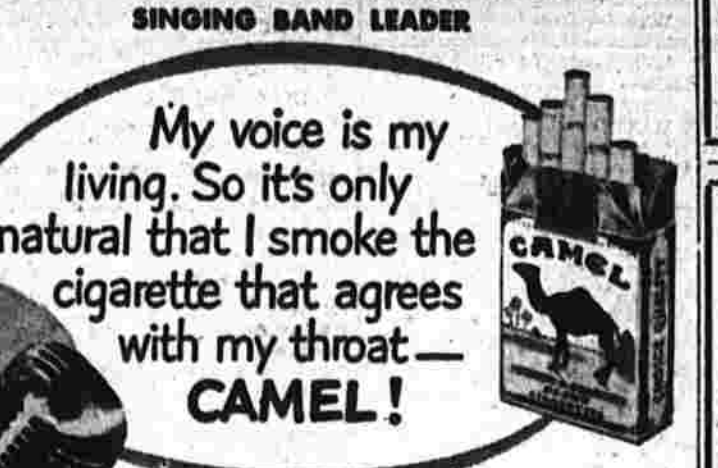

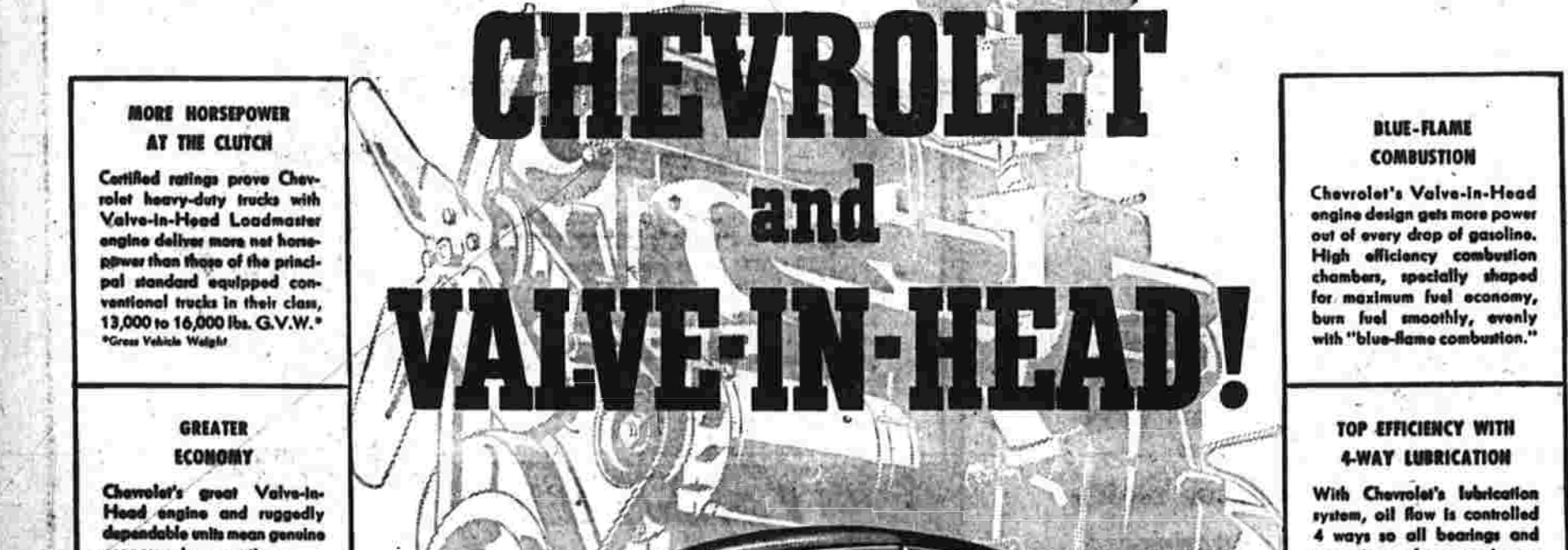

UN Services At St. Mary's

Three Prayer Meetings Tomorrow; Urge Declaration Signers Attend

Tomorrow being United Nations Day, three services will be held in St. Mary's Episcopal church in order that people may have an opportunity to support the United Nations and its prayers.

The Holy Communion will be celebrated at the first two hours.

The six o'clock service will be promptly at 6:30 in order that people may get to their work in Manchester or East Hartford by seven if necessary.

The Monday service is a simple and a necessary prayer.

Two weeks ago about 200 people signed the Declaration of Freedom in the vestibule of St. Mary's.

The declaration, with the accompanying signatures, has been flown to Berlin, Germany, and will be placed at the base of the Freedom Bell to be dedicated there tomorrow.

The same people contributed eight o'clock for the support of Radio Free Europe.

The Rev. Alfred Le Williams, rector, has urged that all signers of the Declaration, and all contributors to the work of Radio Free Europe, back their efforts with their prayers by attending one of the services on United Nations Day.

gering. He said that "without our friends in the United Nations we cannot hope to repair and restore it in less than many generations."

Rhee said that "certainly the Korean army can cope with any guerrilla problem remaining after the war."

"We handled them so well by destroying most of the guerrillas last year that the only way the Communists could have triumphed was to overthrow the Republic to be open war against it," he said.

"Our army is well experienced in routing guerrillas out of mountain hideouts and destroying them."

"Who Is All Over?" In that connection, he said his government is not anxious to get rid of U. N. forces but that "as far as we are concerned, it is all over."

The results of Korea strategy policy and people's organizations can take care of the rest."

Rhee, who has rejected similar proposals in the U. N. to hold new elections throughout Korea when the war is over, said the country will then "automatically be united (and) the United Nations has no reason to insist on controlling North Korea until the elections."

"We will accept any resolution or plan by the United Nations," he said. "But the point I want to make clear is that the U. N. merely should assist. Communists are saying the Republic is a puppet. Now the U. N. cannot."

Is Honored Again Sermon Based On Principles

Rev. C. O. Simpson Delivers Talks at Both Services Yesterday

At both services in Center church, Rev. Clifford Simpson preached on the theme, "The Saviour of the World." He outlined the Christian principles as revealed by Jesus, centering the major part of his talk on the episode when Jesus met the woman of Samaria at the well.

He showed how the barriers between classes, the sexes, the nations and the races could be destroyed, and should not exist.

Jumping from the first century to the twentieth, he stated that in the Declaration of Human Rights were given in full for the first time in an international document.

He stated that in the same document the basic principles were clearly inferred and stated outright. These must be the foundation of peace in the world.

On Laymen's Sunday he heard in detail about the machinery and work of the United Nations, and the necessity for working together for these united principles can be easily understood."

Mr. Simpson quoted twelve principles outlined by the League of Nations, and attended the University of Connecticut prior to his enlistment in the Air Force in 1942.
