State Housing Plan Won't End in Red, Claims Loshbough

State Capitol, Hartford, Sept. 8.—(P)—Bernard E. Loshbough, State Housing administrator, challenged today the contention that the state housing program designed to be self-supporting, eventually will run into a deficit. That contention was made yesterday at a public hearing before the Legislature's Finance committee on proposals to expand the state's \$85,000,000 program by Harold W. Smith, Waterbury, a spokesman for the Savings and Loan League of Connecticut.

Higher interest rates on short-term borrowings, contended Smith, will increase the costs of the present program to the point that the state general fund will be called on to wipe out a deficit. Loshbough, testifying today as the committee resumed its hearing, denied that was so.

Presently, Loshbough asserted that there was "no financial danger to the housing structure."

He pointed out that the program presented a point by point reply to some of the objections raised to the program at yesterday's hearing. He stated that the housing program is entirely self-supporting and will continue to be so.

DeWey Vows to Battle For Re-election on Every Street Corner; Lynch Hits "Record"

Albany, N. Y., Sept. 8.—(P)—A political slugfest shaped up today in New York State with Governor Thomas E. Dewey promising to battle for re-election "on every street corner" and Democratic challenger, "Wall Street candidate" at him.

Dewey's fight against Fair Deal Congressman Walter A. Lynch appeared to have been a foregone conclusion.

DeWey came out swinging last night when he attacked Lynch's campaign for re-election in 1948.

DeWey gave his decision at the polls November 7. They incidentally has been referred to the U. S. Senate and Senate Committee on Governmental Organization.

DeWey charged that American troops had been sent to Korea "unauthorized, un-authorized, and some . . . only partly authorized."

He declared that "we will not support any military action that is incompetent in the national government."

Lynch, accepting the Democratic nomination, said he would not support any military action that is incompetent in the national government.

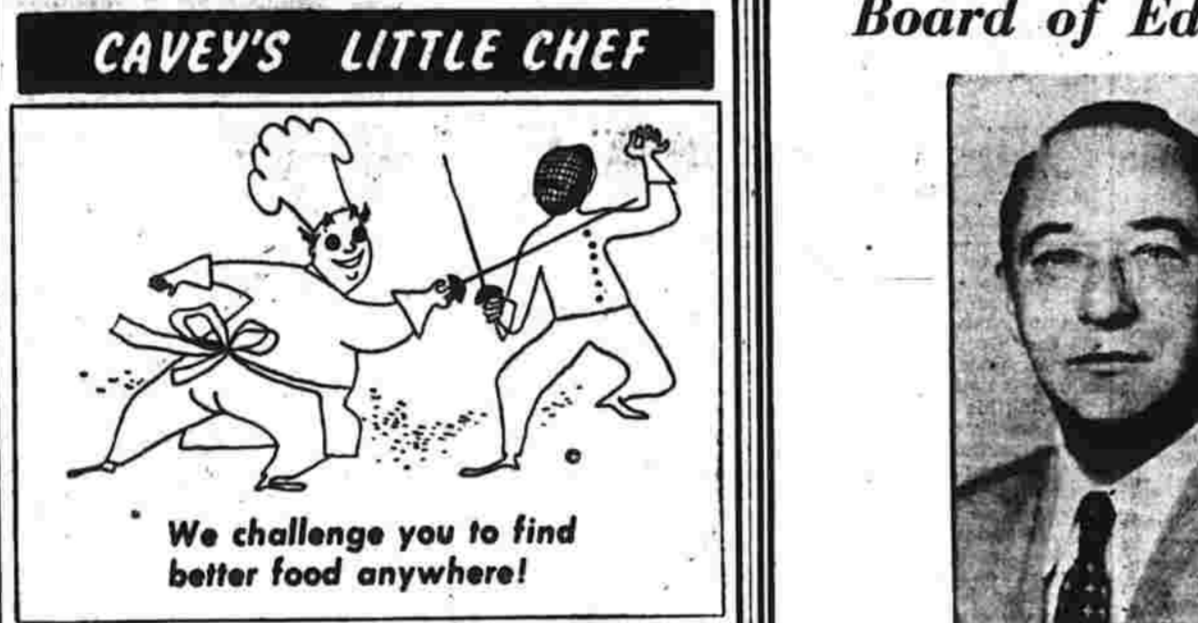

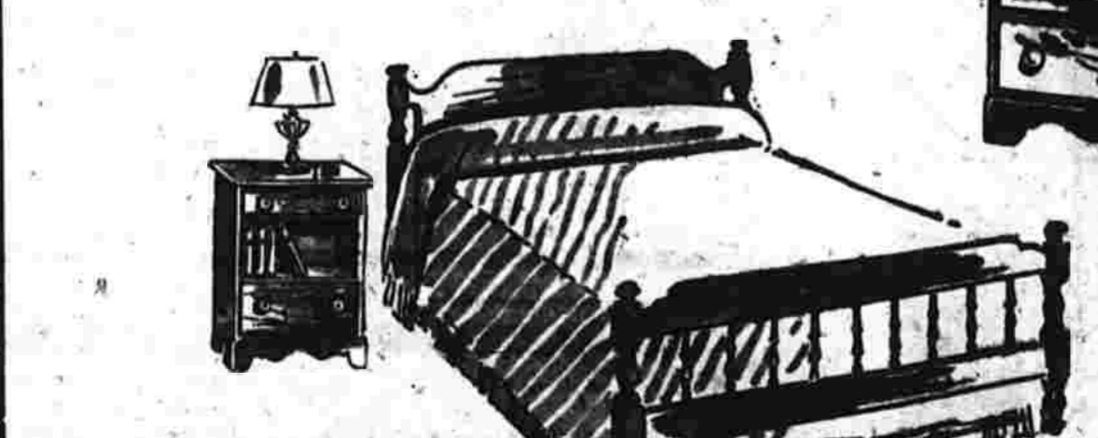

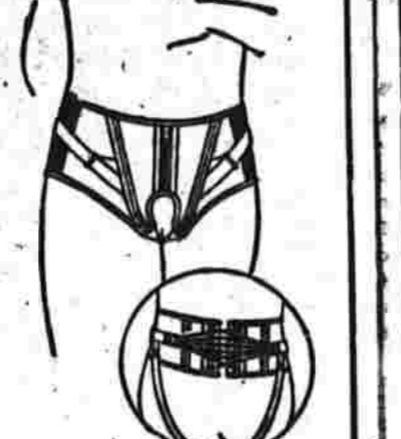

Urge More Speed On Europe Army

Largo U.S. Force in Korea. In the case of the United States, even that would take time and at this moment probably cannot be done at all. The U.S. now has in Germany one Army Division and a Constabulary Force. These combat-trained elements are part of an overall strength in Europe totaling about 97,000 men.

The United States now has committed a large part of its effective combat force to Korea. Left in the United States are only two or three divisions. They are needed for reserve in defense of the home or for possible use in the Far East should the war there grow still more difficult.

This means that even if the United States decided immediately to send more support to Europe, new divisions would have to be trained and equipped. It takes from eight months to a year or more to start with raw recruits and polish them into a workable combat infantry division of 17,000 men, equipped with small arms, artillery, armor and tanks.

Creation of new joint European army with a new commander also would raise the problem of what would be the nature of the organization. At present defense organization of the five western European countries, Field Marshal Viscount Montgomery of Britain is chairman of the organization.

Some students of the problem thought it quite possible that much of the organizational nature of the western defense union would be adaptable to the European army plan. Indeed, it was hoped at the outset, particularly by the French, that the United States would join in full participation.

Secretary of State Dean Acheson has informally endorsed the idea of bringing Western Germany into the Western European defense program.

Propose German Army Corps. How big would a Western German army be? It would be one or two or more divisions of 17,000 men, under United States Army practice. During World War II some corps at times contained as many as four or five divisions.

The German unit of the joint European army, it has been suggested, might be commanded by German officers. There also could be German officers on the joint army staff, but remembering the troubles that grew into World Wars I and II, the possibility of a revival of the old German general staff.

Along with the question of providing a German Army force, some are proposing to provide a West German armed police force effective enough to cope with the Communist threat in Germany.

British Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin is described as favorable to the joint European army idea for a stronger police force but to oppose the idea of a regular West German Army.

John J. McCloy, United States High Commissioner in Germany, who now is in Washington for conferences preliminary to the New York Foreign Ministers' session, has estimated that the Russian-controlled East German military force contains 50,000 or 60,000 men.
