To change to Business Zone III all or part of an area on the Northernly side of West Center Street (West of McKee Street) now in Residence Zone A, bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a point in the intersection of the Northernly line of West Center Street with the Westernly line of McKee Street; thence Westernly 250 feet; thence Southernly along McKee Street, 100 feet to the Northernly line of West Center Street, point of beginning, 170 feet.

2. To change to Business Zone III all or part of an area on the Southernly side of Main Street (South of Washington Street) now in Residence Zone A, bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a point in the intersection of the Westernly line of Main Street with the Southernly line of Washington Street; thence Easternly 200 feet; thence Northernly to the Southernly line of Washington Street, 148 feet more or less; thence Westernly along Washington Street, 250 feet to point of beginning.

3. To extend the Industrial Zone on the Northernly side of Hilliard Street (West of Electric Street, a proposed street) from the present Industrial zone Westernly approximately 365 feet and Northernly to Leominster Street.

4. To change to Business Zone II or Business Zone III, all or part of an area now in Residence Zone A, bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a point in the intersection of the Northernly line of Vernon Street with the Westernly line of Vernon Street; thence Easternly 144 feet to the Westernly line of Vernon Street; thence along and Westernly along the Westernly line of Vernon Street, 170 feet.

5. To change to Business Zone II or Business Zone III, all or part of an area now in Residence Zone A, bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a point in the intersection of the Northernly line of Vernon Street with the Westernly line of Vernon Street; thence Easternly 144 feet to the Westernly line of Vernon Street; thence along and Westernly along the Westernly line of Vernon Street, 170 feet.

6. 7. To amend the last paragraph of ARTICLE 13, SECTION I of the Zoning Regulations for the Town of Manchester, Conn., so that said paragraph shall read as follows: "In computing the minimum floor area for living quarters, rooms for heating equipment, garage, bay windows, outside vestibules and open or closed porches or verandas and any basement room, the full wall which is not above ground level, shall not be included. Living quarters shall be constructed with ceiling and walls finished on the inside with lath and plaster in the customary manner, or finished in some substitute acceptable to the building inspector, when the living quarters above the ground floor of any building, the construction of which is started before January 1, 1950, need not be finished so long as they are not occupied."

**Lectures Here On U. N.'s Role**

Mrs. Theodore Paulin Speaks on World Conditions at the Y

In the first of the series of lectures sponsored by the Public Affairs committee of the Y. W. C. A., Mrs. Theodore Paulin, a well known teacher, lecturer and author, spoke on "Developing Our Attitude Toward One World". Introduced by a personal friend, Mrs. Francis Heltrick, Mrs. Paulin gave a most interesting talk about the United Nations and its role in the world today. At the beginning of her talk she stated that there is now a new dimension in politics, in the political life of everyone, and that in the United States, whereas people formerly thought only in terms of their own community, state and nation, they think in terms of the world.

In the opinion of the speaker the new United Nations building in New York City, which has been constructed so that every delegation's quarters has windows facing on the outside and also on the courtyard inside, resulting in rather a queer narrow building, is a good example of what the United Nations is, that is, every nation in the world organization has an inside as well as an outside view.

In developing this attitude towards one world Mrs. Paulin stated that in her opinion the beginning should be made at home, by assuming that people in their homes are citizens of the world, not just citizens of one country. She keeps the United Nations flag in evidence around her home and her husband's reading material about the organization to their young children.

Another important way to help in developing this attitude, stated the speaker, is to bring foreign students into ordinary American homes and let them get a glimpse of the typical American family life, not as seen in American movies, which are often misleading. It is also important to visit the United Nations and to acquire as much knowledge about it as possible.

Formed to Prevent War The United Nations was formed primarily to prevent war and secondly to fight a defensive war. Mrs. Paulin fears that perhaps in the Korean conflict the second priority has become more important than the first. However, as long as the United Nations exists as a body in which the nations of the world may come to palaver and if people continue to think about the kind of attitude needed to develop a peaceful world eventually such a result will be attained.

During the course of her talk Mrs. Paulin stated that she had been invited to give a lecture at the Y. W. C. A. in Hartford, Conn., on November 17, 1950.

The welfare costs in Manchester during the month of October dropped by \$567.31 from the September total, according to the monthly charity report filed by Director Albert E. Behrend with General Manager George H. Wadell.

In the past month also there was a reduction of cases and persons aided from the September total. There were 14 less cases and 29 fewer persons aided. The reason for the drop is stated as an increase in available seasonal work.

### P & W Strike Talk Recedes

#### Mediation Efforts at Standstill Indefinitely; No Decisions

Hartford, Nov. 15.—(AP)—Contract negotiations between representatives of the International Association of Machinists (I.A.M.) and the Pratt and Whitney Division of United Aircraft have been receding indefinitely.

The recede was called shortly before midnight last night by the State Board of Mediation after nine hours of deliberation today failed to break the week-old deadlock which affects some 13,000 production workers, about half of whom are members of Machinists Local 1764.

State Mediator Robert L. Stutz announced that the hearing was recessed subject to call by the parties or by the Board.

He said that although the Mediation Board "must stay with the case," the hearing will not be resumed unless warranted by some development.

Because Federal Mediator E. Frank Ward of Boston has been present at the hearings, Stutz expressed the belief that the national agency may consider it useless to review the case as it stands.

Following Stutz's announcement, Union spokesmen would not say whether they would call the strike which the membership of Local 1764, earlier this week, authorized them to call on 24 hours' notice.

It was pointed out however that a technicality would prevent calling the strike before next Tuesday. This revolves around a clause in the Pratt-Hartley Act requiring a 60 day notice to management of an intended strike.

The Union filed its strike intention with the Pratt and Whitney management September 23. The 60-day period expires November 21.
