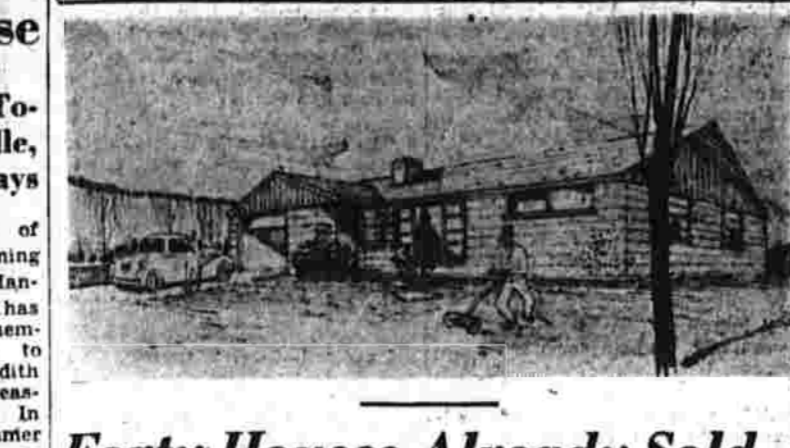

Business Zone Extended Here

Town Planning Commission Announces the Changes Made

Effective September 6 the business zone on the south side of Center street westerly to a point 100 feet easterly and parallel to Carol Drive will be extended, according to a report made at a public hearing held July 7 in the Municipal building.

The area is bounded on the north by Oloott street, on the east by the present business zone, and on the west by a line parallel and 100 feet easterly of Carol Drive.

Extension of the business zone at this location was sought by Alvin Jarvis. The town has recommended such a change for some time so that Adams street can be extended through to Hartford road, giving the west end of town a through way north and south, extending the business zone here is expected to make possible the addition of the town to acquire land from Jarvis to extend Adams street in the first phase of a proposed extension of the street.

Hartford, Aug. 30—(AP)—Connecticut will have a record potato crop this year, as it had last year, the State Agriculture department has forecast.

The department has forecast that growing conditions have been "almost ideal" this year for the potato crop. The problem should be deferred to the next regular legislative session beginning in January, 1951.

G. O. P. leaders said House Majority Leader George C. Conway (R., Guilford) refused that viewpoint in a comment on the Governor's proclamation last night.

Drafts Zone Rules To Help Business, Guard Home Values

Town Planning Commission Announces Proposed Revision in Regulations to Meet Two Pressing Needs; Hearing Next Month

The Town Planning Commission today formally announced a proposed revision of Manchester zoning regulations, aimed at meeting two widely recognized needs, the provision of more facilities for industry and business and the protection of residential zone values.

Details of the revision will be made public within a few days, and that will be followed by a public hearing at which supporters and opponents of the proposed changes will be heard.

Three Business Areas
The prospective revision is to include the creation of three classifications of business zone, as compared to one general business zone now, and to require the provision of off-street parking facilities for all new business structures in Manchester.

Front Foot Increase
In the AA Residential zone the front footage requirement would be increased from 80 to 100 feet, and the lot area from 12,000 to 15,000 square feet, while floor area requirement would be increased from 700 to 850 square feet for the ground floor and from 1,100 to 1,250 for the total floor area.

Commission Announcement
The formal announcement by the Town Planning Commission follows:

"The Town Planning Commission announces that it has now ready to present for public hearing certain proposed changes in the zoning regulations. In addition to this, all business zones have been reclassified and some additional zones added for both Business and Industry. All of these changes will shortly be published in detail, along with a map showing changes in Business and Industrial zones.

"A study of the planning and zoning set-up in Manchester has been going on since the first of the year by a joint committee of three members from the Board of Directors and the Planning Commission. A series of informal public hearings was held during January and February, which the public was asked to attend and make suggestions. Since that time a complete study of the regulations has been made by the committee and certain changes proposed. Dr. Shurtliff has worked in conjunction with the commission regarding the drafting of the regulations.

"The Commission itself has reviewed the residence, business and industrial zones in Manchester and is bringing forth some proposals for change.

Manchester has been one of the fastest growing towns in not only the state, but in New England during the past decade. We have had, and are continuing to have, the tremendous residential expansion which has created many problems, such as schools, water, sewers, and other municipal services, of which we are all aware. It all seems to be the one big question which interests everyone—taxes. More industry and business would seem to be the answer.

"The Commission is striving to keep Manchester the attractive town it has been. Here are some of the urgent needs we have found, and the following proposals are being made:

to Charter Oak Street and Depot Square at North End.
"Off-street parking will apply to all three business zones."
"Practically all land areas centrally located in Manchester have very little Residence AA and A zones which have not been developed. There still is much land available in the outlying rural districts for development. So that the density of the population may be controlled and also to attract future home owners to Manchester, these changes are being proposed in the front footage and area of lots in the Rural, Residence AA and A zones:
Rural — Front Footage 100 ft.; area 20,000 ft. AA Zone — Front Footage 100 ft.; area 10,000 ft. A Zone — Front Footage 80 ft.; area 10,000 ft.

"Also an increase in the living quarters for a residence in the AA zone to a minimum area of 800 sq. ft. ground floor, total area 1,250 sq. ft.
"No change is proposed in the floor areas in Rural and Residence A zones of minimum 750 sq. ft. ground floor and 1,100 sq. ft. total. A complete statement covering all changes will appear in this paper at least fifteen (15) days prior to date of Public Hearing. It is planned to hold a Public Hearing the first part of September."
