What Keeps Us Going

Every year at this season there comes a time of dire warning to the young people of America about to graduate from schools and colleges. It's going to be very tough, the warning goes, to find jobs this year.

Strangely enough, we don't worry too much about the difficulties which will confront these young people. They will, we suspect, find their way into the American job system.

Nevertheless, the condition itself is becoming chronic, and as it concerns young graduates alone, but as it concerns the entire body of American employables, which is increasing year after year, we now have, in this country, some four or five million unemployed. This is considered, by hard-boiled economists, a "normal" situation, which is not unhealthy, since it stimulates good production performance on the part of those who do have jobs.

But this "normal" amount of unemployment seems more of a problem to grow than to diminish. Sooner or later, we are going to have to admit that we are faced with a permanent unemployment problem.

And while we consider the problem, we must also realize that two great artificial pump primers are also responsible for the fact that our present unemployment situation isn't worse than it is. One of these, artificial pump primers is the military man, by which we give Europe the money for purchase of things from us. The other is our rearmament program, for ourselves and for Europe.

Both of these programs are as artificial as raking leaves, and little more productive in the long run. Yet they are the mainstays of our present high level of production and employment. Without them, we would be facing a drastic condition of unemployment right now. They are the keys to our present prosperity.

So long as we keep on with them, and keep expanding them, as we are now doing, we will avoid any drastic problem of unemployment, and we will, after all, give jobs to most of the young graduates each June. But the appalling thing is that, for all our fine visions of what the post-war American economy should be, we still have no substitute for subsidies and armaments races as crutches of our own prosperity. If the cold war need end today, and the need for armaments disappear, we would be faced with an economic crisis at home. It is perhaps a little too drastic to say that we cannot afford peace. But there is just enough truth in the statement that we have allowed our economy to remain dependent upon the business of war for its prosperity to cause us grave worry.

Some demonstration that we could be prosperous, that we could provide full employment, without war, might be of some help in freeing us from war.

I am encouraged to accept that remark as a promise that the members of our Building Committee will not attempt to shift the blame for the situation to the Board of Directors and to the public of Manchester generally.

With the approaching new members to our Building Committee should come the admission that we are in a position to delay or defeat normal progress of discussion and decision should be relieved of all his or her obligations. It should be made very clear that plain stubbornness or willful discrimination to cooperate cannot be tolerated.

It is to be hoped that no other member of the original committee will subscribe to the theory of a member to whom I refer. The Board of Education and the Board of Directors are primarily responsible for the elimination of delay in this school affair. Dangerous Incident

Russia is bigger than Yugoslavia. That is one reason a plane incident between Russia and the United States is a much more serious matter than were those incidents of several years ago when American planes were shot down on Yugoslav territory. There seemed no question about our ability to lick Yugoslavia if we had to. Most Americans, therefore, except for our perpetual hot-heads, were quite content to have American diplomacy function from Yugoslavia, as it did.

We are not sure, however, that we can lick Russia. Furthermore, Russia is the nation we regard our main enemy in the world, where Yugoslavia was, at the time of our trouble with her, only a Russian satellite. For this reason, the Baltic plane incident is more of a challenge to us, and correspondingly more dangerous for the world.

It may be fortunate, in some extent, that the facts in the case are not too clear. What we all think, as of this writing, is clear enough. We think Russia shot down our plane, and that Russia's action in protesting our plane's flight was designed to cover up Russia's guilt.

That is what we think, but it is not what we know. We do not, on present information, know where our plane was flying. We do not know it was not inside Russian territory. And although it is very nice to say that the Russians should merely salute any American plane which happens to wander into Russian territory, we must also ask ourselves what the behavior of our Air Force would be if it found Russian planes over our territory.

What all of us, even including those hot-heads like Senator Bridges who cannot resist warlike talk in such an incident, do know is this: we do not want to go to war.

What all of us must also know is that it is something of a miracle that two great powers plodding each other incessantly have not become involved in similar incidents long before this. We must also know that so long as the cold war continues to be fought with Russian and American military forces located as close to one another as they are in Europe there will be continual danger of more such incidents. And we should know that one of these incidents may present such a clear challenge, one way or the other, that it may lead to war. We could exact damages from Yugoslavia. But neither the United States nor Russia is likely to exact damages or apologies from the other.

With flying what it is, neither side can be absolutely sure that one of its planes won't find its way into unfriendly territory. With tension between the United States and Russia what it is, neither side can be sure that such a plane would not be fired upon. Obviously, both sides have been exceptionally careful to date, otherwise we should have had many such incidents before this.

There is only one tactical solution short of actual peace. That is for both sides to disengage their military lines and withdraw, to leave an extensive no man's land between them. It is one more reason why both sides ought to want to get out of Germany. Their continued military presence there is a continual threat that both may be trapped in a war neither side really wants.

Well, He Did It

Yesterday, over the Catskills, New York City's rain-making expert, who has been getting \$100 a day to find a way when it wasn't raining without his help, took off in his plane and flew over the Catskills. He dropped 100 pounds of dry ice.

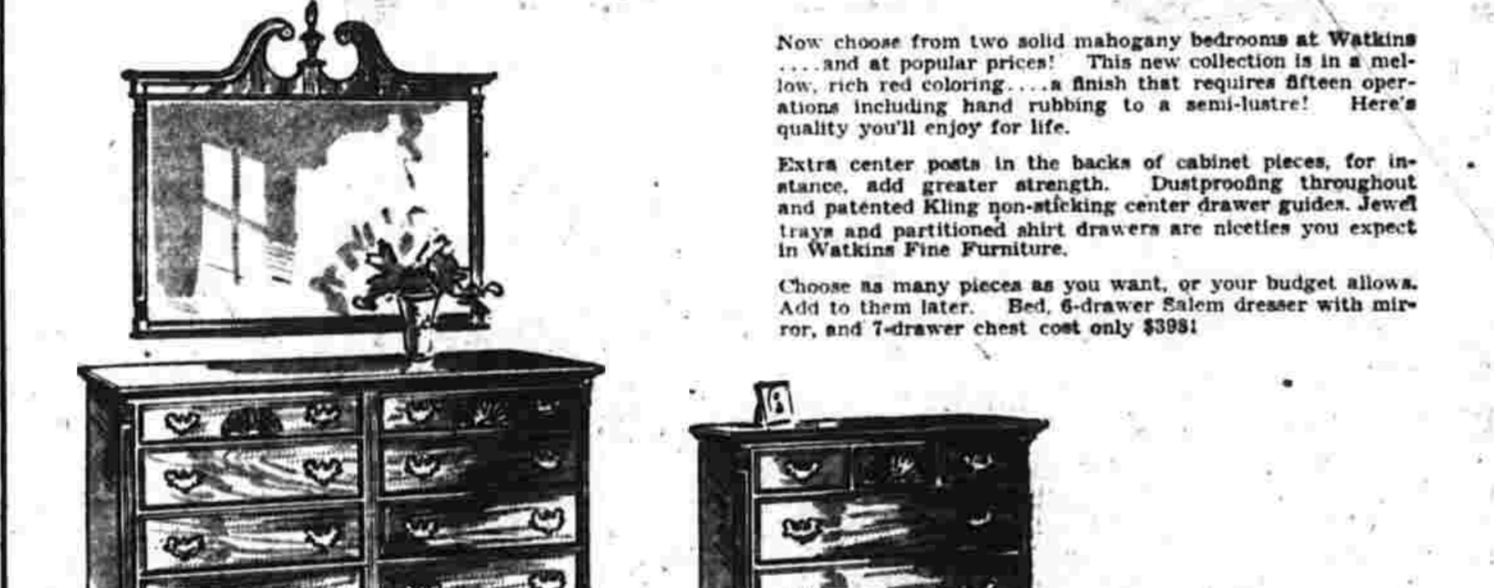

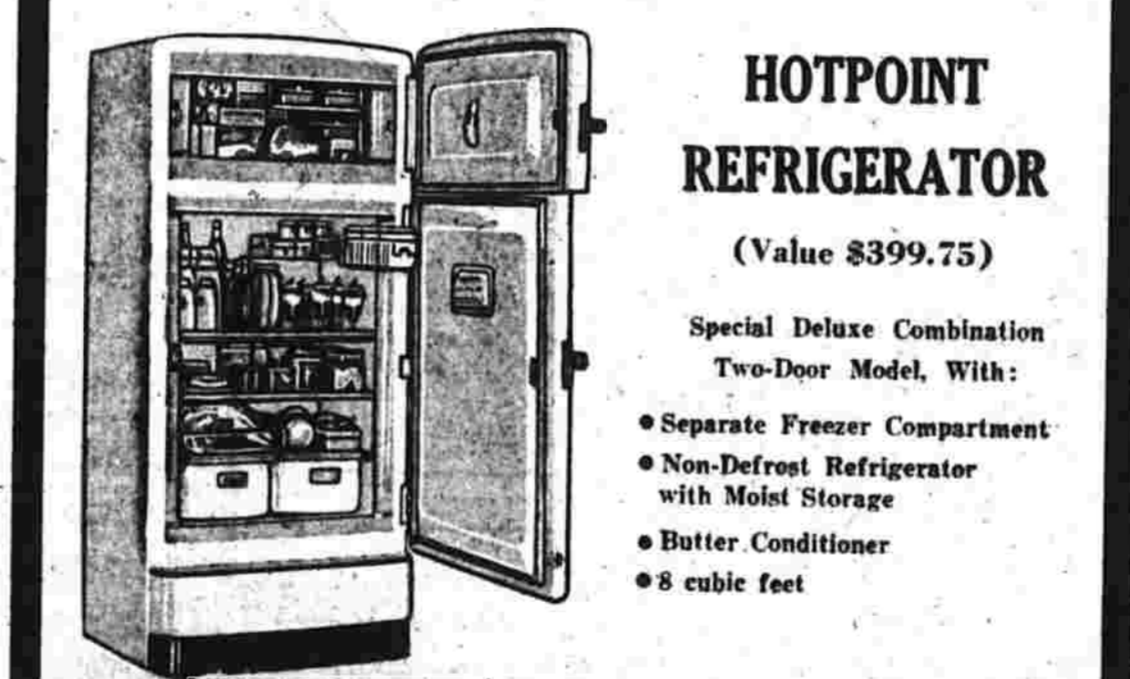
