**United Nations Plans Analyzed by Speaker**  
 Dr. Alan Overstreet in Address Here Stresses Worth of Organization To the Entire World  
 A beautiful United Nations flag made by Mrs. Edna Case Parker and loaned by the Center church, was displayed on the edge of the platform with the United States flag.  
 The marking of United Nations Day, the fifth anniversary of the founding of the United Nations, was brought to a fitting close in Manchester last evening with the talk given by Dr. Alan Overstreet at the Hollister Street School auditorium. Associate Professor of Government at Smith College, Dr. Overstreet proved to be a most inspirational and interesting speaker and held his audience for an hour and a half.  
 In the burst of enthusiasm for the United Nations which perhaps comes only once a year, said Dr. Overstreet, there is a danger of mere praise the year around is merited. Right now here in the United States there is much enthusiasm for the United Nations because of the successful outcome of the Korean crisis, but people do not realize the other great accomplishments of the organization in the fields of education, health, welfare and other achievements.  
 Not Law Making Body  
 The United Nations as analyzed by the speaker, is not a legislature; not a law-making body, but its great value lies in the fact that the nations of the world carry on, much like the collective bargaining process between management and labor. In this process there is no decision. No law is created and a contract is evolved which lasts as long as the good will of the parties involved.  
 The United Nations said Dr. Overstreet, is not the first experiment in international organization. It is a part of a long process, as old as history of man, in an attempt to find world organization. In the nineteenth century nations became more interested in the national setup than in both the way for more trade and commerce between nations.  
 Education is Necessary  
 If we are going to be the builders of a peaceful world, the speaker warned, we are going to have to be more careful about the policy that is made and about the policy that we pursue. There is still a great deal of national feeling throughout the world and sometimes we forget that over three quarters of the people of the world are illiterate. An even greater danger lies in the half-illiterate and the problems of educating these people to the level of intelligent discrimination.  
 Will Take a Long Time  
 One of the great hopes in the United Nations lies in the fact that the linkages which exist between the nations of the world, although they may create such a strong linkage that any nation will hesitate to break it. No government will risk its political life by breaking off this linkage as at the present time, is a part of the process of increasing the coming together of the peoples of the world, although this is a long, slow process.  
 This Interest in Politics  
 Although present organizations which are working for world government and world law have their value, they also have their danger, the speaker said. For the people working for such groups may become so preoccupied with the ultimate goal that they lose sight of the present trends and do not take a real interest in the political set-up of the present. In order to attain the ultimate goal of world cooperation and peace, it is necessary for every individual to take an interest in politics as they are.  
 In conclusion, Dr. Overstreet stated that there may be some agreement now with each nation still retaining its own identity and with no settlement which will affect the domestic life of a nation, but that the United Nations will continue the process of building a network of linkages of colonies through the bargaining process. As a practical political agency he termed the United Nations the best hope of today.  
 Questions Are Asked  
 Following Dr. Overstreet's talk several questions from the floor were put to him, the first involving the recognition of Communist China by the United States. In his opinion the difficulty in recognizing China lies in the fact that the United States has pursued a policy in that diplomatic recognition shows moral approval of the government in power, whereas most other nations, Great Britain, for example, recognize the government in power, whether they approve of it or not. By not recognizing Communist China the United States must work through the agencies of other governments and in losing the opportunity to influence the Chinese and show them some of the strength of democracy and perhaps encourage some Titoist tendencies, which may exist in China.  
 Displaying U.N. Flag  
 In answer to a question about displaying the United Nations flag, Dr. Overstreet gave his opinion that it is kindred to the part of groups or individuals not to want to display the flag which symbolizes the highest aspirations of mankind.  
 The speaker was introduced by Mrs. Jay Rubinow, president of the Manchester League of Women Voters, which was one of the groups sponsoring the program.  
 The other sponsoring groups were the Women's club, the United Nations Club, the Parents-Teachers Association, the Congregational church Social Action committee, the TWCA Public Affairs group, the Elvick club and the United World Federation.

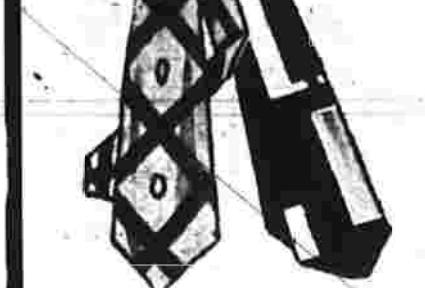

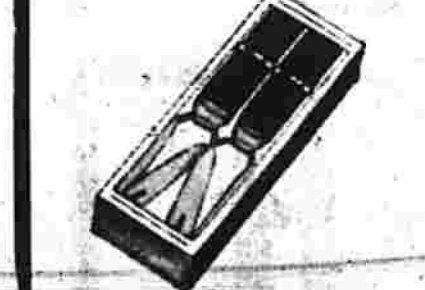

Just after the war, or what might have been at the time of the inauguration of the Marshall Plan—a possibility of American economic aid to Russia.

“Was the American mood might be toward such a possibility is a question. Immediately after the war, we cancelled Lend-Lease and then made loans to everybody except Russia, whose loan request we pigeonholed, asking Russia to believe we had merely overlooked it. When we offered the Marshall Plan, on the other hand, it was theoretically open to Russia, and certainly to Russia’s satellites, whom we hoped to wean away, but Russia pulled her satellites back and, after attending one preliminary conference, stalked haughtily away herself. The possibility that Russia is now interested in American economic aid, perhaps even in joining the Marshall Plan, is certainly not going to raise any popular cheers in this country, and it is certainly not going to get anywhere until many other matters between us have been solved.

On the other hand, our own interests have known from the start that the only way we can ever end the Marshall Plan is through a restoration of normal trade conditions to Europe, which can only be achieved with Russia and her satellites. In other words, if we ever should get to the stage where we could think of it in terms of dollars and cents, help to Russia which would promote the abolition of the economic phase of the Iron Curtain in Europe would be a tremendous economy for us. It would mean the only visible way for an end to our own Marshall Plan expenditures.

So, along with its situation, the Vashinsky speech contained some food for western inspection—items we might consider seriously if the Russians should ever decide to round out the whole peace menu.

**The Vashinsky Menu**

What made the headlines from Vashinsky’s speech in the United Nations Political Committee on Monday was his warning that two could deep sleep bombs, his accusations against American and British “warmongers,” his attacks on American diplomacy. For that score in American headlines, Vashinsky has only himself to blame. He ought to know, from long experience, that attack and insult are news, that if one wants attention paid to the fight of a dove, one doesn’t set off fireworks nearby.

Nonetheless, because it may be an inescapable part of the Russian temperament and the Russian position in the world that hints of any conciliation must be accompanied by fierce-sounding growls, there is some interest in the good part of the Vashinsky speech which was more purr than growl.
