee wholesalers to close.

### Western Europe Diet Disclosed

Washington, April 4.—The Economic Cooperation Administration (ECA) figured today that the average Western European now eats at the rate of 2,800 calories daily. The U. S. average is about 3,800.

ECA said the European diet is heavy on the bread-and-potatoes side, with meats, fats and sugar still scarcer than they were before World War II.

Hartford, April 4.—(AP)—The State Board of Pardons yesterday granted conditional pardons to three convicted slayers serving life terms in Wethersfield state prison.
