"at least one booting ring operating on a large scale and smaller rings delivering colored oleomargarine to the butter market."  
When Congress voted to end taxes on margarine this year, it set up a rigid set of regulations intended to make sure that housewives, consumers and patrons of public eating places will know when they are buying colored oleomargarine.  
Eating places which use this product must post signs saying so, and each serving must be triangular in shape or labeled as margarine.  
Similarly all manufacturers, wholesalers and retailers must identify colored margarine and package it so that it cannot be confused with butter.  
"Will Be Head To Drive" Officials said the "expected bootlegging" will be tough to detect and prosecute successfully.  
They said they hope to make use of experience gained in breaking up of a fake olive oil ring near New York City in 1948. This ring was selling olive oil in a mixture of inexpensive vegetable oil, some olive oil and a chemical.  
"This was an undercover operation which in the course of 18 months perpetrated a fraud of at least a million dollars," one official testified. He added that it took months of stouthing to catch 16 individuals and seven firms and bring them to court.  
"The incentive for bootlegging shatters is just as great as, if not greater than, the incentive for putting out fake olive oil," he said.  
**FDA Plans Checks** The Food and Drug Administration said it planned these checks:  
1. A visit twice a year to all manufacturers of oleomargarine. There were 60 of them, but the number is expected to expand greatly with the license and tax-act.  
2. A check on 4,000 wholesalers and distributors, or about one in five of the estimated 20,000

day with prospects of speedy approval. But McKellar and others objected and a vote was ordered put off until next Wednesday. The House approved it last May 4.

**Blight Hits Birch Trees; Noticeable in This Area**

Thousands of blighted birch trees, their leaves brown and dry, seemed to attack other types of trees.

So far the birch blight has not spread across the Connecticut countryside this year. Every hillside is pocked by the affected birches, some of which seem to be dying. It is said that a controlling spray has not been developed to check the blight, but in the woodland areas it is not likely that much protective work can be done. The birches, except for their occasional value as fuel, or for some slight use of the wood in such things as spoils, have no other commercial value to make protection worth while.

**Convention Results**  
 Throughout the rank and file membership of the Republican party in Connecticut, there has been in recent months, a growing conviction that the party will have to be reorganized. This conviction has been in order to achieve a real chance at the polls next November.

The Republican State Convention just concluded at New Haven gave some good answers to this need and this demand.

One answer was contained in the party platform, which is the freshest and most invigorating document Republican thought has produced in Connecticut in generations. It is a platform which strikes boldly forward in that same realm of legislation which the Democrats like to consider their own pet preserve.

It is a platform which strikes equally boldly at some of the political institutions—like the county form of government—which Republican politicians have liked to consider their private pastures.

A second answer was provided by the ticket nominated by the convention. The ticket was chosen in the midst of healthy, spirited contest, in which the pre-convention organization leadership of the party both won and lost with its candidate for governor and with its candidate for attorney general.

But the composite ticket which resulted in present appearance, comprises a balance of political talents and abilities, and can be counted upon to make a stir upon the Connecticut political scene.

The answer to the party's need in the organizational importance of the outcome of the convention test for the nomination of attorney general. The defeat of Attorney General William L. Hadden represented, in fact, a protest from the convention delegates against the presumed domination of party affairs by the combination of Mr. Hadden and Paul Mitchell, can National Committeeman Harold Mitchell, and the outgoing nomination of one of the partners in this combination represented the effort of the convention delegates, at least, to allow a more enlightened and respected leadership to come to the top.

These three developments, or trends, add up to a revitalization of the Republican party which, if it continues through the campaign, promises the party a clean shot at victory in November.

**Curley's "Sabbatical"**  
 Former Mayor James M. Curley, returning from Europe, announces himself ready to run for Mayor of Boston. He has, he said, with a bland insistence on his travels and his previous stay at a certain federal institution in Danbury, completed his "sabbatical."

That apparently means that he is willing and ready to assume his Boston professorship of crooked political economy. And, for all we know, the people of Boston may be anxious to have him again.

We cannot accede, however, to his appropriation of the term "sabbatical" to describe his own temporary absence from office. The "sabbatical" is a vacation given to college professors in the expectation that they will use it to improve their minds and equip themselves for better teaching in the future. So far as we can discover, Mayor Curley has in no way improved himself during his vacation.

**Permanent Job**  
 New York City's water authorities continue to have it both ways.

To all inquiries, protests, and requests for a cessation of their rambling efforts, they reply that Dr. Wallace K. Howell, their professional rainmaker, has absolutely no power to turn good weather into bad weather.

At the same time, however, they are paying him \$100 a day to make it rain when it wouldn't rain otherwise.

They argue, vehemently, that all the rain that has fallen has been natural rain.

But they refuse to give up Dr. Howell's services.

It must be that he has become a kind of superstitious for them. They don't quite believe in him, any more than some people really believe in superstitious individual habits. But they hate to give him up, just the same. We would guess that he has, therefore, a permanent job making the rain do what it pleases.

**Checkerboard Country**  
 In this country, Southerners will tell people from the North that they would feel differently on racial questions if they themselves lived in the South in the position of a white minority.

And the Southerners themselves would probably feel more extreme in their own view if they happened to live in South Africa, where the minority situation is in itself more extreme, and the cultural and educational gulf between races wider.

Such feelings cannot be changed overnight. They cannot be blown away by some eloquent and impassioned argument. And it is far easier to tell what is not a solution for the problem involved than it is to point a long-term solution.

What is now being done in South Africa is not a solution. There, the representatives of some 2,000,000 white people are passing a law dictating that some 10,000,000 non-white people shall live in restricted areas of the country. The measure now going through the South African Parlia-
