Release Nazi Tycoon From Landsberg Jail

Friedrich Flick, Hitlerite Steel Tycoon, Freed On Good Behavior in Company of 18 Others

Landsberg, Germany, Aug. 25.—(AP)—Friedrich Flick, convicted Nazi war criminal scurried out of prison today today—freed for good behavior.

"Go away! Get out!" shouted Flick at newsmen and photographers as he raced through a driving rain to his waiting car.

The release of the 19 was the biggest single act of war criminal releases since the United States began operating the big prison here, where Hitler drafted his "Mein Kampf".

Under New Rules

They had served two-thirds of their original sentences and were freed under relaxed regulations increasing time off for good conduct. All but one had been sentenced to seven years imprisonment for war crimes.
