

The marking of United Nations Day, the fifth anniversity of the ormal founding of the United Nations, was brought to a fitting close in Manchester last evening with the talk given by Dr. Alan Burr Overstreet at the Hollister Street School auditorium. Associate Professor of Government at Smith College, Dr Overstreet proved to be a most inand interesting speakr and held his audience for an hour and a half.

In the burst of enthusiasm for the United Nations, which per-haps comes only once a year, said Overstreet there is some praise but more praise the year around is merited. Right now here in the United States there is much enthusiasm for the United Nations ecause of the successful outcome of the Korean crisis, but people do not realize the other great acin the fields of education, health velfare and other achievements.

Not Law Making Body The United Nations as analyzed by the speaker, is not a legislature, not a law-making body, but its great value lies in the collective bargaining process which the nations of the world carry on, much like the collective bargain ing process between management and labor. In this process there is agreement or settlement or else here is no decision. No law i created but a contractual set-up i evolved which lasts as long as the good will of the parties involved. The United Nations, said Dr. Overstreet, is not the first experiment in international organization, it is a part of a long process, as old as history of man, in an at-tempt to find world organization. in the nineteenth century natio became more interested in an international setup to help smooth the way for more trade and commerce between nations.

Education Is Necessary If we are going to be the builders of a peaceful society, the have to be more careful about any comment that is made and about he policy that we pursue. There is still a great deal of national feeling throughout the world and sometimes we forget that over three quarters of the people of the world are illiterate. An even greater danger lies in the half-literates and the problems of educating these people to the level of intelli-gent discrimination.

Will Take a Long Time One of the greatest hopes in the the linkages which exist between that any nation will hesitate break it. No government will risk ts political fate by breaking this linkage as the United Nations ing the coming together of the peoples of the world, although this

is a long, slow process.

Take Interest in Politics
Although present organizations which are working for world government and world law have their value, they also have their danger, value, they also have their danger, the speaker said, in that the people working for such groups may become so preoccupied with the ultimate goal that they lose sight of the present trends and do not take a real interest in the political set-up of the present. In order to attain the ultimate goal of world cooperation and peace it is necessary for every individual to take an interest in politics as they are sary for every individual to take an interest in politics as they are. In conclusion Dr. Overstreet stated that there may be some agreement now, with each nation still retaining its own identity and with no settlement which will af-fect the domestic life of a nation, but that the United Nations will but that the United Nations will continue the process of building a network of linkages of countries through the bargaining process. As a practical political agency be termed the United Nations the best hope of today.

Following Dr. Overstreet's talk several questions from the floor were put to him, the first involving the recognition of Communications.

were put to him, the first involving the recognition of Communist China by the United States. In his opinion the diffeculty in recognizing China lies in the fact that the United States has pursued a policy in that diplomatic recognition shows moral approval of the government in power, whereas most other nations, Great Britain, for example, recognize the government in power whether they approve of it or not. By not recognizing Communist China the United States must work through the agencies of other governments and is losing the opportunity to influence the Chinese and show them some of the strengths of democracy and perhaps encourage some Titolst tendencies, which may exist in China.

In answer to a question about displaying the United Nations flag, Dr. Overstreet gave his opinion that it is blindness on the part of groups or individuals not to want to display the flag which symbolizes the highest aspirations of mankind.
