 appear to have at least shouldered a problem to one side, where we can forget it until it pops up, a little later, starting another world war or another world wide depression. To the contrary, the old "solutions" the moment they are invoked, present unsolvable problems of their own. They make the problem worse and more complicated than it was before they were invoked.
 Every piece of patchwork we put on, every old-style shingle we try to wedge into place, merely widens the leak we are trying to stop.
 The people of Europe know well enough by this time, what won't prevent war, what won't prevent depression. They know that no variety of power politics used in amount of armament, can prevent war. They know that no amount of nationalistic plotting and rivalry can produce stable economic conditions. And every time they see their own leaders trying to do the same old things in the name of security or in the name of prosperity they despair. And every time they see their leaders on the verge of trying something new—something that looks like an entirely new kind of roof—they cheer.

Influencing The Greeks
 Greek politics must be almost as bad as American politics. At any rate, it is proving pretty hard to get the politicians to do just what we want them to do.
 Our recourse, in Greece, is something we have never tried in our own country. It is to shut off their funds, until their behavior is as good policy or bad. This announcement that Marshall Plan aid to Greece will be cut down because the Greeks haven't been helping themselves efficiently enough?
 On the surface, it's bad. Because it amounts to a unilateral imposition to another country, an exercise of sovereignty within that country.
 On the other hand, we are taking this step because we are convinced that, under the existing set-up, the money we give to Greece restore itself is being used principally to nourish the corruption and inefficiency of a ruling clique which will not let go of it unless it is completely starved.
 In money for the benefit of such a clique? Should we help that clique hold the common people of Greece together as a nation? Should we help make the disease of Greece—the disease which originally invited the Communist threat—active there more virulent?
 On the one hand, we have the choice of using our dollars as we wish, or we have the choice of seeing our dollars used to perpetuate an evil condition. We are, then, we do, we know that the North Koreans are retreating from the old Pusan beachhead lines; we do not know whether they are capturing the United Nations cuts across the various lines of communication northward, or whether they are being pushed over into a pocket on the west coast of the peninsula.
 Our hope, obviously, is that the North Korean armies will be prevented from retreating back across the 38th parallel, that they can be surrounded and compelled to surrender. Such a development would not only be perfect from the military point of view, but it might also bring the war to an effective conclusion without presenting us with the theory diplomatic problem of what to do about carrying the war beyond the 38th parallel.

Why And When They Cheer
 The key to what is happening, in our particular age was well expressed, the other day, by a French statesman who was trying to explain why the Schuman Plan for a merger of the French and German coal and steel industries was enjoying such popular support among the French and the British. The Schuman Plan, in the context of yesterday, is a daring thing, although it itself will look tame tomorrow. Yet it is very popular. Why? Why, for that matter, does almost any proposal driving toward political or economic unity evoke tremendous public support throughout western Europe?
 This French statesman, Jean Monnet, gave the answer. "People," he said, "want something new. They are tired of death of solutions that have never solved anything. The peculiar nature of our own age is even more striking than that. Our problem is not only that the old solutions haven't ever solved anything. It is also that we have come to the stage where these solutions do not, even by our money. This is not even an unusual period in which they ap-

That Shrinking Dollar
 The United States News and World Report has had its statisticians at work on figures, which tell the story of what has happened to the value of this country as a result of war and post-war inflation. It is a sad and melancholy story which illustrates, we are told, the "futility of material thrust virtues in an era of inflation."
 The bare, statistical estimates are these:
 If you bought savings bonds in July, 1940, paying \$7,500 for it, that same house in July, 1950, has a value of \$16,600. Yet this \$16,600, in its turn, was actually worth only \$9,850.
 If you bought \$7,500 worth of industrial stocks in July, 1940, these stocks, in July, 1950, could have had a market value of \$12,450, plus \$3,150 in dividends. But, in actual buying power, you got only \$3,810. That is what the actual decline in the value of money has done.
