the number of hundreds of pupils related to children who can be "seen and heard" in Manchester. Today's estimate of the number of pupils is based on a higher figure than is generally accepted as standard.

Pupil Distribution

"To date the increase in school population has been remarkably uniform throughout the Town. The absolute increase in numbers of children does not yet reflect fully the amount of new building which has gone on in the Oldfield street and Princeton street districts since many of the families in these new homes do not yet have children of school age. For example, the enrollment in the general 'west side' of the Town (west of McKee street and Broad street) has increased by only about 400 pupils since 1945.

"All evidence points to continued building and hence continued migration to Manchester. Although the town is not as densely populated as it was in 1945, the migration pattern will continue unchanged. However, these houses are small as to disorganize large families, so the birth rate may diminish as the mothers grow older and as the proportion of families in this type of house increases.

"At present, nearly 40 per cent of the dwelling units in Manchester have been built and occupied within the past decade, and are almost all owned and occupied by the middle class. This situation, unusual in this area, tends to stabilize the population. The fact that the houses will be occupied by ten or fifteen year olds, and will contribute to the growth of the school population, especially in the western part of town, is a factor of importance in the school planning decisions that may be made in town.

"The time that has elapsed since the presentation of the study of all interested residents, for the following reasons:

"Previous studies of population and school enrollment have been made by the undersigned as of June, 1945, and January, 1946. The population trends have changed significantly since these earlier reports. The population in 1945 was 10,000 and the school situation has been greatly affected by the construction of two new schools.

"However, the nature and magnitude of the present changes are relatively little. The Town's population has increased by 10 per cent in the past decade, and the enrollment is growing rapidly, and there is a significant deficiency in the amount of school space available.

"To demonstrate the nature of the problem it should be sufficient to point out a few salient facts: (1) Since 1943 the elementary school enrollment has increased by 10 per cent. (2) During the past decade the enrollment of the total school enrollment will increase by 10 per cent. (3) The capacity of the Princeton Street school.

Background Data

"This rapid increase in school population is by no means unique to Manchester. It is a nationwide phenomenon somewhat more extreme in Manchester than in other places for easily identifiable reasons. Some of the factors which are probably worth noting are:

"The only factors which significantly affect public school enrollment in a place like Manchester are: (1) The birth rate. (2) The death rate of children. (3) The migration of children into or out of the area of children of school or pre-school age. (4) The proportion of children of school age who attend public schools.

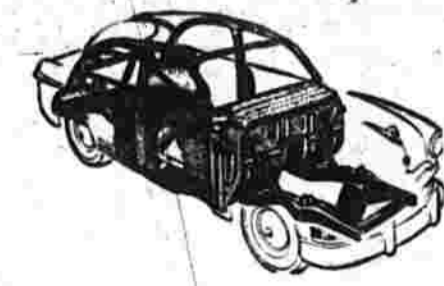

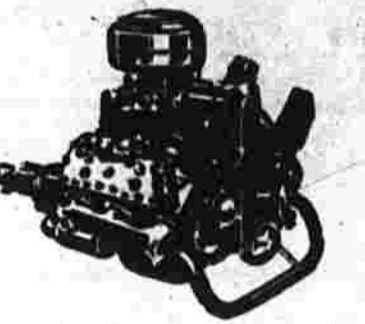
