This Time The Anti-Trust Lawyers Won A Case Against A&P

As almost everyone now knows, the anti-trust lawyers in Washington have brought a civil suit to destroy A&P. They ask the courts to order the dissolution of this company. They say that this suit is based on the fact that they won a suit against us at Danville, Illinois, in 1946. They did. In that case, Federal Judge Walter C. Lindley made a decision against A&P.

Immediately thereafter, in a letter explaining his decision, Judge Lindley wrote: "I have not condemned the A&P system. I have not made a finding which could be the basis for a suit of dissolution."

So, now we have the anti-trust lawyers saying that their suit to dissolve A&P is based on Judge Lindley's decision; while Judge Lindley himself says his decision could not be the basis for a suit of dissolution. In previous ads we told you about the cases against A&P which the anti-trust lawyers lost. We promised to tell you about this case they won. Here is the story of the Danville case.

What Judge Lindley Objected To

At Danville, the anti-trust lawyers made all of the charges which they are again making against A&P today. They were substantially the same charges they had made and dropped at Dallas, Texas, after four federal judges had objected to some of them as "inflammatory." In his decision, Judge Lindley was critical of some of our activities. He refused to make the charges out of court. He did not make any decision on others. He even took occasion to praise A&P for the efficient job of food distribution it had done.

What We Did To Correct This

In the light of the decision, we immediately set about reviewing our activities to be sure that there could never again be any criticism of our operations. First, the Atlantic Commission Company abandoned the dual role to which Judge Lindley objected and which he said was the basis of his decision against us. We did this even though the Atlantic Commission Company had been licensed for many years by the United States Department of Agriculture to act as both a buyer and seller of fresh fruits and vegetables.

What We Did To Correct This

In the light of the decision, we immediately set about reviewing our activities to be sure that there could never again be any criticism of our operations. First, the Atlantic Commission Company abandoned the dual role to which Judge Lindley objected and which he said was the basis of his decision against us. We did this even though the Atlantic Commission Company had been licensed for many years by the United States Department of Agriculture to act as both a buyer and seller of fresh fruits and vegetables.

Why, Then, Do They Want To Put A&P Out Of Business?

Ever since this suit was filed, the anti-trust lawyers have been making damaging statements that could seriously hurt our business if they were believed by the public. They say that we were found guilty at Danville of all the charges they are making today. This is not true. Judge Lindley did not sustain all of the charges of the anti-trust lawyers. Vets Summer School Notice

Director Ford Gives Details Under GI Bill Education Rights

Local veterans were advised today by Director Walter Ford of the Veterans Service Center, that if they are planning to attend summer school under the GI Bill they should start making necessary arrangements at once. "First," said Ford, "they should determine whether their VA certificate of eligibility is in order. And, if they are changing courses, they should learn from the school whether they will be required to undergo advisement and guidance. A veteran who is now in school and who intends to continue this summer in the same school, and the same course need merely register at his school. His present certificate of eligibility, on file with the VA, is sufficient. "But if the veteran wants to continue in a different school but at a different school, he should apply at once for a supplemental certificate of eligibility at his nearest VA office. On his application, he must list the name of the new school and name of course. The application should be sent to the nearest VA office having jurisdiction over his present school. "If the veteran plans to take a different course this summer, either in his present school or at another school, he will have to take a new certificate of eligibility. Ford emphasized that applications for supplemental and original certificates of eligibility must be submitted to the regional office by mail. There is no need, he said, for veterans to bring the applications to the VA in person. As a final step to be taken as soon as possible, Ford warned, veterans should make certain that the school they wish to attend has room for them. and how much credit they had paid up.)

2. Ten additional weeks of benefits for unemployment insurance to be paid to dependent children.

3. An increase in the maximum weekly benefit rate from \$24 to \$28 or \$30 and an increase in dependent allowances from \$2 per week for children to \$4 to \$5 a week. The committee also recommended that the age of dependent children be widened to include 18 years old instead of 16 years old only. The group also suggested double allowances for the first child.

4. Extension of the unemployment compensation program to employ employers of one or more persons. At present only employers of four or more persons are covered by the program. The committee believes that such an extension would benefit many more companies into the program and would affect about 40,000 workers.

5. Extended coverage to include self-employed persons. The committee recommended that a continued study be made to decide whether it would be advisable to extend coverage to employes of local government who are not receiving unemployment benefits.

6. Increase the "bonus allowance" for part-time unemployment from \$3 to \$4 a week.

7. Guarantee continuation of benefits to qualified job seekers who are unable to find work during their period of benefit collection. At present if a person receiving benefits becomes ill and unable to accept a job, the benefits cease.

The committee also made several recommendations for technical changes in the law to ease its administration.

To Save Laurel Growths In Bolton Notch Area

State Highway Commissioner G. Albert Hill has advised that construction work starts this summer with the rebuilding of the Bolton Notch intersection and overpass, a very small portion of the large laurel growth at the Notch will have to be removed. Commissioner Hill pledges that the plan for the intersection will be to replant the laurel, long a beauty spot in early summer, will not be damaged.

When plans first were announced for the rebuilding of the intersection, with extra lead-in roads and approaches, E. Malcolm Stannard of the Herald asked Commissioner Hill to consider the importance of the laurel growth at the Notch, and to do all possible to spare it. The Commissioner replied at that time that he would preserve the area.

In a letter today, he says that perhaps a very small part may have to be destroyed to permit building of the road, but that replanting will be done to make up for any wastage in the growth.

Finance Unit Of Army Hit By Probers

Armed Services committee will open an investigation of its own. The center, which handles family allotment for Army and Air Force personnel, employs 4,300 people. Since last May it has been under investigation by the subcommittee, the Civil Service Commission, the Army inspector general, the FBI and the General Accounting office.

Karst said he welcomed investigation by the Armed Services committee. He said there were phases more rightly in the province of that committee than in that of the Civil Service committee.

But he said his subcommittee would continue with its probing, which has already resulted in top personnel shifts at the center, to see that there is no "white-wash."

Karst said evidence indicates "Communist infiltration" of the center, the importance of which cannot be overemphasized. The records of the center show the disposition of American troops and their numbers, grades and types. The report relates that in the past three years 43 persons have been investigated as "security risks" and that 44 of them were fired or resigned while under investigation.

After the subcommittee began its digging it asked a check which turned up cases of three additional persons, of whom two were fired and one resigned. Karst said he believed there were still others on the payroll who shouldn't be.

The president added: "I am sure we will continue to welcome this opportunity just as we already have done in building Grand Coulee—just as the people already have done in Kobovank in large parts of Washington and Oregon, and in other sections of the country, where they have decided to distribute power through public bodies and co-operatives."

Benefits Must Not Be Diverted

"The benefits of public investment must be passed on to the people whose tax money is being used. Those benefits must not be diverted for private profit."

"We will continue to fight—and win—for that principle."

The president challenged the claims of those who attacked Grand Coulee as a waste of public funds, calling it a "colossal misstatement."

"The investment in the power facilities of Grand Coulee is being repaid right now and with interest," Mr. Truman contended.

And in a broader sense, the entire investment has already been repaid several times over in the increased national wealth it has brought.

"And over the next several years we shall begin to give the water on the land below here."

The president predicted "thousands of family-sized farms" will replace the present agribarns.
