Tokyo, June 2.—(AP)—A top American official said today Occupation Headquarters had received Japanese reports of a plot to assassinate General MacArthur by the Red China mainland.

The plot story was told by a Japanese policeman. The source said the plot had arrested a Japanese who "apparently was a paranoiac"—a man who thinks everyone is against him.
