### Education Board Sees Rise in School Budget

**Opening of Two New Buildings in the Fall Reason for Increase; Highlights of Meeting**

An increase in the school budget, prompted by the opening of the Verplanck and Bowers schools in the fall, was indicated last night as the Board of Education started preliminary study of the 1950-51 budget. The board is currently operating on a \$5,000,000 budget for the fiscal year ending August 31. By charter, the board must submit its appropriation requests to General Manager George H. Waddell by June 1.

The board also approved a report made by the Educational Policy Committee and incorporated six recommendations by Superintendent William E. Buckley presented to it. Buckley recommended that the board should act on the committee's suggestion that action on three of the proposals be deferred to another year when school expansion is not so numerous.

Three recommendations on which action was not postponed were: provision for which will include the addition of a director of maintenance program; a change in the custodial maintenance program; and the addition of a director of physical education.

At the present time, the report stated, the principal of each school has a cafeteria in charge of the operation of the cafeteria. The two new cafeterias which will be added by the opening of the Verplanck and Bowers schools will make a total of 10 lunch rooms operating next year, the board was told.

The engaging of a cafeteria director will allow the principals more time to devote to their school duties and will possibly effect savings in the purchasing phase of the lunchroom program, the report continued. Estimated salary need of such a position was set at \$2,500.00.

**Maintenance**

The board's communication calls for more differentiation between custodial care and repair of the school buildings. Under the new program, Business Manager Douglas E. Perdue will be in charge of the supervision of the janitorial force, and School Engineer Harold B. Hodge will be in charge of maintenance and repair.

The board also approved a recommendation to provide an additional physical education instructor.
