food industry Saturday night, however, with the walkout of wholesale bakery workers in Los Angeles. They left their jobs in support of a demand for a 35-hour week. The striking bakers make about 80 per cent of the bread sold in Southern California stores.

Terms Effective Sept. 1

The new terms become effective Sept. 1 and the approximately 1,650 strikers were expected to be back on normal deliveries tomorrow or Wednesday. An emergency plan under which milk was supplied to infants, hospitals and other public institutions had been in effect during the strike.

Lake Longshoremen Strike

A strike of longshoremen at four Lake Erie ports in Ohio brought coal and ore shipping to a standstill, and a walkout of 600 open hearth men in Bethlehem Steel company's Johnstown, Pa., plant threatened a shutdown which would bring 16,000 other workers out of their jobs this week to about 200,000 strikers at their national convention.

Settlement in Washington

The settlement in Washington gave the dairy workers an average 1-1/2 day week at the same rate of pay they had received for six days and the dairies withdrew their proposal to close their plants on Sundays. The drivers tested the Sunday closing with the contention that it would cause them to lose customers and commissions.

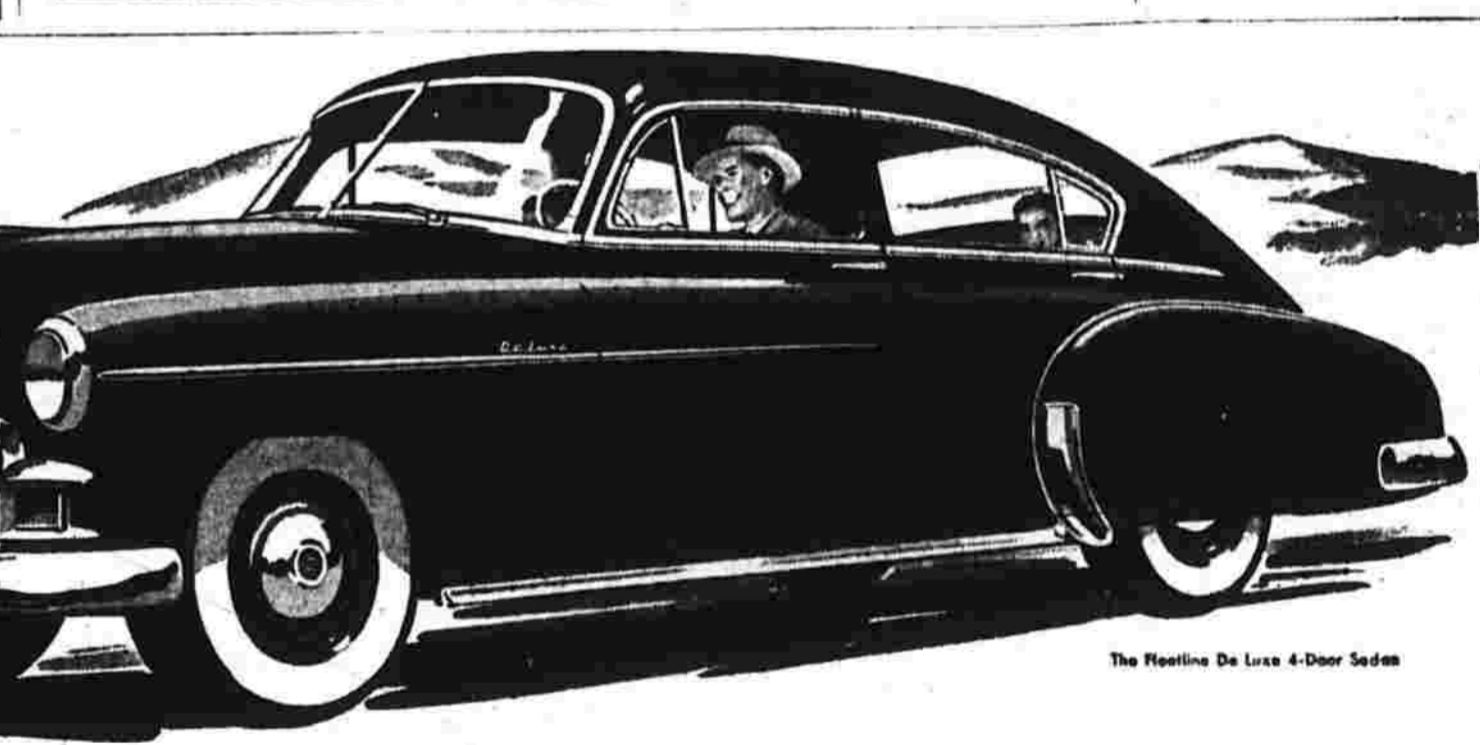

Report of State G. O. P. Committee on Policy

Editor's Note: This is the fourth section of the report of the Republican Policy Committee, which was made the basis for the 1950 Republican State Platform adopted at New Haven Thursday night. A fifth and final section of the report will be published in a future edition of the Herald.

Education

It is vital to the development of a vigorous and useful citizenry that no political party should neglect its proper function unless it devotes itself to constant improvement of the educational system within the limits of the ability of the State and the communities to finance the program. In Connecticut we want no federal control of education.

The cost of education is borne by the people through taxes paid either directly to the municipalities or to the State. Many of our communities, limited by law to a certain property tax, have reached the limit of the financial burden they can carry. The State must therefore continue to assume a share of the expense of education in order to distribute the burden fairly among all groups of taxpayers. This must be done and the State must be prepared to meet the needs of the local communities of the State in the conduct of their schools. Control of education must be kept close to the people.

Embarrassing Proposal

On the other hand, Western Europe may think the Russian proposal is real. And it may be real. It is embarrassing because it catches us between our practice to Europe and our own need to dispose of surplus grain of our own.

In our preaching to Europe, we have urged Western Europe to do two things. We have urged it to produce more for itself. It has also been our long-range theoretical policy to create a free world market in Western Europe and Eastern Europe.

Therefore, we ought to welcome a proposal which would help make Europe more self-sufficient. The catch comes in the fact that we ourselves are engaged in selling surplus grain to Europe. The surplus grain we have even sent one western European country from buying grain from another western European country. The surplus grain we have been purchased from us.

Russia's proposal to supply the rest of Europe with grain would tie in with all our theory for the European economy. But it would abolish a convenient market for American grain products.

Russian propaganda is already emphasizing this and such emphasis indicates that Russia may have made the proposal just to embarrass us in our dealings with the other hand, we do have to make an answer on the proposal. We do have to choose between theory and having a convenient market for our surplus grain. We refuse to choose for immediate use funds already appropriated for further expansion of the university's facilities in a flagrant disregard of the present administration. We propose the prompt allocation of funds already appropriated for these facilities as a sorely needed.

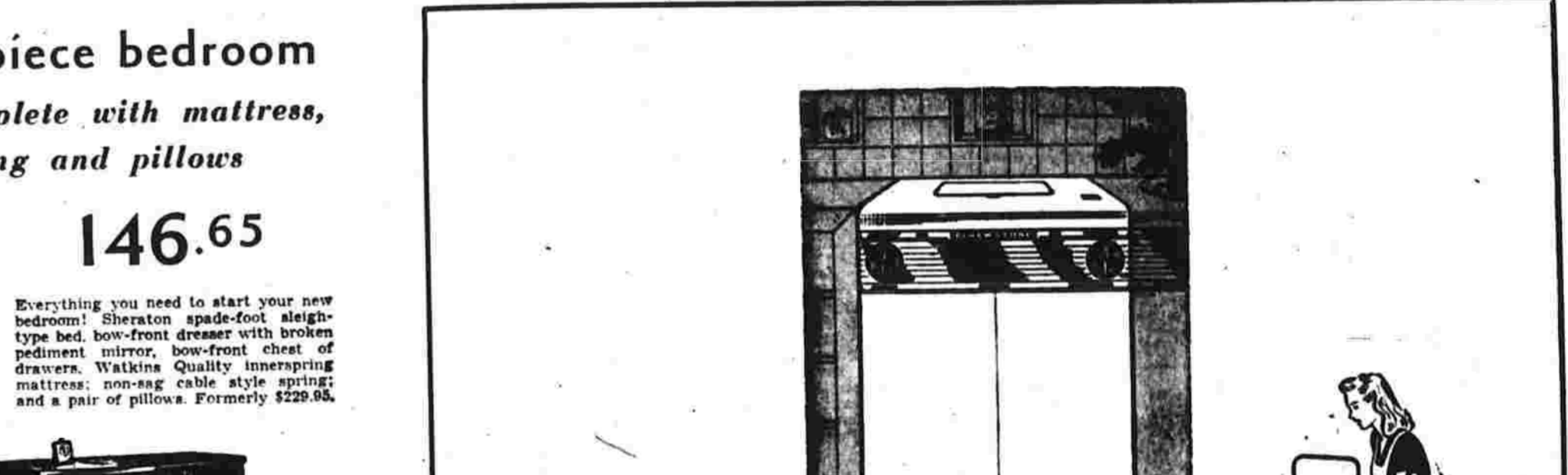

Six Nations Launch Campaign to Abolish Wars From Europe

Open Historic Conference on Pooling Production of Coal and Steel; Schuman Hails Franco-German Unity; Holds Out Hope Britain May Join Pact; Says "We Can't Fail"

Paris, June 20.—(AP)—Six Western European nations opened an historic conference today aimed at pooling their coal and steel production.

French Foreign Minister Robert Schuman, in a speech, set out the plan, to lead the delegates to the ultimate aim was to abolish war from the continent of Europe.

Britain remained on the sidelines, although she will be kept informed of what goes on in the elaborate Salon de l'Horloge (Clock Room) of the French Foreign Ministry. There was some talk that the British were coming to the view that the advantages of joining the plan might outweigh the disadvantages.

Schuman told delegates of France, Western Germany, Belgium, Italy, the Netherlands and Luxembourg that there would be great political benefits in a plan which stems from a Franco-German understanding.

"It is our desire to associate in a common and permanent work of peace and unity which for centuries have fought one another in bloody conflicts," the French Foreign Minister said.

By welding Germany and France together in this common effort, Schuman said, the nations would provide the "certainty" that has been missing from the European community a latent cause of trouble, suspicion and anguish.

On this basis, then, the nations could erect "a solid European edifice accessible to all nations of good will."
