ing the results of a collective bargaining election yesterday amounting to \$75,000 for GE General Electric plants.

Leaders of both unions issued statements claiming victory. They were fighting for worker support over since the CIO kicked out the UE last fall on charges it is Communist tainted and started up the UE to take its place.

An unofficial tabulation of the "popular vote" in yesterday's last-ditch election to have barred every last two-thirds of the UE membership since the UE was expelled from the CIO.
