

He studied at Clark University. Worcester, for a year and was graduated from Augustana Theological Seminary, Rock Island, Ill., in 1935.

He was pastor of Emanuel Lutheran church here 1939 to 1944, when he accepted a call as director of stewardship of the Augustana Lutheran church with headquarters in Minneapolis. When in Manchester he was a member of the Board of Education, the OPA War Price and Rationing Board and a member of the Rotary Club. Mr. and Mrs. Gustafson and their two daughters, Lois and Phyllis, live in West Orange, N. J.

Mr. Gustafson came with his vocumity allocation plan set up to cope with steel shortages and grey markets of 1947 and 1948.

EYE COMFORT AND TELEVISION

Eye comfort depends on the relation of the screen brightness to general room lighting.

Here are some suggestions which may improve your eye comfort when viewing television . . . try them and see if they help.

- 1. Reflected Glare. Move small mirror over protective glass on set. If you can see reflection of a lamp from any viowing position you have reflected glare. Correct by moving set or lamp or turn off lamp.
- 2. Balance Lighting. Turn on all floor and table lamps to about 100 watts. If any lamp gives reflected glare turn it off.
- 3. Back Lighting. Place a 40 watt light behind set to light wall behind it. This will reduce contrast.
- 4. Operate Set Correctly. You will never have eye comfort if you use contrast and brightness controls incorrectly. If the screen "glares" at you, that's a sign that you need additional room lighting.
