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Seek to Clear Aliens' Status
 Further Mass Detention Of Foreigners Seen Until Rules Clarified
 Washington, Oct. 13.—Further mass detention of aliens seeking to enter the United States appeared likely today as government officials sought to write a set of rules defining who may enter under the new anti-subversive law.

Not even the purely political aspect of the problem of Korea, which the United Nations has now taken in hand, is going to be simple. The first fear of controversy went up with the pronouncement of President Truman's order that he would suspend the entry of all persons from the Communist bloc until the United Nations had taken a decision on the Korean situation. It was clear that the United States was not alone in this. The United Nations, the United Kingdom, France, and the Soviet Union were all expected to have their own views on the matter.

To Be Or Not To Be Rhee?
 The next fear of controversy went up from the opposite direction at the first meeting of the United Nations Interim Commission on Korea. Australia introduced a resolution which, for all practical purposes, contained an axe for President Rhee. The Australian proposal would limit the authority of the South Korean government to south Korea and require new national elections which would, it is hoped, create a new government with a wider base of popular support than that enjoyed by the leadership of President Rhee.

What is in back of this is the post-war course of Korean political history, in which Dr. Rhee was originally our candidate to head the new Korean state, but in which his own personal prestige and authority have been undermined by a series of setbacks. A rift speedily developed between President Rhee and the Korean parliament, which around the latter body repeatedly refused to give its compliance to some of President Rhee's more dictatorial policies. He was accused of running a personal police state.

And last spring, the United States took a hand in the Korean political situation, insisting that the decision which Dr. Rhee was attempting to avoid and postpone be held as originally promised. On our insistence, they were held, and they resulted in a clear defeat for Dr. Rhee in the makeup of the new parliament, although his own four year term as President has two more years to run.

Whatever base of popular support Dr. Rhee may once have had, then, seems to have been lost, and the Australian feeling is obviously that a man who does not even enjoy the support of South Korea would be a painful burden to carry into the still more complicated task of creating a new Korean state which would include the Communist bloc.

It can be assumed that the national administration at Washington, which specializes in fostering low-cost housing, did not make such a decision in an election season, without considering it impracticable for national defense procurement policy. It is going to be a hard decision, and one can be fairly sure that it will be revised as soon as it is considered possible.

The relationship between the federal regulation and the proposed Manchester zoning regulations, however, is not so simple. It has been assumed that the federal regulation makes the proposed local regulations suddenly unnecessary.

The proposed Manchester regulations are designed to slow up the unmanageable tide of low cost housing which has swamped this particular community, to a great extent that it has invaded any other Connecticut community. They are designed, in fact, to give us an especially good chance to solve it. In this connection, we would adopt a suggestion made by some Manchester realtors, which is that if the Planning Commission puts its regulations designed to slow down low cost housing into effect, as we hope it will, the Commission also consider the possibility of easing the path for that higher cost housing which Manchester needs. Certain practices in West Hartford, for instance, with regard to curb and sidewalk requirements, in areas where the style of development does not make the latter necessary, and with regard to bonding requirements, are considered a reasonable encouragement to quality builders who operate on a relatively small scale, the type of builder who ought to be encouraged in Manchester.

We realize, all through this zoning issue, that a stand against higher cost housing sounds snobbish, as if we wished to drive some class or wealth distinction with regard to future residents of Manchester, as if we wished to

See Benefits Lost in Town
 Social Security Aids Skipped; Changes in Law Qualify Many
 Many workers in and around Manchester are in danger of losing benefit payments for which they are eligible under the new Social Security Act according to Charles W. Wing, manager of the Hartford Social Security Administration office. Mr. Wing explained that under the 1950 amendments of the Social Security Act, individuals who are 65 years of age or over and who have worked a year and a half since the beginning of 1951 are eligible for benefits. If they have been paid as little as \$50.00 of wages in any six calendar quarters of the year, they are eligible for benefits. However, Mr. Wing stated, he has good reason to believe that there are hundreds of others who have worked for the necessary year and a half who are not working at the present time, and who could collect old-age insurance benefits if they file the necessary application. He urged anyone who believes that he has worked long enough to qualify for the benefits to inquire about the payments.

Chicago, Oct. 13.—(Special)—Gambling on the horse by employees at the Zenith Radio Corporation's big Chicago plant, reportedly amounting to some \$350,000 a year, has been broken up, officials said yesterday.
