Tree Seedling Delivery Made

Farmers Cooperating in Soil Conservation Program Give Them

Last week 20,000 forest tree seedlings and wildlife shrubs were delivered to farmers cooperating with the Toland County Soil Conservation District. The seedlings were made available to the district by the U. S. Soil Conservation Service and were grown at the Service Nursery at Big Flats, New York. The seedlings were distributed to landowners who in cooperation with the district are carrying out a planned soil conservation program on their farm. Three and a half bushels received include White Pine, Norway Spruce, Larch, Black Locust, Scotch Pine, Asiatic Chestnut, Multiflora Rose, Silky Cornel, Tartan Honeylocust, Juniper and Basket Willow.

Earlier this month 2,000 seedlings were furnished the district by the State Fish and Game Department. Several landowners have purchased seedlings direct from the State Forest Department. The Toland County Soil Conservation District reports that the landowners cooperating with the district have planned for over 600 acres of steep, eroded and rough sloping land to be returned to forest. Most of this land will require some reforestation. 150 acres have been reforested to date. Progress in reforestation has been slow, however, due to the shortage of planting stock which has existed since the close of the war.

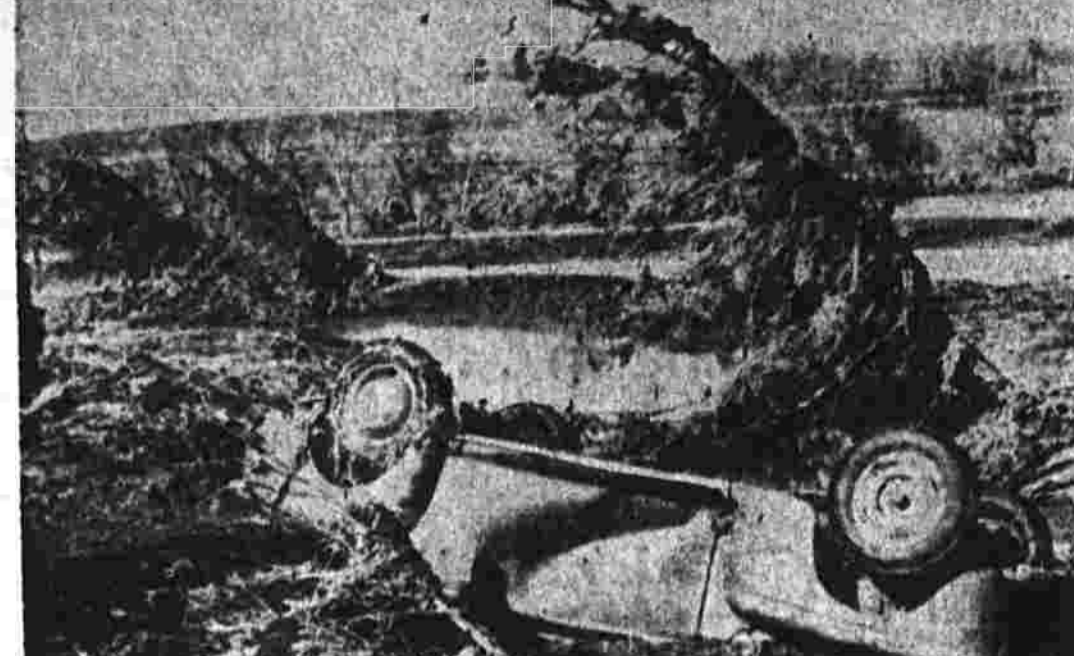

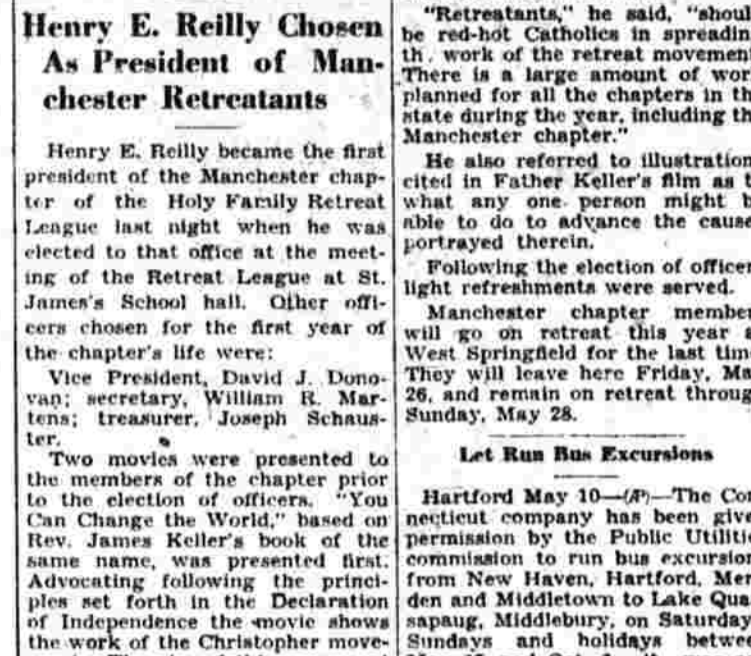

Study Goals Of Teachers

Representatives of Local Groups to Assemble in Hartford Saturday

Hartford, May 10.—Three hundred teachers representing affiliated local teacher groups throughout the state will attend the annual Representative Assembly of the Connecticut Education Association Saturday in Hartford.

Delegates to the annual business session of the state association, which includes approximately 10,000 Connecticut teachers and educational administrators, will meet at Weaver High school, beginning at 9:30 a. m., to work out a 1950-51 program and to evaluate CEA's record of the past year.

Among the recommendations to be presented to the Representative Assembly by the association's various commissions is a proposal that legislation be introduced in the state's General Assembly calling for a \$1000 minimum superannuation, retirement allowance for teachers.

CEA's Legislative Action Commission will also recommend introduction of legislation granting to town meetings or representative municipal boards the power to override by a two-thirds vote reduction of the educational budget by finance authority. The same commission will propose consideration of legislation for "non-partisan" election of members of boards of education.

The association's Personnel Publics Commission will recommend that the CEA adopt the National Education Association's minimum salary goals: for a Bachelor degree, \$2400 minimum to \$4800 or more; for a Master's degree, \$2600 minimum to \$5200 or more; for a Doctorate, \$3000 minimum to \$6000 or more.

CBA president Friedrich G. Roth of Bridgeport will preside at the meeting, which will also include election of new officers.
