**Anti-Red, Pro World War**  
 Three sections of the resolutions adopted by the Kiwanis convention in Miami were especially hard hitting. Each was, in its way, an expression of typical Americanism. One concerned what we shall do with our Communist neighbors. The second concerned what we shall do with our Communist agents. The third concerned what we should do with the world as the great political gift from its own heritage and successful experimentation.  
 Surviving the Kiwanis of today we may do ourselves, the Kiwanis delegates, representing 3,000 clubs in the United States, Canada, Alaska and Hawaii, charged this:  
 "Gradually, but inexorably, we are being led—perhaps unconsciously—toward the state of affairs. Witness the growing power of government over the people; the expansion and waste in government; the increasing burden; the substitution of an artificial economy for a natural economy; the assumption by the state of financial responsibility for the health and welfare of every man being; the arraying of economic and social groups one against the other; and the continuing increase of government into the fields of private enterprise."  
 "Therefore be it resolved by the delegates assembled in this Thirty-fifth Annual Convention of Kiwanis International that we vigorously emphasize our belief in and support of the free enterprise system; that we condemn the efforts of individuals and groups that would have us substitute state socialism for our present system of government."  
 The resolution on Communism charged that that doctrine "seeks to undermine free enterprise, destroy individual initiative, deny the right of free speech, and banish religion. . . to distort the mind of our youth and to destroy righteousness, patriotism and good will which are fundamental to the growth of liberty loving peoples. . . to corrupt the education of the youth of America, basically affecting the moral precepts of the enabling objects and objectives which we of Kiwanis International cherish and promote."  
 "It is resolved that Kiwanis International reaffirms its belief in and support of a representative form of government and our way of life and we denounce Communism as opposed thereto, and that, through every vigilance, liberty may be preserved, and forces which seek to undermine and destroy us as a free people be not permitted to exist anywhere throughout our great nation."  
 Finally, the Kiwanis convention adopted a resolution on the subject of "World Peace" which stands as a classic example of the kind of political thinking America must do for the world.  
 "Whereas, the resolution states, 'history shows that peace is the product of law and order, and that law and order are the products of government, and that world peace can only be achieved by world order, under international law, and . . ."  
 "Whereas, the peoples of the United States of America and Canada, while now enjoying peace and security under the laws of their local, state, provincial and federal governments, deeply desire the guarantee of world peace, and . . ."  
 "Whereas, the United Nations
