

Hartford, April 7-(P)-Land-lords in the Hartford area were required to pay \$20,620 in refunds o tenants and payments to the Juited States Treasury for overcharging on rents since April 1, 1949, James L. Delucia, rent direc-tor, disclosed today.

Mr. Delucia gave a summary of actions taken by the Hartford area rent office during the first year of ing and rent act which went into effect last April. He said the summary shows "that the operating position of landlords was substantially benefited" by the act. Ap-proximately 67 per cent of petitions for rent increases were grant ed at an average of \$6.02 per unit, he revealed. Grounds for Increase

The most common grounds for increase in rent were capital im provements made and increasing of service, furniture, furnishings and equipment given to the tenant. Two new grounds for increases provided under the 1949 law were responsible for about one-third of adjustments granted, Mr. Delucia said.
