# **Drafts Zone Rules** To Help Business,

The Town Planning Commis ion today formally announced a respective revision of Manchesr zoning regulations, aimed at meeting two widely recognized town needs, the provision of more acilities for industry and busines ind the protection of residential

tone values.

Details of the revision will be made public within a few days. and that will be followed by a ublic hearing at which supporter and opponents of the proposed hanges will be heard. Three Business Areas

rospective revision is to include the creation of three classifications of business zone, as compared to one general business zone now, and is to require the provision of off-street parking facilities for all new business structures in Manchester. It its proposed residential zone changes, which the Commission points out will affect mainly out lying sections as yet undeveloped, since practically all centrally lo-

cated land areas have already been developed, the Commission pro-poses changes in front footage reuirements, lot area requirements, nd floor space requirements. In the Rural zone, the front footage requirement would be re-duced from 150 to 100 feet and he total lot area from 22,500 to Front Foot Increase In the AA Residential zone the

Front footage requirement would be increased from 80 to 100 feet. and the lot area from 12,000 to 15,000 square feet, while floor area requirement would be increased from 750 to 850 square feet for the ground floor and from 1,100 to 1,250 for the total floor area. In the A Residential zone, the ont footage requirement would a increased from 70 to 90 feet, and the lot area from 8,400 to 0,800 square feet. The formal announcement e Town Planning Commission

"The Town Planning Commision announces that they are now ready to present for public hear ing certain proposed changes in the Zoning regulations. In addition seen reclassified and some addit nges will shortly be published changes will shortly be published in detail, along with a map show-ing changes in Business and In-dustrial zones.

"A study of the planning and soning set-up in Manchester has been going on since the first of the

year by a joint committee of three members from the Board of Directors and the Planning Commission.

A series of informal public hearings was held during January and February, which the public was asked to attend and make suggestions. Since that time, a complet study of the regulations has been made by the committee and cer tain changes proposed. Dr. Shurt-leff has worked in conjunction with the commission regarding the drafting of the regulations. 'The Commission itself has reviewed the residence business and industrial zones in Manchester and is bringing forth some proposals

for change.
"Manchester has been one of the fastest growing towns, if not the fastest, in New England during the past decade. We have had, and are continuing to have this tremendous residential expansion which has created many problems, such as schools, water, sewers, and other municipal services, of which we are all aware. It all simmers down to the one big question which interests everyone-taxes. More indus try and business would seem to be the answer.
