Changing People in a Changing World was the topic of Rev. Siegmund Blumberg's talk to the Professional Women's Club last evening at Center church.

Mr. Blumberg teaches two evening classes at Hillside College in Hartford on "Inter-Personal Relations" and "Inter-Group Relations."

He is affiliated with the Interracial Commission of Conn. This commission came into being by a law empowering the governor to appoint ten volunteer unpaid members to promote harmonious relationships between differing groups in the state.

In 1947, through their work, the Fair Employment Practices Law was passed. It provided that employers hire applicants with best qualifications regardless of color, religion or national background.

Although the current anti-communism law is being considered, it is not intended to affect our existing laws.

The Interracial Commission has a large job of education in all parts of the state, both where minority groups were small or nonexistent and where they are well established.

India Official Denies China Pledged Halt

Comments on Report Reds Promised Han To Stop at Parallel; Nehru Briefs House

New Delhi, India, Dec. 4.—Prime Minister Nehru told Parliament today India had suggested a cease fire in Korea and establishment of a demilitarized zone, followed by negotiations in which Communist China would take part.

Nehru did not make clear whether the Indian recommendation had been made, but said he could not make profitable suggestions on what can be done at the present moment.

The Prime Minister said the situation is changing so rapidly that it is impossible for anyone to suggest what might be done.

The only hope at the moment, he added, is that the talks between British Prime Minister Attlee and President Truman "will lead to a peaceful way out of this situation."

Big Powers Must Decide Outlining the Government's foreign policy, Nehru told Parliament that the fate of the world depends on the big powers—what they do or do not do.

It depends more on the United States, the United Kingdom, Russia and China than all the other countries in the world put together.

It makes an earnest appeal that these countries make every effort to solve present tensions by peaceful methods. The consequences of not doing so are too terrible to contemplate.

"We will do our best to do everything in our power to promote peace and avoid war," Nehru expressed hope that there will be a peaceful way out of the atomic bomb.

He added he was sure there is one in this House who at all times the idea of use of the atomic bomb anywhere, anywhere.

Meanwhile a Foreign Office source expressed ignorance of reports that the Chinese Communists promised India's U. N. delegate that Red forces would halt at Korea's 38th Parallel and negotiate.

The source said: "We do not think the Chinese have given any definite undertaking that they will stop at the 38th Parallel. Our only information is that the talks between the British Prime Minister and the Chinese representative are continuing."

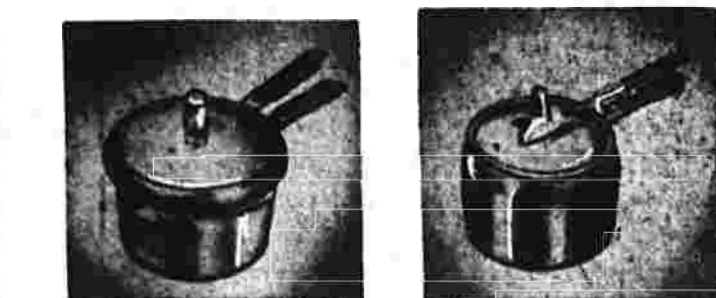
