How can you have peace if you do not have full destruction and submission of those who have attacked you? You cannot find the answer to that in the record of modern nations, with every day of total war.

Both campaigns were unbalanced. Both campaigns exposed themselves precariously. But his made the final climactic precarious exposure.

His final fatal exposure came when even the end of the campaign found him remaining in the terrible things the Republicans were doing to him in the campaign.

There were two ways to answer such charges. One was to appear so big and unconcerned that charges would fall of their own weight and admiration.

He talked about the atom—but not about his opponents, nor about their charges against him. He kept his balance. And because he did, the charges against him fell harmlessly at his feet.
