**Chronic Disease, Illness Pose Complex Problems**

Hartford, Aug. 22—Those who seriously consider chronic disease and illness are humble in the face of a problem so widespread and complex. It involves practically all fields of medicine and reaches deeply into the social sciences. It is a burden on the economic life of the community as well as a source of suffering and hardship in the home. Among the aged it has come to be accepted as the natural consequence of prolonged life. However, it is a fallacy to think that chronic diseases are limited to the old and decrepit. It has been estimated that half the cases are under the age of forty-five, and sixteen per cent are less than twenty-five years of age. Chronic disease, then, may become manifest during infancy, childhood or old age.

The extensive impact of chronic diseases on each citizen as an individual and a taxpayer can be

proper therapy in the control of cancer have already been illustrated in practice in this state through the cardiac register. The ability of the cardiac patient to live a full and adequate life after adjustment to the limitations imposed by his disease is also common knowledge. Last, there is a misconception from the emphasis on mortality. It should be stated that chronic diseases are not always direct causes of death; often they are cause of disability before death from some other cause intervenes. Thus, two groupings of the most common disease diagnosis can be made: 1. Formerly, chronic diseases virtually uncontrollable. It is true that many are still hopeless, but with the continuing new advances in medicine the picture is and will continue to grow brighter. A recent tabulation of sixty-six chronic diseases exclusive of cancer and specific diseases of the heart classified one-fourth as largely controllable, one-half as partially controllable, and one-fourth as uncontrollable. The advantages of early, accurate diagnosis and prompt,

to alleviate human suffering. Thus, the basic method of approach in prevention and prophylaxis. The key tools are health education and case finding. The Connecticut State Department of Health believes that its contribution to this problem can be stated in six objectives: 1. Through education to modify society's attitude that chronic disease and illness are hopeless problems. 2. Through leadership to stimulate in every locality a well-rounded plan for the control of chronic disease and illness. 3. Through prevention to avoid the loss of health, man power, and productivity presently sacrificed to chronic disease and illness. 4. Through research to define some of the problems arising from chronic disease and illness. 5. Through coordination to conduct from specific advances of science and sociology a generalized program designed to prevent the extension of existing chronic disease and illness. 6. Through cooperation to develop with other agencies a common approach to the needs of the chronically ill, aged and infirm.

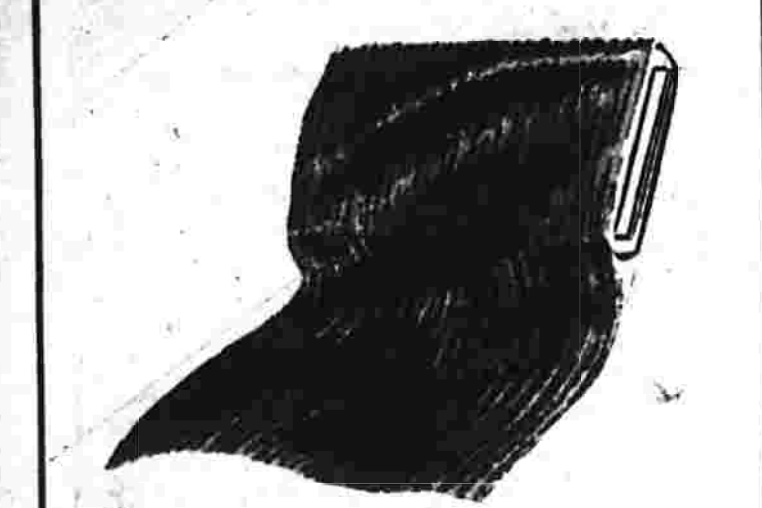

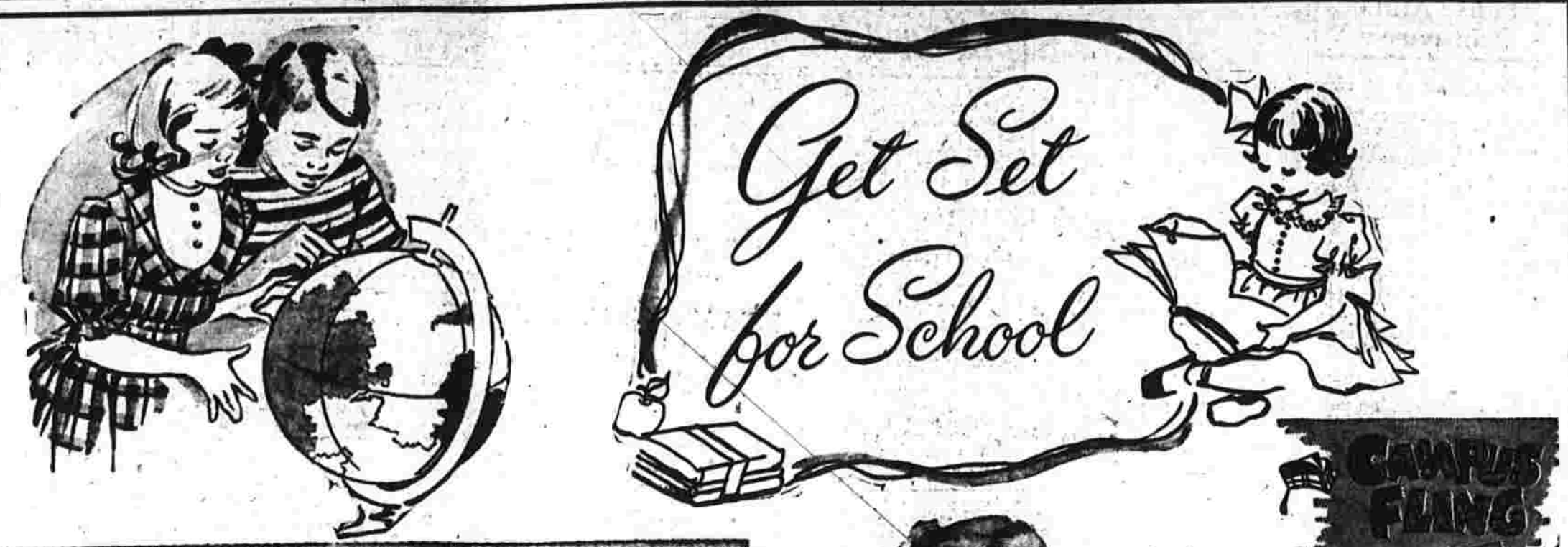
