Traffic Death Rate Is Third

State Figure Is 3.8 Fatalities for Each 100 Miles of Travel

cut's traffic fatality rate of 3.8 deaths per 100 million vehicle miles of automotive travel during first nine months of 1950 was third lowest in the nation acco ing to an official survey of the National Safety Council filed to-day with the Highway Safety Commission. Only Rhode Island with 3.3 cases and Massachusetts with 3.8 topped Connecticut's rate. National mileage rate was 6.9 cases.

Connecticut's rate of 11.7 traf-fic fatalities per 100,000 popula-tion was also third lowest for the country as of October 1st, accord-ing to the National Safety Council survey. Only Rhode Islan with a rate of 9.5 and Massachu setts with 9.6 surpassed the Con-necticut rate. National population rate was 23.8 cases. Highway Safety Commission comment said increased travel this year offset case increase, enabling Connecticut to record relatively satisfac tory fatality rate. As of October 1st, covering nine months of 1950 Connecticut was charged with 175 traffic deaths, compared with 129 for same period 1949, a case in-

crease of 36 per cent. Rates of 36 per cent.




