Eight-year-old Harriet, Widman, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Widman of 22 Benton street, can answer this question in part, for through funds obtained from the Easter Seal sales, the society maintains a camp for handicapped children in Nichols, Conn., and the local girl spent three weeks at this camp during the summer.

Some 120 handicapped boys and girls lived in the fresh air where the delights of normal childhood were brought within their grasp. Where crutches and braces, and wheelchairs, were no handicaps to the wonder of playing with other children, playing with the generous assistance of the Junior League of Hartford, which purchased 7.2 acres in the Woodley estate in Hartford, Conn., for 200 feet above sea level.

Has Excellent Facilities  
The property formerly a camp for underprivileged children, already housed a number of excellent facilities. These included a main lodge, with dining room, kitchen, a playhouse with group, and a pump-house. To these the Society added a recreation room, a shop, seven cabins, each accommodating six children, and two counselors. There are ramps leading gently to each cabin, and to the entrance of other buildings. Neither money nor the lack of it is a deterrent for admission of crippled children from any part of the state to Camp Hemlock. They come referred from the Society's own workshops and clinics from doctors from agencies throughout the state.

Current expenses are paid from Easter Seal sales, and by civic clubs which send youngsters to the Hemlock on camper scholarships. Each child stays in camp for three weeks, and then he goes home to make room for another new contingent. The camp season allowed for three turnovers during the summer.

Played Various Games  
Fully half of the young campers were cerebral palsied, others were polio victims, muscular dystrophy, amputee, cataplexy, and the various diseases which afflict childhood. The age range was seven to fifteen. But whatever their age, the boys and girls at had the same cherished ambition: "to do the normal boy and girl in the camp they could."
