### New School Building Survey Is Endorsed

Directors Vote to Proceed With Study of Plans to Meet Any Emergency on Rooms

The Board of Directors last night officially received from Chairman Charles S. House of the Board of Education, a request for the Board of Education to consider and consider the possibility of plans for acting now to stage off a school classroom emergency. The House report, printed in yesterday's Herald as part of the Board of Education's report, was presented last night of the Board of Education, which was held in a session of the Board of Directors.

Director Robert F. Havelly moved that the general manager proceed immediately to secure plans for an elementary school with 13 classrooms for the Broad street site.

The Education group had suggested that, since the voters had turned down rebuilding of the Hollister school for junior high use, its continuance as an elementary school would cut down the need for a large Broad street structure. The House report also suggested survey of the town in regard to school needs with a view to bringing the present survey up to date.

Director Raymond Cooper wondered if the survey should not be made before any action was taken on the Broad street building. He thought a survey might consist of a study of the Hollister building which might be undertaken, and that it might be that the Broad street site would not be used. He said, however, he would accept the Board of Education responsibility for procedure.

General Manager George H. Waddell replied that it was his opinion that under the terms of the bond issue by which the town planned schools, and under previous orders of town meetings, still standing, by which the Broad street site was bought for a school site, the location, as matters stand, would have to contain a school. He said that the questions are involved in any unauthorized changeover in location.

Not Enough Study? Alexander Jarvis addressed the Board to say he thinks the town officials and the Board of Education, who now have altered their former plans, should study this thing enough study in the first place. Why, Jarvis asked, didn't they bring in originally the requests for a smaller Broad street school now advanced?

Waddell replied that the present recommendations are the result of the referendum turn-down of the original program. He said that full consideration has originally been given, but that the original

### Would Extend Adams Street

Town and Contractor Jarvis May Join in Crossover Highway

An extensive road building operation, to be entered into jointly by the town and Alexander Jarvis, will result in the extension of Adams street from its present intersection with Center street, southerly "across lots" and easterly to West Center street at Waddell road.

The new roadway will cross property now owned by St. James' parish. Some years ago the church bought the property, once owned by Schreiber, with the intent of some day erecting on it a new church building.

The church will retain the major part of its original purchase, but the proposed new road will cut through the property, and that section left at the west of the new road, consisting of some 13 building lots, will be bought by Jarvis and developed, together with other property he owns and which will be opened up.

Urged in 1948 The extension of Adams street was first urged in the original town plan survey conducted in 1948 and was stated in the annual report for that year. Subsequently, the Town Planning Commission in July, 1947, asked that the development of the road be considered. Last night the Board of Directors received the completed details.

Under the proposed building agreement, Jarvis would construct the major portion of the road, and except for the sidewalk, which would abut the remaining church property, would install walks, water and sewer facilities. The town would build that small part of the new road which is located between the present end of Adams street and Ochoa street.

Straightening Plan In this connection, one existing bend would be straightened. This deviation now exists where a portion of Adams street, extended, crosses Center street west to the Jarvis business block and then intersects Ochoa street. This construction, the part that the town will build, will in turn result in a straight line.

### Gallstones Smashed to Bits By Inaudible Sound Waves

By Alison L. Blalock Associated Press Science Reporter Atlantic City, April 19—Half of them had some relief of pain compared with 20 per cent getting relief after receiving injections of salt solution, and about 50 per cent getting morphine.

The sound wave treatment offers hope for removing gallstones—perhaps kidney stones also—without surgery. It was described today to a group of three doctors. They are Dr. Harold Lannport of the Yale School of Medicine and Herbert F. Newman and Ralph Elsbrom of Beth Israel hospital in New York City.

Their work so far has been done only on anesthetized rabbits and a dog. They found that the beam of sound waves would break up gallstones in five to 60 seconds. In this time, the beam of sound didn't harm the living tissue around the stones.

No sound-wave operation on humans has been tried yet. The right equipment doesn't exist. But some is being developed by the Crystal Research Laboratories in Hartford, Conn.

Gallstones form in the gall bladder, just under the ribs. They form from body chemicals becoming hard objects of any shape or size, even more than an inch long. There may be only one, or hundreds, each like tiny bits of gravel. They block the passage leading from the gall bladder to the intestine.

Human gallstones were placed inside loops of rabbit intestine and exposed to a short burst of regulated high frequency sound. About 80 per cent of the stones were shattered or broken up with no apparent harm to the surrounding living tissues.

Pain after surgery often can be relieved by habituating the chemicals of sleeping pills, said Dr. Arthur S. Keats and Henry K. Beecher of the anesthesia laboratory of Harvard Medical school at Massachusetts General hospital.
