Diseases And Tariffs

Here are two facts from opposite and frequently warring sides of the American economic picture which reflect the same basic philosophy. The view of the world from such strange company are the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Engineers and the Manufacturers Association of Connecticut. And the fact that they are in such strange company indicates that the basic problems and the basic errors of our time are confined to no one element of our economic life.

The Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Engineers has some time ago opened a wider market called a railroad strike for next Wednesday. The strike, if it materializes, will be a fight to maintain the employment of a second fireman on each locomotive. A Presidential fact-finding board has already decided, for its part, that such a second fireman is unnecessary. But the union says it attacks the proposition as one which involves feather-bedding.

The Manufacturers Association of Connecticut has some time ago opened a wider market called a state of the threat involved in possible further American tariff reductions on a list of some 2,500 items, many of which are made in Connecticut.

What is the similarity between these two stands?

It is that in each case the American public pays more for goods and services than is actually necessary, and that it should do so in order to preserve, critically, existing jobs and industrial establishments.

The railroad unions don't like diesel because they threaten to eliminate existing jobs. That possible elimination of jobs is one of the logical economies of the diesel operation. But the union says that that economy must be sacrificed and the American people forced to pay as much as ever for railroad service because a product of artificial requirement that men be employed on diesels whether they are needed or not.

Management and common sense have the answer for that. It is that future diesel firemen and engineers should seek some other form of employment where they can be truly productive.

Tariff reductions are the diesel in the Manufacturers Association scheme of things. The association doesn't like tariff reductions because they threaten existing jobs. That reason, tariff reductions do this is because they would offer the American public the economies available in foreign trade.

The Manufacturers Association, therefore, like the railroad men, wants an artificial decree guaranteeing that Connecticut industries be continued whether they are efficient or not.

Common sense, too, has the answer for that. It is actually the extreme and somewhat shocking answer that we ought to stop making in Connecticut those things we cannot make in competition with other parts of the world, and find activities in which we would be truly productive.

But if you are a railroadman, and it is your job, or your son's job, which is threatened by the diesel, it is likely you can see only one immediate answer, and that is to force the railroad to hire men they may not really need.

And if you are a manufacturer, or an employer of a manufacturer, threatened by tariff cuts, it is likely you can see only one immediate answer, which is to keep the tariff walls high, even if that does

Tumor Clinic Is Active Here

Supported Entirely by Contributions Made to Local Cancer Drive

Though every Manchester citizen is familiar with the great work done by the American Cancer Society, few people are aware of the countless services and educational facilities offered to Manchester residents by the local Tumor Clinic.

The Manchester Tumor Clinic, originally opened in July 1946, has served 27 patients during the seven clinic held last year. In 1949, the clinic had grown to a point where 23 clinics were held, serving 177 patients, under the expert supervision of Chairman Dr. John H. Hamblit, pathologist at the Manchester Hospital, Dr. Edward L. Besser, local surgeon and member of the Manchester Cancer committee and Mrs. Frances Taylor, who as committee chairman, Mrs. George Peters, in charge of the local organization running smoothly and efficiently.

The clinic is a part of the American Cancer Society, and its purpose is to bring to the attention of the community knowledge about cancer, so that he will not lose his life needlessly, as approximately half of all cancer patients do.

One of the most vital services the clinic offers is the education of Manchester residents to the urgency of early detection, which is one of the most important factors in the control of the disease, by consulting them with the Detection Center at McCook Hospital in Hartford. Here they receive a complete and thorough physical examination including X-ray and laboratory work, and appointments may be made through the Cancer detection office at McCook Hospital, Hartford.

The Manchester Tumor Clinic offers numerous other worthwhile services, such as medications and drugs, dressings and comfort items, hospital beds and wheel chairs for use in the home, transportation to and from the clinic, or to Hartford, for therapy treatments, and in some cases, financial assistance for the moderately indigent. Since January first, 30 new cases requiring social service, medical or financial assistance have been handled by the local clinic.

Manchester Tumor Clinic, which is wholly dependent upon Manchester contributions to the Cancer Fund Drive for its support. Without sufficient funds, the local clinic would be unable to carry on its many services. Of each dollar donated to the Cancer Fund Drive, 25 cents stays in Manchester, 25 cents goes for research and 10 cents is forwarded to the national office, to carry on its excellent work in the field of education and organization.

The major challenge of cancer is the life-saving fact that it is a disease which is not curable until it is detected early. The American Cancer Society offers the public an opportunity to help continue to fight this "Number Two Killer" on the list of causes of death today to Robert Hathaway, Manchester Trust Company.

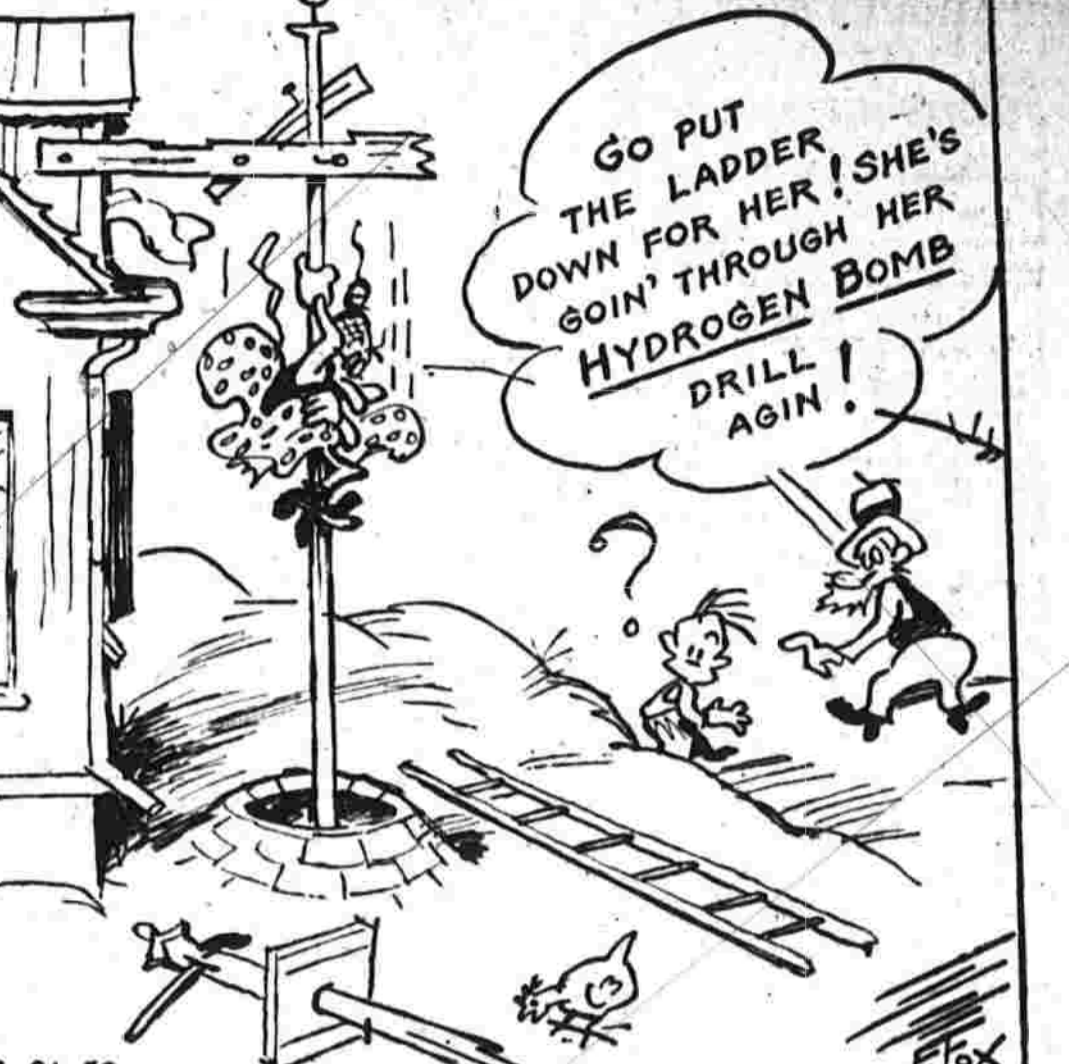
