Small Nation Opportunity
 Throughout the existence of the
 United Nations, the smaller na-
 tions of the world have been much
 more interested in strengthening
 that organization and giving it
 the real status of a limited world
 government than have the bigger
 nations.

The two biggest opponents of
 increased power for the United
 Nations, Russia and the United States,
 have been, on occasion, forgetful
 of their own past in the Korean
 peninsula to lean together against
 proposals which would have im-
 paired their own great power
 positions inside the United Na-
 tions.

This situation has now been
 changed. The United States, by
 its policy in the Korean situation,
 has symbolically accepted a higher
 authority for the UN. We
 have turned to the UN where we
 previously ignored it.

Now it is our turn to turn to
 the UN, and our own actions in
 serving as UN policemen
 in Korea seem foolish this UN.
 This being the situation, it is
 obviously the opportune time for
 all the smaller nations who have
 always wanted a stronger UN to
 rally around the new concept of
 the United Nations which has now
 been established. The new con-
 cept is of a world organization
 which actually assumes the legal
 power and which actually carries
 out its obligation to halt aggression.
 This new concept is an organization
 which will actually bring the world
 under a rule of law.

The smaller nations of the
 world now have their opportunity
 to harden this concept and make
 it permanent. They have their
 opportunity to say, "Yes, the
 United Nations is now this kind
 of organization, and we support
 it as such."

Their opportunity is presented
 to them, first, in very tangible
 form. It comes to them in the
 formal request of UN Secretary-
 General Trygve Lie for the smaller
 nations to take part in the fighting
 in Korea.

This is their opportunity, at na-
 tional effort and sacrifice, to
 create a being that international
 police force these smaller nations
 have always favored. This is
 their opportunity to ratify the
 new role of the UN as the actual
 keeper of world law and order. If
 they really want a stronger UN,
 this is their time to prove it.

So far, a number of nations,
 including some who have already
 sent planes and naval ships to
 Korea, have replied by promising
 themselves, unable to furnish
 ground troops because the ground
 troops they have are otherwise
 tied down or needed for security
 in fields even more vital than
 Korea.

This claim, it should be under-
 stood, is professional and
 United States diplomatic and mil-
 itary authorities. Military speak-
 ing, we would indeed rather have
 these forces kept where they are,
 rather than have them sent to
 Korea.

But, as should be very obvious,
 there is more than one way to
 carry out a strategy involved. And
 we think that even those nations
 who fully committed elsewhere
 should still make at least some
 effort to have their flag car-
 ried aloft in the United Nations
 flag and the United States flag in
 the ground fighting in Korea.
 In such symbolism there would
 be a new collective strength, and
 a new prestige for the United Na-
 tions which, we think, would more
 than compensate for some slight
 military weakness elsewhere.
