Russia Still Sitting It Out

The Korean war is a test tube
war, indirectly, but very definitely
caused and begun by Russia.

But so far, fortunately, it has
not, by any stretch of the imagi-
nation, been a test between Rus-
sian strength and the strength of
the outside world. Rather, under
present conditions, it is merely a
test between the unlimited re-
sources of the United Nations
world and the limited resources
of North Korea. Under present
conditions, if the United Nations
forces defeat the North Koreans,
they have won. These United Na-
tions forces have, from the begin-
ning, enjoyed undisturbed com-
mand of two vital elements in the
campaign, the sea and the air.

They would not have such undis-
puted command of sea and air if
they were fighting Russia.

It is suspected that Russia is
rehearsing her own ground strength
equipment has been augmented by outside
help. Still, even there, the for-
mal promise that Russia is not
involved in the war has been
maintained. If the North Korean
armies have received reinforcements
from outside, these have
been well disguised.

As the situation stands at the
moment, then, it can be stated
this way: That Russia, quiet-
ly and surreptitiously, is attempt-
ing to defeat the North Korean
armies which moved into war at
Russia's direction.

This is fortunate for us. If
it were not so, in fact, we would
quite probably have to abandon
Korea altogether.

A side from its military signifi-
cance, this is also what we want
to have happen. We went into Ko-
rea not to have war spread
but to contain it. We went into
Korea under the United Nations
banner so that our action would
not be one of accepting a two-
power contest between Russia
and ourselves, or between Russian
satellites and American satellites.

Just one of United Nations en-
forcement of world law against
aggression.

We are forced to assume that
in the latter factor which has
impeded Russian action, it is her
strength of our action in Korea,
her to withhold her hand. We can-
not assume that Russia has been
impressed by the military
strength of our action in Korea
for there has been a continuing
situation in which action by Rus-
sia could have chased us off the
peninsula, which would be an un-
tenable position in any real big
power war.

We are forced to assume that
Russia, confronted with United
Nations enforcement of law and
with the knowledge that any Rus-
sian entry into the war would
automatically make a full world
war, has, at the least, been pre-
sented with something to make
her think and ponder.

And that is what our action was
intended to do—to try and con-
vince Russia that aggression does
not and cannot pay.

So far, Russia is taking that
lesson. Its most favorable mo-
ment for open participation in the
Korean campaign has passed, and
the world, united behind a con-
flict of law, has, as far, enjoyed a
strength far greater than its ac-
tual military strength in the field.

This present happy status of
affairs may be violated, at any
moment, by some Russian action.
But, so long as it lasts, and the
more solid it becomes, it consti-
tutes a basis on which an ordered
world may yet be achieved.
