P & W Talks Start Today

Federal Mediators in Effort to Avert Aircraft Plant Walkout

Springfield, Nov. 20.—Three federal mediators today began an effort to avert a strike of 7,000 airplane engine workers at the Pratt and Whitney Division of United Aircraft Corporation.

The negotiations began at 10:30 a.m. behind closed doors.

The mediators were George McGowan of the New York office of the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service, who presided as chairman; Gilbert McCutcheon of the Washington office, and E. Frank Moore of the Boston office.

The panel was appointed by Craig C. Chase, federal director of conciliation, who said in a telegram the dispute was being handled "for the security and well being of the nation."

Wages are the chief issue between the company and the International Association of Machinists. On Oct. 2 Pratt and Whitney agreed to a 14-cent hourly increase. A further increase was not accepted this offer and the increase went into effect.

The union wants five cents of this increase to be made retroactive to last February. It also asks seniority rights, a distinction in pay for senior workers and an additional holiday.

A charge of unfair labor practice filed by the union against the company three months ago is still pending.

Among those at today's conference were: T. R. Downer, personal aircraft, M. F. Burke, personnel manager, W. Lundberg, chief assistant personnel manager, representing the Grand National International Association of Machinists, Peter Stuart, Allan Perl, counsel for the International Association of Machinists, and President Norbert Dion and eight members of the negotiating committee.

Professor Robert Stutz of the University of Connecticut met with the federal mediators to give them a representative of the Connecticut board of mediation and arbitration.

Indignation of the entire audience.

Rogge asserted the Communists had "resorted to the use of violence" in Korea and Tibet.

U. S. Does Not Want War

"Had the use of violence in Korea succeeded, German Communists, in my opinion, would have attempted to follow the Korean pattern," he said.

"We in America do not want war," Rogge declared. "The American people are overwhelmingly dedicated to the cause of peace."

Rogge is one of the few foreigners ever to be invited to speak before Russia's Supreme Soviet (Parliament) in the Kremlin. He was recently appointed.

Rogge gave the Congress another bill when he declared he would not sign the so-called Stockholm Peace Petition, which the Congress sponsors, in its present form because it does not flatly condemn aggression.

The petition calls for outlawing atomic bombs and would brand the first user a war criminal.

result of the occupation of Birganj, 55 miles southwest of the capital of Kathmandu, is expected to be India's recognition of Nepal's three-year-old king.

Prime Minister Bhanu Shrivastava, who fled to India after a palace revolution engineered by the Nepalese Congress Party, which broke out Nov. 11 and was crushed by the army of the liberal-minded monarch.

"Having set our house in order," the Embassy spokesman commented, "recognition of the new king should come automatically." He added there has been "no perceptible change in Nepal's relation with India" as a result of the 10-day rebellion.

The spokesman denied that the insurgents received popular support in India and declared firmly, "it happened from India."

India is warned that the Nepalese Government has maintained a neutral policy towards the neighboring country from the outset of the revolution, although apparently it is sympathetic to the rebel's aspirations.

Reliable sources reported that India is pressing Nepalese Prime Minister, Maharajah Mohan Shambhujang Bahadur Rana, to grant the kingdom a more popular government as a means of quelling the upheaval and discrediting Communist propaganda from the outside.

However, the Indian Foreign Minister was reluctant to comment on the report, calling it "pre-mature."

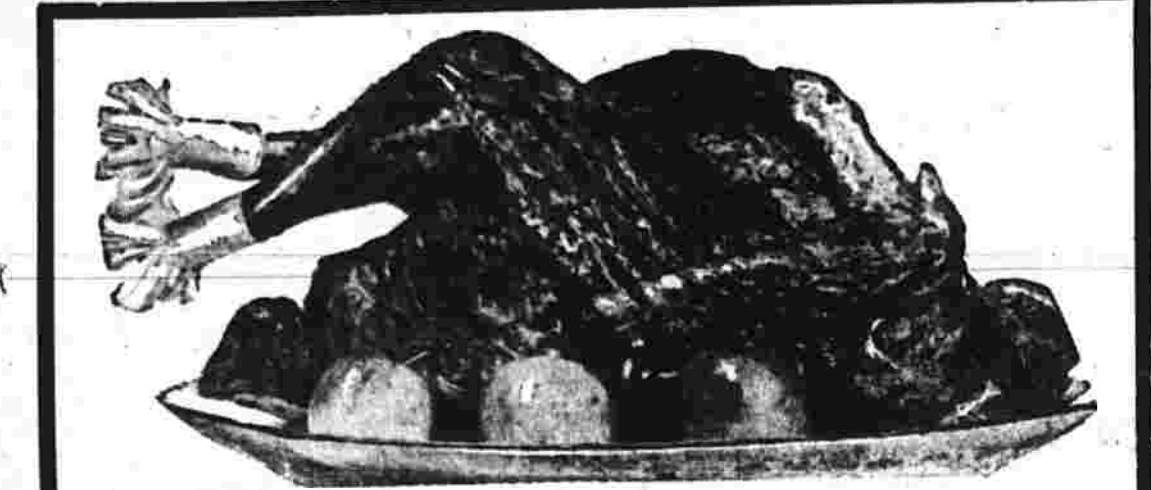

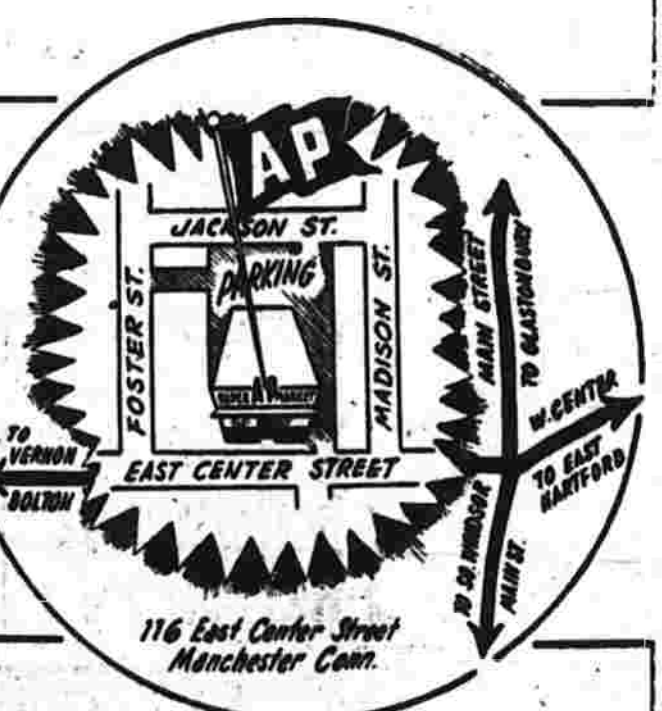

In conclusion Mr. Edgar pointed out that one of the greatest of all things for which men today might well be thankful was the open door of opportunity for all those who would use it. "However

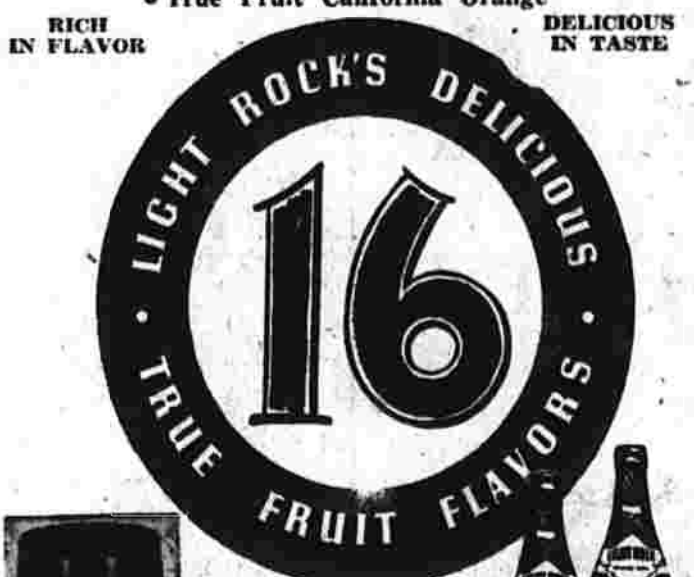
