 "The Soviet government announces its resolute protest to the government of the United States against this gross violation of the Soviet frontier by an American military plane, which at the same time constitutes an unheard-of violation of the elementary rules of international law."
 From the U. S. Air Force and Navy came official denials that any American plane could have made such an attack.
 Gen. Hoyt S. Vandenberg, chief of staff of the U. S. Air Force, said the Air Force had no four-engine bombers in the Baltic area on Saturday, and none are in training.
 Adm. Forrest P. Sherman, chief of naval operations, said the Navy patrol plane has been missing since Saturday—that had been announced previously—that it was unarmored and "therefore, could not have fired on any other aircraft or returned the fire of any aircraft."
 Under Standing Orders Sherman said Navy patrol planes in the Baltic region are under standing orders to "stay well clear of the territory and territories of Russia and Russian satellites." Russia regards Latvia and Estonia as part of her territory and has not recognized it as such.

That and would have to return to Copenhagen. That raised the danger that contact with the reported raft might be lost since no other plane had been seen since it left. "If the U. S. plane fell into the sea after being fired upon by the Russians the crew could possibly escape in rubber rafts which the plane carried. The rafts contain provisions to maintain survivors for nearly two weeks.

Search Is Extended Search planes based at Copenhagen today extended their sweep over the Baltic to only 20 miles off the coast of Soviet-held Latvia. The plane and its crew of 10 men were last seen on the morning of Tuesday. A Russian bomber disappeared after changing photo with a Russian fighter plane over Latvia. Washington officials indicated they believed the raft plane, which they said was not armed, was the U. S. ship referred to by the Soviets in their protest over the alleged shooting.

U. S. Air Force officials in charge of the operation said the search would go on so long as there is a chance that any of the plane's crew of ten men might still be alive on life rafts.

Court Cases

Chester Othris, 30, of 7 Nelson place was found guilty of intoxication, breach of the peace, and resisting arrest in Town Court Tuesday. Othris defied the policeman's warnings, became abusive and started a fight. Jaweciv, off duty and in civilian clothes, had stopped in the restaurant. He assisted in subduing Othris and

bringing him to police headquarters. Judge Wesley C. Gryk suspended sentence on the intoxication charge and sentenced Othris to 30 days each for breach of peace and resisting arrest. The sentences will be served concurrently.

The court issued a warning that persons failing to obey uniformed police will be dealt with severely in the future.

Francis Coleman, 22, of 104 West Main street, Rockyville, recently of this town and arrested with Othris on similar charges, had his case postponed until April 29. Attorney Harold Garrity wishes more time to find witnesses for the defense. The State also requested the postponement in order that it might prepare its case. Coleman was released under \$200 bond. Benjamin Roman, 51, of no certificate address, was found guilty and given a five day jail sentence for intoxication.

Edward Carson is being held in default of \$1,000 bond. The case against Carson, charged with allegedly forging checks and obtaining money under false pretenses, was continued until Saturday. Assistant Prosecutor Charles Bogert requested the postponement because he has had many complaints since the accused was arrested. Bogert said the Police Department is investigating the complaints and will not be ready to present the case before Saturday.

Bainbridge Colby, 80, in Wilson's Cabinet

Bainbridge Colby, 80, in Wilson's Cabinet... Colby, a political individualist throughout his career, suffered a heart attack two weeks ago.

Switched Party Lines... Colby's affiliations with political parties were many and various.

As secretary of state from March 22, 1920 to March 4, 1921, he held the highest cabinet post under a Democratic president.

In 1912, Colby joined Bill Moore in nominating Theodore Roosevelt for president and in helping the Progressive party.

For a decade, Colby remained a Democrat. He made a national speaking tour in support of Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1932.

That association was short-lived. Within a year, Colby was criticizing the New Deal administration.

In 1936, he supported the unsuccessful, Republican presidential nominee, Gov. Alfred M. Landon of Kansas.

Colby succeeded Robert Lansing as secretary of state in Wilson's second term.

When the Soviet army invaded the new republic of Poland in 1920, Colby wrote the famous note it said in part:

"It is not possible for the government of the United States to recognize the present rulers of Russia as a government with which the relations common to

The State Department's official cold shoulder did not prevent the Herald from publishing the most complete and authoritative absorption of what McCarran's speech means for the future of the world. We are much better at breaking a foreign policy than we are at building one. One phase of his own construction, however, lies within the province of Senator McMahon's own authority. He himself has announced that, soon after the Easter recess, the Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy will begin a series of closed-door hearings at which the problem of the relationship of the Baruch Plan to present world realities, which include not only the possibility of the hydrogen bomb and the breaking of our atomic bomb monopoly by Russia, but also the recommendations of many leading authorities that we consider dropping international membership in the one proposal Russia is not accepting, from among the requirements of the Baruch Plan. Senator McMahon himself has hitherto always been a prime defender of the Baruch Plan in its original form. But he must know, as well as any one, that any new and positive approach to Russia must involve concessions on our part. And, in fact, the only point of the series of hearings he has now scheduled would be to examine the possibilities of amending the Baruch Plan closer to something Russia has previously pledged herself to accept. The emergence of an American compromise on the Baruch Plan would be no gesture that we would get anywhere with Russia. That country has a habit of retreating to a new bargaining line just when compromise appears possible. But it has been a very long time since we have made any kind of an effort to meet Russia on any ground except that of the battlefield, for which we are preparing continuously, as we assume Russia is also preparing. There can be no loss or weakness in a real effort to meet Russia on some ground which might let men live.

 Atlantic City, April 12.—The tourist is always right, Atlantic City citizens are being told. As far as the Chamber of Commerce is concerned, grumpy residents can jolly well stay indoors. A leaflet to be distributed in this resort and convention town says that "without visitors there would be no 'Atlantic City,'" and persons who "lack the intelligence or the desire" to realize this "should avoid contact with our visitors." "Never argue with a visitor," the leaflet says. "Adjust the matter at once to the visitor's satisfaction. Never be rude or fresh." It also urges residents to say "Yes, sir" instead of "yeah" to visitors.

Yugoslavs Plan Postwar Elections
 Belgrade, Yugoslavia, April 12.—Despite Italian demands for possession of Trieste, Marshal Tito's "People's Front" pressed ahead today with plans for the first postwar general elections in the Yugoslav-held zone of that free territory. The elections, scheduled for April 18, come at a time when Yugoslav-Italian relations are once again badly strained over disposition of the important Adriatic city of Trieste and its surrounding territory. Yugoslav officials have declared Italy's proposals are expansionist and that this country can never consider giving up its claim to the part of the territory it controls. The Italians have back of them a proposal made two years ago by the United States, Britain and France that the territory be turned over to Italy. This was done to bolster anti-Communist in the Italian elections, but the point has not been reversed by the big three since the Christian Democracy won the Italian election.

Hollister PTA Views Program
 Students of the first, fifth and eighth grades presented a program to the Parent-Teachers association last night at Hollister school with the theme "Foundations for Good Citizenship." Mrs. Gertrude Carter's first graders conducted a panel discussion on what makes a good citizen. A young moderator directed his classmates in pointing out factors of good citizenship and how they may be used in school conduct. The traits listed by the children were honesty, working for safety, health, thrift, responsibility and sharing with others. Fifth grade boys and girls from Miss Esther Anderson's class gave rules and suggestions for safety at school, at home and out-of-door as they spelled out "Keep Hollister School Safe." Miss Catherine McGuire, teacher of the eighth grade had her pupils show how good character traits are developed in school activities and the students illustrated the preparation and presentation of a play as an example of how they learn to work together.

Sentenced for Rape
 Bridgeport, April 12.—Lanolin H. Pettit, 39-year-old Munro Farmer, was sentenced to from 18 months to five years upon his plea of guilty to the statutory rape of the 13-year-old daughter of a neighbor. Pettit and the girl spent four months together living in New York State tourist camps and posing as man and wife. They were arrested by New York State Police after their pictures had been published in a farm magazine. The girl is now in a state institution. Pettit is married and the father of four young children.

Marshall Plan Dilemma
 When the Marshall Plan was inaugurated, it was a fundamental aim of its prospective operation that it would, in time, build up the production of western Europe to such a stage that western Europe would be able to engage in trade with its natural economic counterpart, which is eastern Europe. The purpose of the Marshall Plan was not to establish or confirm a trade barrier between East and West, but to facilitate trade between them. The basic theory of the Marshall Plan was that once we had built western Europe up to the point where it had production for much trade with the East, the need for the Marshall Plan itself would then disappear. That was to be the day when the Marshall Plan ended. This key theory of the original Marshall Plan did not last very long. Instead of encouraging that trade with the East which was the ultimate goal of the Marshall Plan, the United States has laid down a virtual embargo on trade with the East, and compelled its friends in Europe to honor that embargo. The natural flow of East-West trade which we theoretically set out to encourage is now, in practice, forbid.

Save The Swamps
 Although considerable progress has been made in Connecticut in soil conservation and the improvement of soil, the matter of water source conservation has not generally drawn the same amount of interest or assistance. The saving and extension of our water resources, many of which are small and local, as has been clearly demonstrated by recent droughts a very important project. It is true that in all directions farmers are making use of bulldozers to hollow out additional ponds and drainage basins for the watering of stock. Country gas departments too have been interested in the strategic location of water holes from which they may draw in case of fire. But it may take greater efforts than these to preserve and conserve those lands which, in the future, will form natural water-sheds. The coming buildup of the eastern part of the state will also use up large areas of land which once collected and stored water. Already in many country districts wells are being driven down to 200 feet to get the water supply that once could be tapped at 50 feet. Homes built comparatively close together often have wells leading off the same water vein. Every effort should be made to keep, as far as the water collecting areas in our towns. The swamp is a good thing to keep. It is not worthless by a long shot now, and its value will increase.

Is Not Hurt In Accident

Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt Is Shaken in a Three Car Crash

Hyde Park, N. Y., April 12.—Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt, driving to Hyde Park to observe the fifth anniversary of her husband's death today, was shaken last night in a three-car accident on the New York highway. Mrs. Roosevelt was being driven home from a session at the United Nations at Lake Success, where she is a U. S. delegate. She was riding in the front seat of her sedan with her chauffeur, Russell W. Laska.

"We saw a car coming toward us across out of its path," she said later.

Laska shouted a warning. "Bounce yourself. We're going to be hit" and Mrs. Roosevelt jammed her foot against the floorboards.

The oncoming machine struck another car immediately ahead of the sedan, and then sideswiped the rear of the Roosevelt auto.

"Nobody was hurt," the former first lady said.

Laska drove the sedan to a garage, and Mrs. Roosevelt took a taxi for the five-mile ride to her Val Kill cottage on the Hyde estate.

Say Regiment Is Wiped Out

Nationalist Officials Report Red Invasion of Hainan Is Repulsed

Taipei, Formosa, April 12.—Nationalist China today announced it had wiped out the Red Gen. Luo's 25th regiment in this island climax.

Three hundred and thirty of the 25th's quickly smashed attempt to invade Hainan. The Nationalists said earlier they killed the other 1,000 Red.

The survivors were afraid of stern punishment for failure if they returned to their Luchow peninsula base, only 40 miles away. So they fled in the Gulf of Tonkin until yesterday.

Then they tried again to land on Hainan, presumably to operate as guerrillas.

Nationalist warships sank the 25th's transport ship, the *Yueh Feng*, and destroyed the other two.

The third ship ran aground on the coast of Hainan, and the 25th's survivors were captured.

Hainan, a large island and province, is the last of the Red's mainland bases. It is the only one left.

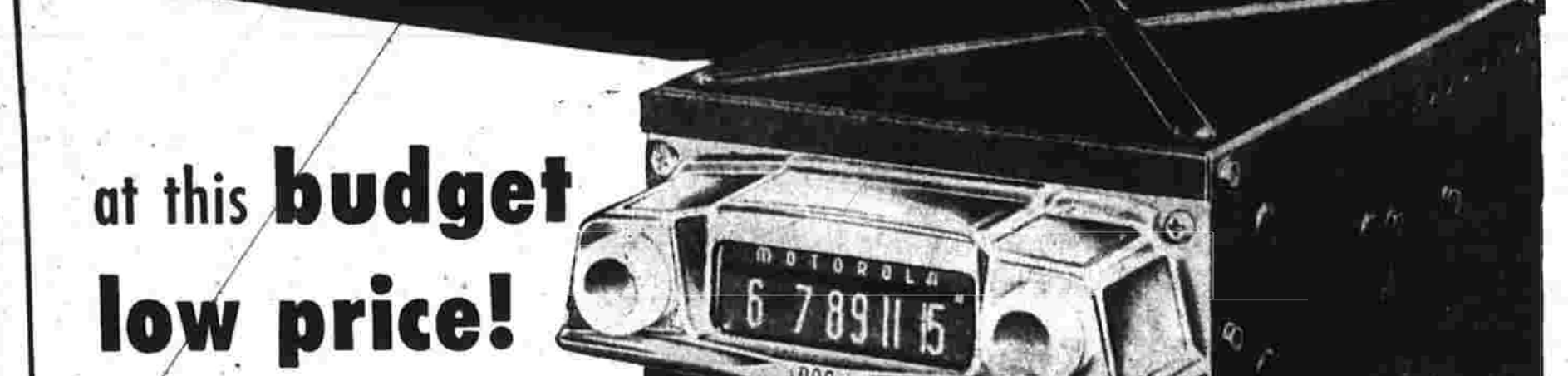

Jobless Count On Rise Here

Seasonal Layoffs in Garments and Tobacco Sent Total Up

A seasonal layoff, curtailing production of women's coats at Manchester Modes, resulted in a major increase in unemployment here last week. The figures released by the State Labor Department show that the increase amounted to 18.4 per cent with 532 persons filing claims. There were 229 females listed in this number. Unemployment compensation claims were issued to 322 claimants of which 175 were in retail claims, 228 in contract, and 22 in agriculture. Nine veterans filed for state aid, one new and eight continued. Manchester remained next to last in the number of jobless claimants in the state with Williamette reported only 402 claims. The number of jobless claimants in the state rose to 40,085 during the week ending April 8 from 38,501 the previous week, but was considerably lower than the 52,814 who applied under the Civil War and 10,845 under the GI law a year ago. There were 666 still filing under the curtailed GI law last week. The rise was attributed to the start of a new benefit year for those who had exhausted previously and whose previous benefit year had started during the April-June 1949 quarter. Tobacco warehousing layoffs totaled 440, highest in any one industry. Textiles and women's garment factories combined had a sizable number of layoffs while electrical parts companies laid off 135.
