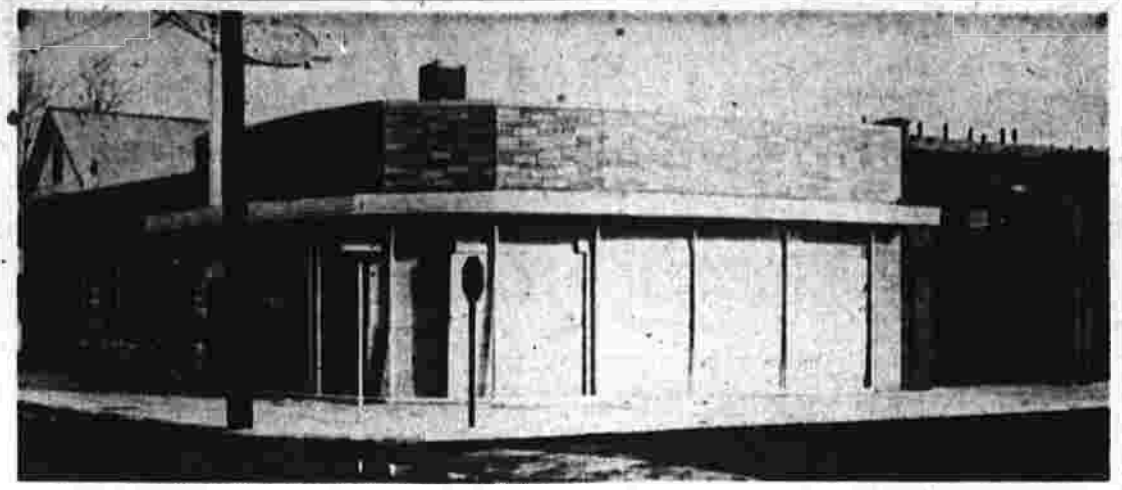

No Major Damage Here From Storm Saturday

Although the winds during Saturday's storm reached 70 miles an hour, 30 miles an hour stronger than the hurricane in 1905, Manchester was fortunate to have suffered no major damage, a survey released today by television stations, chimneys, windows, and other things in the town.

Several hundred television antennas were blown down in town. Some were snapped from the roofs and swung freely in the wind. Others came down from the ground, doing damage to the roofs of houses.
