Bangkok—(AP)—Thailand, Asia's greatest rice supplier, is to feed its people with enriched rice. Experts from Switzerland are carrying out a survey of the country's total nourishment needs and the extent of undernourishment caused by consumption of polished rice.

Enrichment machinery will be installed at the farmers co-operative society mill, the largest in Thailand. That health officials will determine the different vitamins to be used depending on research results. Rice for export to deficit countries will not be enriched.







Rockville Firm Brings Legal Action

Rockville, Dec. 1.—(Special)—Merrin G. Gold, executive E. P. Gold of New Haven, owners of property on Union street, opposite Harlow street, on which they wish to erect a gasoline station, have brought action in the Tolland County Court of Common Pleas, seeking a writ mandamus, or certiorari, to issue a building permit for the station. The case is scheduled to be heard on December 19 at 10:30 a. m. The firm of Gold and Gold acquired the property from John H. Wells in a deed dated January 30, 1950. It is claimed that while the property was owned by Wells a certificate of approval was issued following a hearing, for the premises on August 9, 1946 by John T. McCarthy, then Commissioner of Motor Vehicles. On October 28 of this year, Gold and Gold submitted an application to Mr. Luter for a building permit to erect a gasoline station, and it is claimed that the commissioner issued a certificate of approval. Mr. Luter referred the matter to Corporation Counsel Robert Pigeon. The City Council was presented with the petition from property owners in the vicinity of the proposed station, protesting against its erection and claiming that the Motor Vehicle Department has no jurisdiction that the certificate of approval could not be issued by Wells a person to another, and also that it expired in one year. By bringing the case into the court of common pleas, it is expected that a controversy of 23 years standing, over the question of a gasoline station at this site, will be finally settled.
