Book Answers Atomic Queries

(Continued from Page One)

"Survival Under Atomic Attack" is the first official publication to tell the public in plain English just what to do if the big bomb does fall. It costs a dime and is available through the Superintendent of Public Documents, Washington 25, D. C. A more important discussion was issued by the Atomic Energy Commission last August.

The National Security Resources Board, which put out the 32-page booklet this past week-end, plans to distribute millions of copies through local civil defense organizations. The goal: A copy in every American home.

Unless you're right under an exploding bomb, the booklet says you can survive—if you keep your head. But you should know your way out of a house if you have to.

1—Try to get outside—in a basement or subway if you can, in a ditch or gutter if you have to.

2—Drop flat on the ground or floor.

3—Bury your face in your arms.

4—Don't run outside right after a bombing.

5—Don't take chances with food or water in open containers. A can opener is one of the handiest things to have around.

6—Don't start rumors. One can spread like wildfire.

Beyond these "survival secrets," the new A-Bomb defense manual gives a pretty complete course in atomic age living.

"Starting right now," it says, you should go in for "fireproof housekeeping." Don't let trash pile up around your house, and always keep it in covered containers.

Some other hints:

If you work in the open, always wear full-length, loose-fitting, light-colored clothes in time of emergency. Never go around with your sleeves rolled up. Always wear a hat—the term may save you from a serious face burn.

If you have walked through rubble from a ground burst or water from an underwater burst, be sure to change at least your outer garments and shoes. If the clothing is heavily contaminated, also manage to take a bath or shower.

Starts Reign Of Terror

According to State Department reports, the Viet Minh insurgents have started a reign of terror in their newly won areas, and this is reported to be stiffening the resolve of the French to reorganize their forces in the new French sponsored states.

Red Cross flood relief volunteers sheltered about 1,000 last night in the Eugene, Ore., area where Sheriff Ivan Swartz had issued a general evacuation order for all Willamette river lowlands in Lane county. Some were taken from their homes in rowboats to shelters in nearby Springfield and Eugene.

Another 1,000 — perhaps more, the Red Cross said — had scurried yesterday to higher ground along the Umpqua river valley. The Red Cross at Roseburg, Oregon, center of the stricken sector, said these had been housed at Winston, at isolated Myrtle Creek and in Roseburg.

Roseburg's plight was declared a flood emergency by the Red Cross and supplies and staff aides were rushed there from other west coast cities.

The city of Grants Pass was isolated. Businessmen had abandoned stores Sunday when the wild Rogue river swept into the main street. There were no evacuation reports in that city but State Highway Resident Engineer J. G. Bromley described the flooding as the worst since 1927.

At a rural area south of there, 80 year old Charles Moline was snatched to safety by a boat crew just before his cabin was washed away.

Crescent City, California, was isolated Sunday and passengers of four buses and over 100 cars were stranded there. They were fed in churches and housed in a Boy Scout building. A parachute drop was planned today to get food to about 50 families isolated at Douglas Park near there.

Highways Severed

Highways in a vast area were covered by bridge washouts, fallen trees and land slides. Only one main trunk route linked Oregon and California, U. S. Highway 99 and the coast U. S. 101 were under water in a dozen places. Buses were held at terminals and some trains delayed by slides yesterday.

The victims were Hollis McGuire, 59, Packer, Oregon, who died after being pulled from the debris of a smashed bridge and Mrs. Leona Higgins, 62, who drowned in the rampaging Coguille river near the Oregon coast. Motorist Lester Howe, Myrtle Point, was missing in the same river after a car plunged into the Rodeo stream. His companion, Weber Mast, was rescued.

ment's ideas about the German question. Presumably they were stated before the rearmament of Western Germany, the formation of German military forces, and until some form of European defense council is formed. It eventually there are any German units to which they shouldn't be big but should be smaller than division size.

This isn't the idea of the United States and Britain. They contend the message of Russia is so gross and urgent that everything possible should be done swiftly—including formation of German units to help the combined defense. They have offered guarantees on the size and control of the German units but not the kind which the government demands.

Everyone talked about it for long hours on Saturday. Then after all the Ministers had a chance for plane conversations with their home governments during a Sunday recess, they were called back this morning to talk some more.

Disseminator To Be Done

The German rearmament question didn't consume all the time Saturday, here and only slightly illuminating communique Sunday night said the committee "completed this first half of its agenda." It didn't say what this contained. It developed that the first half obviously didn't include either the controversial German question nor the entirely non-controversial matter of setting up a supreme command for the integrated European force.

For some reason the final agreement to establish the command had been left aside while the conference talked about the French position on German rearmament and on other matters. This was despite a previous general informal accord on creating the command and the widespread understanding the commander probably would be the American General Dwight D. Eisenhower.

Uneasy Last Phase... In the shifting of United Nations military objectives in Korea, in the disputing and persisting rumors about Chinese Communist participation in the fighting now in progress, one can understand why North of India wanted the United Nations to halt at the 38th parallel.

Not The Cure... President Truman, before the National Guard Association, said "You know, one of the most disgraceful things that ever happened to the country was to find that 24 per cent of the young men and young women were not physically and mentally fit to serve the country. Now that is a disgrace to the richest nation in the world."

Several days ago this formula was abandoned, and it began to be announced by our generals in the field that western troops were going straight up to the border. There has been no public explanation of the change. Perhaps it was just the inevitable pull of war.

Now there are persistent rumors of Chinese Communists being involved in the fighting. We are not admitting it officially, perhaps it isn't really so. On the other hand, even if it is so, we are probably in no hurry to admit it. We would rather defeat them, if we can, anonymously, without compelling Communist China to keep up the fight indefinitely for reasons of prestige.

There is a special reason why the Chinese Communists may have entered the fighting. In the north west corner of Korea there are power plants which, in the past, have been distributing power to Chinese territory as well as to Korea. The Chinese Communists may be intent upon defending these, at least until they have some assurance that they will continue to receive the power they need from the new Korea.
