Takes His Life By Hanging

Stephen Lester Is Suicide at Home on Mill St.; No Motive Known

Stephen Lester, 39, of 41 Mill street, committed suicide early this morning by hanging himself from a tree that stands in the back yard overlooking the Burr Nursery. Dr. John Prignano pronounced him dead at 7:35 after attempts to revive him with inhalators and artificial respiration had failed.

According to police investigation, Walter Cooley and Fred Yurknot, employees of the Burr Nursery, found the body at approximately 6:30. Cooley was walking towards a lumber pile on the premises of the nursery when he heard a dog barking in the back yard of the Lester home. Glancing in that direction he saw the body hanging from the tree and immediately rushed to a telephone in the warehouse of the nursery and called police. Sgt. Michael Fitzgerald dispatched Patrolmen George McCaughey and Albert Schabas to the scene. Assistant Medical Examiner Dr. Prignano was called as were men from two fire departments, who responded to the call at once. Officers McCaughey and Schabas brought the body down from the tree and at-

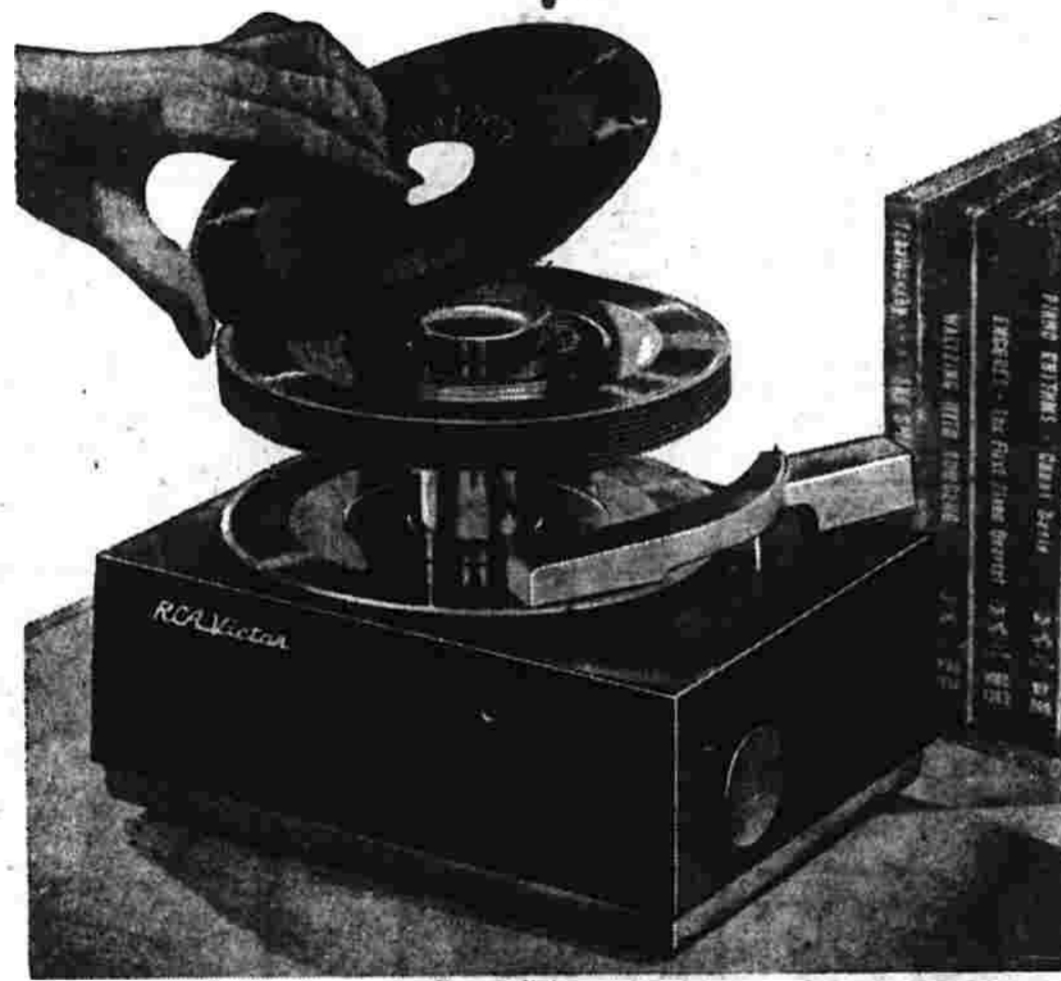

Victory in Korea
 Twelve days after the first landing at Inchon, the United Nations forces in Korea have closed the first thin line of their trap around whatever North Korean forces are still in the lower section of the Korean peninsula. Estimates of the number of North Koreans who may be trapped vary from a low of 30,000 up to an optimistic 100,000. It will be hard ever to tell, really, because the North Korean soldiers are, in many instances, doing what was predicted. They are becoming swift change artists—becoming Communist soldiers in the next moment. In some sectors, they are still fighting. But the disintegration of the North Korean army as a fighting force is spreading.

Communist's Big Moment
 Why, in the course of the Senate's debate on President Truman's unsuccessful veto of the anti-Communist bill, did one member of the Senate collapse under the emotional strain? Why did another grown man break into sobs? It is in this intricate and delicate game of wits that the Communist is at his most brilliant. He is so much in five with Communists that they wanted to measure which might restrict the activities and privileges of Communists in this country to be passed?

Why Thousands of Doctors Prescribe Pleasant Tasting
 Was it because they were unduly sympathetic to Communism? Was it because they were fellow travelers? Was it because they were individuals who finched in the face of that national situation necessary to deal with the Communist peril?

Setback-Cannata Party Friday
 The Cannata Party, which has been defeated by United Nations orders, representing not the will of any single nation, but of a coalition concept of law against aggression. It has been proved, in the field, that aggression will not be tolerated.

New Olive Branch
 Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Jacob A. Malik's waving of the olive branch in which he favors a meeting of Premier Stalin and President Truman, in which he says that his government would be willing to pledge not to be the first to use the atom bomb, in which he says that he favors general disarmament accompanied by international inspection and control, and in which he favors the free exchange of ideas and information between the peoples of the United States and Russia—his waving of this four-pronged olive branch is a little too ostentatious to attract their serious attention, either at Washington or at Lake Success.

It is not that we object to having Russia talk in the direction of peace, as the Russian diplomats on these shores have been talking since the opening of the session of the United Nations General Assembly. It is not, or should not be, that we are unwilling, in our own diplomacy, to play along with any genuine effort on the part of Russia to extricate Russia from its intransigence, which has been exhibited most dramatically in the instance of Korea. It is not that we wish to close doors to peace.

It is that we no longer expect peace to come in any great style without bloodshed. We do not expect it to

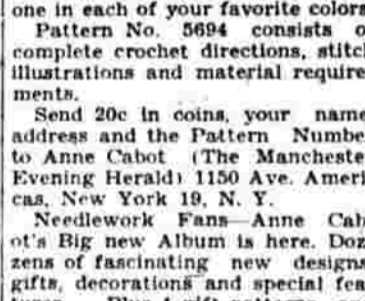
