Lie Questions U. N. Nations On Korea Aid

(Continued From Page One) A spokesman for the American delegation made it plain the United States rejected Russia's contention that the Soviet-beyotted North Korean government is an illegitimate government.

Lake Success, June 29.—Secretary-General Trygve Lie and his top aides are sounding out United Nations members on how far they will go in trying to stop the Korean conflict.

This was disclosed officially last night before Russia informed Lie that it considers sanction action by the Security Council illegal.

Lie already had sent all governments copies of the resolution adopted Tuesday night by the Soviet-beyotted council.

Yugoslavia voted against it. Egypt and India did not participate because they did not have instructions from home.

The resolution did not set up any procedure for finding out what it is available to carry out recommendations that all U. N. members furnish assistance to repel the Communist Korean invasion of South Korea.

Contacts Russia Lie and his aides contacted half a dozen countries, including Russia, in private talks with delegations yesterday. They would not specify what delegations they contacted.

It was known that Andrew W. Cordier, Lie's executive assistant, visited Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Jakob A. Malik at the United States State Department in New York. U. N. officials would not say whether the Korean problem was discussed.

Lie first considered, then delayed, sending telegrams to all members asking them to report in writing what they would do. No one here expected Russian participation in anti-Communist operations but there was interest in what the Soviet answer would be.

Says Vote Illegal Russia has been boycotting the Security Council since last January in protest against the presence of Nationalist China. Its ambassador said that the vote of the Chinese Nationalist delegate Tuesday night was illegal.

The Soviet government official said that the U. N. charter specifies that all five permanent members of the council—the U. S., Britain, France, Russia and China—must concur in any resolution to make it legal. It said that the absence of both Russia and China from the session nullified the council's action.

There has been no indication here that Moscow has answered Washington's direct note asking Russia to call the North Korean invasion an illegal act. The Soviet government representative in the North Korean capital, Pyongyang, said that the U. N. is an illegitimate organization.

French Foreign Office spokesman in Paris said their own belief is to keep Communists down in Indochina but make it difficult to give material aid in the Korean conflict.

Holland has indicated it may furnish a token naval force. Members of the highly-secret U. N. military staff committee also boycotted by Russia—were reported agreed that the American position in Korea now is General MacArthur's responsibility. The committee is made up of five big powers in the Security Council.

If other U. N. members throw large amounts of weapons, ships and men into the fighting, the committee will be asked to recommend a last-ditch scrap or withdrawal from the Korean peninsula.

In effect, it packs power in a host of small rural counties where Talmadge traditionally is strong. Populous Fulton County (Atlanta), for example, with six units, has one unit for about 10,000 voters. Rural two-unit Chattahoochee counties as much as 122 voters in Fulton.

It would deny government jobs or passports to Communists and impose heavy penalties for violations.

Mundt and Ferguson appeared at the closed-door G. O. P. policy session to win backing of that group for consideration.

Close Korea War "The climate is certainly conducive for Congressional passage of this right now," Mundt told reporters.

"If we are using our boys to die fighting in Korea and other areas we certainly should protect them from subversion behind their backs here at home."

Ferguson said the measure would handle Communists and all subversives in the American way, with public records and hearings and full access to the courts.

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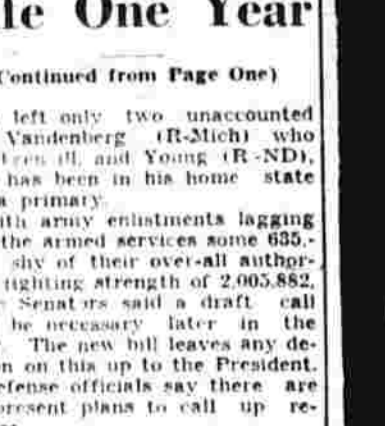
