New Haven, April 28.—(AP)—Police had turned over to juvenile court authorities today a 14-year-old boy who, they said, accidentally shot his older brother yesterday with a .22 caliber target pistol.

Donald Shea, 16, is in New Haven hospital with a bullet wound in his right chest which hospital authorities say is serious, although his name has not been placed on the danger list.

According to least Walter Reagan the shooting occurred in the basement of a house at 461 Lexington street where the boys live with their mother, Mrs. M. Georgina Shea.

Could Fid Budens Himself
 Ex-Communist Louis Budens' explanation of his own charge that Owen Lattimore could have taken public positions in order to help the Communist party line leaves open the possibility that he himself may still be serving Communist purposes.

What Budens said about Lattimore was this: He said that if Lattimore was a leader in collecting money for the Communist party, Budens' unproved attack on Finland, that could have been the result of a special party disbursement to Lattimore, in order to allow to take an anti-Communist position publicly in order to be still more efficient and protected in his carrying on of Communist work under cover.

And if Lattimore was a champion of the Marshall Plan, which Communist leaders in the Progressive Party found objectionable, Wallace to oppose that, according to Budens, was another example of the same kind of special disbursement, in which Lattimore was allowed to oppose Communist policy in one instance in order to win public standing for more subtle services to the Communist cause.

We don't know whether the Communist party is that subtle and clever. Perhaps it is.

But if Mr. Budens is correct in his logic, then that same logic indicates that Americans ought to be worried about Mr. Budens himself. For, by the same logic, the party strategists might have decided that Mr. Budens should be granted a special disbursement to renounce his party publicly and undergo a re-conversion to his own former religious faith, on the theory that such tactics would establish great and notable opportunities for him to be of continued service to the Communist cause.

Does that sound far-fetched? No more so than the charges against Lattimore.

How would it serve the cause of Communism? The answer is that anything could better do that in the cause of Communism in the world today than the paralysis and division which our current glut of sensational charges against Mr. McCarthy is creating for American foreign policy.

This is what the Boston Herald has to say about the charges against Mr. McCarthy:

"If McCarthy and Bridges are not emulating the Moscow they purport to adore, we would like to know what they are emulating. Certainly, there is nothing in the American tradition to sustain them."

"There is nothing we can think of which would better serve to discredit America and her foreign policy throughout the world than the tactics of the McCarthy-Survey, nothing is better served by those Republicans than world Communism. They are certainly doing their best to win the cold war for Russia."

By his own description of Communist strategy, Budens himself could be emulated.

That is how tangled up such hunts can get. That this country should ever have got itself into a position where it is being attacked breathlessly for the testimony of Communists and ex-Communists in its search for a determination of facts that probably never can be all determined in the writer of this column's lifetime.

It is something of which we should be proud. It is a healthy sign that we have, hitherto, been able to help of some senseless headline hunters, into a wilderness which mind indexes
