Another Local Group Attends UN Meeting

Forty-One Members of Women's Club Visit Lake Success; Report On Day's Activities

Forty-one Manchester women had the opportunity of attending a meeting conducted by Mrs. Richardson on the morning of the 25th at the United Nations building at Lake Success, N. Y.

The group sponsored by the local Women's club left early in the morning on a chartered bus to spend the day at the UN where Mrs. Howard Richardson, accredited UN representative and member of the American Women's association, served as guide. A busy day with student groups, women's clubs and a large church group with members from many states made it difficult for the Manchester group to attend meetings of four the building together. However, rotation of a small number of tickets enabled all visitors to obtain a comprehensive idea of the function of the world organization. During the morning the Manchester women attended Mrs. Roosevelt's committee meeting in small groups. She is chairman of the Human Rights committee which is part of the Economic and Social Council. This council seeks to build a world of greater prosperity, stability and justice. Radios are provided for visitors as well as delegates and secretaries so they could understand all speakers by dialing the translation. Usually five languages are available. English, French, Russian, Spanish and Chinese. These are concurrent with the speech and in fact, pauses and other methods of stressing points are used in translation to match that of the speaker. Occasionally committee work is hindered by the problems of idiomatic and figurative phrases used by speakers which suffer in translation and are misunderstood. An informative movie was shown in one of the council rooms showing the accomplishments of the United Nations. An example was the use of the Children's Fund in distributing food and medicine to needy children of the world. In a special afternoon meeting the women heard Benton Caruthers, publicity agent of the Human Rights committee, and John Wesley Coulter, a university professor on loan to the UN to act as advisor on the trusteeship council. Mr. Caruthers explained the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. This document consists of 30 articles to serve as a common standard of achievement of people and all nations. Mr. Coulter lived in the Fiji and Samana islands during his work in the Pacific area for several years. He described customs, habits and problems of the people. Another meeting attended was

Planners Told Manchester
 When the war was drawing to a close, some interested Manchester citizens and public officials, concerned with the future of Manchester's development, inaugurated a movement to have a planning study made for Manchester.

The report of the planners, Frederick J. Adams, Favel Shurt, and Roland B. Griggley, all nationally known and respected experts in the municipal field, was made public on June 15, 1945. We quote from several pertinent sections of that "Master Plan" report.

One finds the planners of five years ago saying that: "So far as the near future is concerned, we see no need for new subdivisions for relatively low-cost housing. . . . Where new areas are subdivided they should be of such character as will attract more expensive homes than those built during the war. To avoid depreciation and the possible creation of future slums, now unknown in Manchester, further subdivisions should be discouraged unless the demand for them is so great as to justify installation of all utilities (paid streets, sidewalks, water and sewer) entirely at the expense of the developer. The planners also said: "Conclusions based on the above are that the Town Tax base will be, relatively stable; if the Town encourages only such national industrial building as will bring valuations higher than the present average."

Five years ago, looking at the number of low-cost homes then existing in Manchester, the Town Planners warned that we already had "possibly far more than enough low cost housing." They warned we should encourage only new housing which would bring our average values up. That was five years ago. Ever since that time, during all these five years, the construction of low-cost housing in Manchester has been in high gear. Roughly, we would say, the amount of low-cost housing that the Town Planners considered "possibly far more than enough" in 1945, has been doubled, or tripled. We were warned. We did try to impose some controls. But every thing that we have done has failed to slow up the trend. Whatever has been done, it has not been enough to guard us against the dangers the Town Planners had in mind.

The political progress of man has been easy to summarize. It has been a process in which he has steadily extended and expanded the area covered by his special and exclusive pride. First he had pride for the area of the family, and he found that too small, so he promoted that exclusive pridefulness of his to the scope of the tribe. It is to move the nations of the world toward toward a larger area of peace and security and a pridefulness which will no longer be exclusive because it includes all earth's children.

Living Costs Inch Upward

Note Rise in Primary Commodities; Prices Reflecting Demand

New York, April 26.—(AP)—The cost of living is inching up again, however temporarily. And the rise in some primary commodities in recent days offers little cheer to the ultimate consumer, for the short term, in such things as some foods, gasoline, tires, and metals.

Gasoline took up about three-fourths of a cent a gallon at wholesale today along the east coast, with a strong hint that more is to come, as the operated season starts. This price strengthening reverses a weakness during the winter months, especially noticeable in the Midwest.

Good driving weather is also one of the buttresses to the growing rubber price structure. American owners more cars than ever. They are expected to drive more miles than ever this summer, and to wear out more tires. Rubber companies have already used 20 per cent more rubber so far this year than last in getting set for the big replacement market.
