Russia that the emotions stirred up in this country by foreign policy debates do not indicate weakness in a democracy. He explained: "The democratic process is not always easy. It involves us in great public debates. Emotions are aroused and feelings run high. But when the shouting is ended, the decision is made. It is the resulting choice rests on the solid foundation of the common wisdom of the people." "Dictators and tyrants, who thought our attitude toward Russia indicated indecision and weakness, have found to their dismay that they are wrong. Those debates are a source of wisdom and a sign of strength."

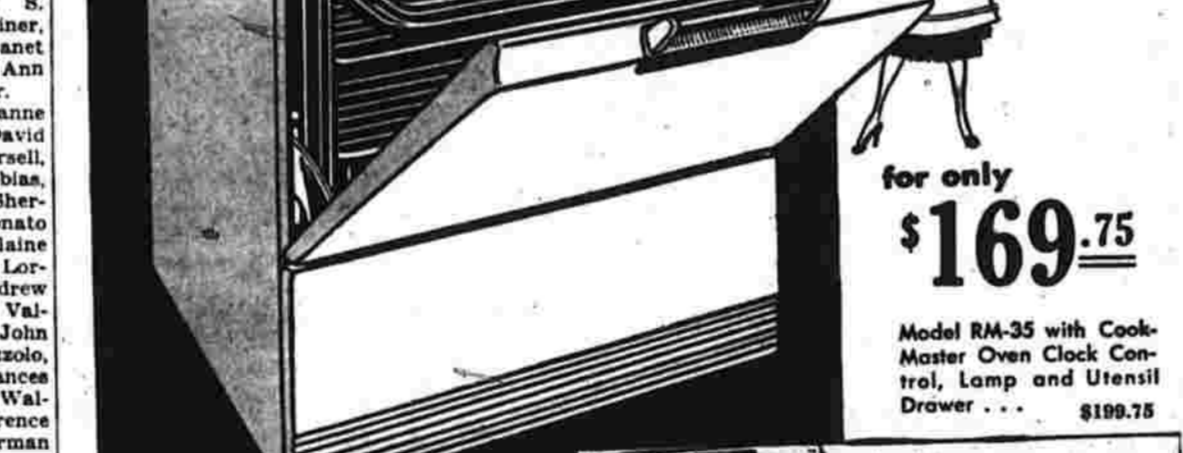
