our own economy by a flood of foreign goods. We need a policy which should be based in part on the expansion of our American industry to meet the needs of our own people. But it seems clear that the present policy is very unwise.

The closing of Europe's dollar gap—the deficit between dollars spent and dollars earned in world trade—could be achieved if this country devoted only five per cent of its national income to the purchase of overseas goods, instead of the present 18 per cent. This would mean an import total of \$1,000,000,000.

Imports are not only a drain on our resources, but they are a positive contribution to domestic production. We can produce more than we can consume.

We cannot continue to sell abroad unless we have a surplus of raw materials. They provide manufacturing plants with the raw materials to produce goods for export.

In addition, imports enlarge the quantity of raw materials available to the American consumer.
